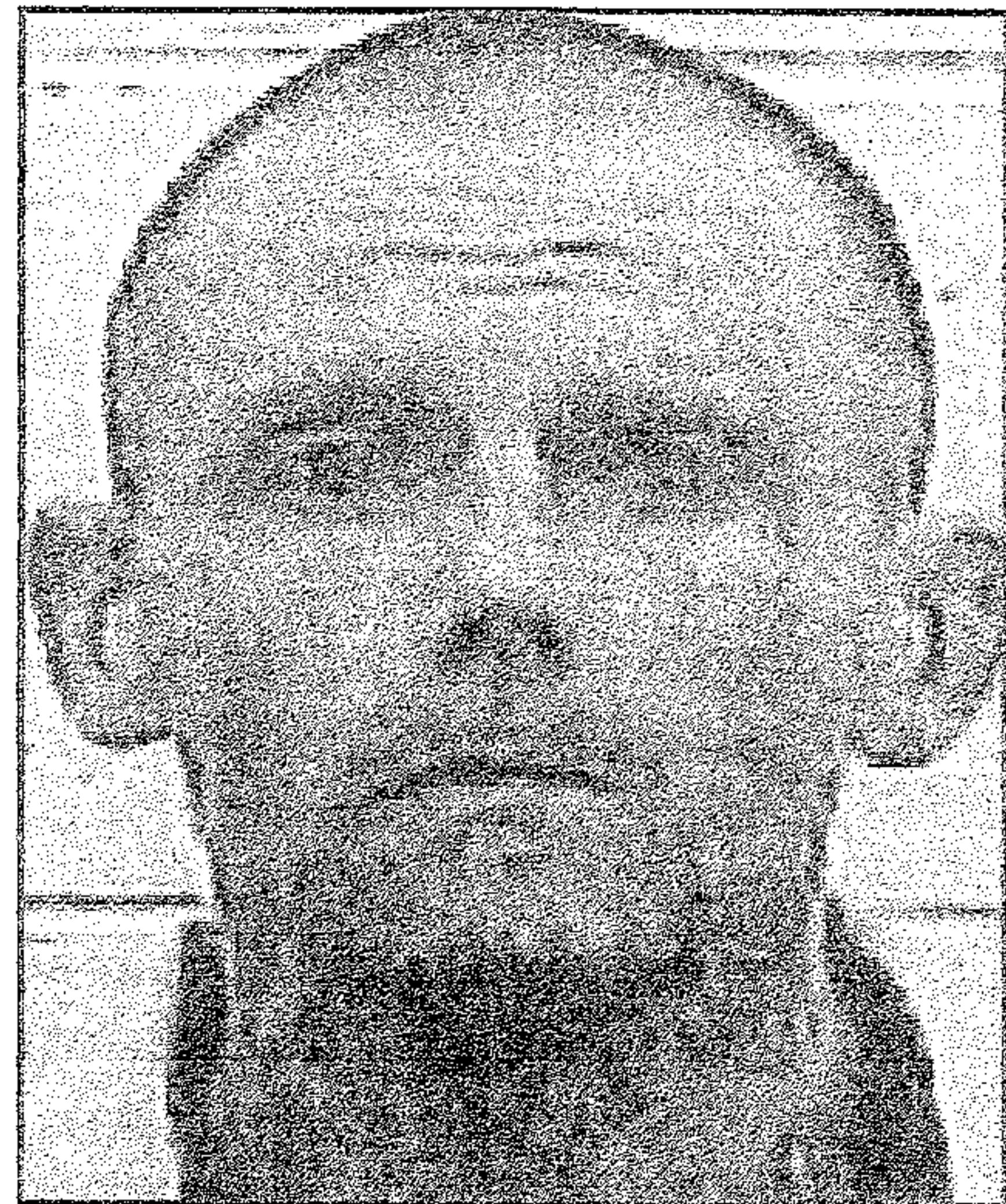

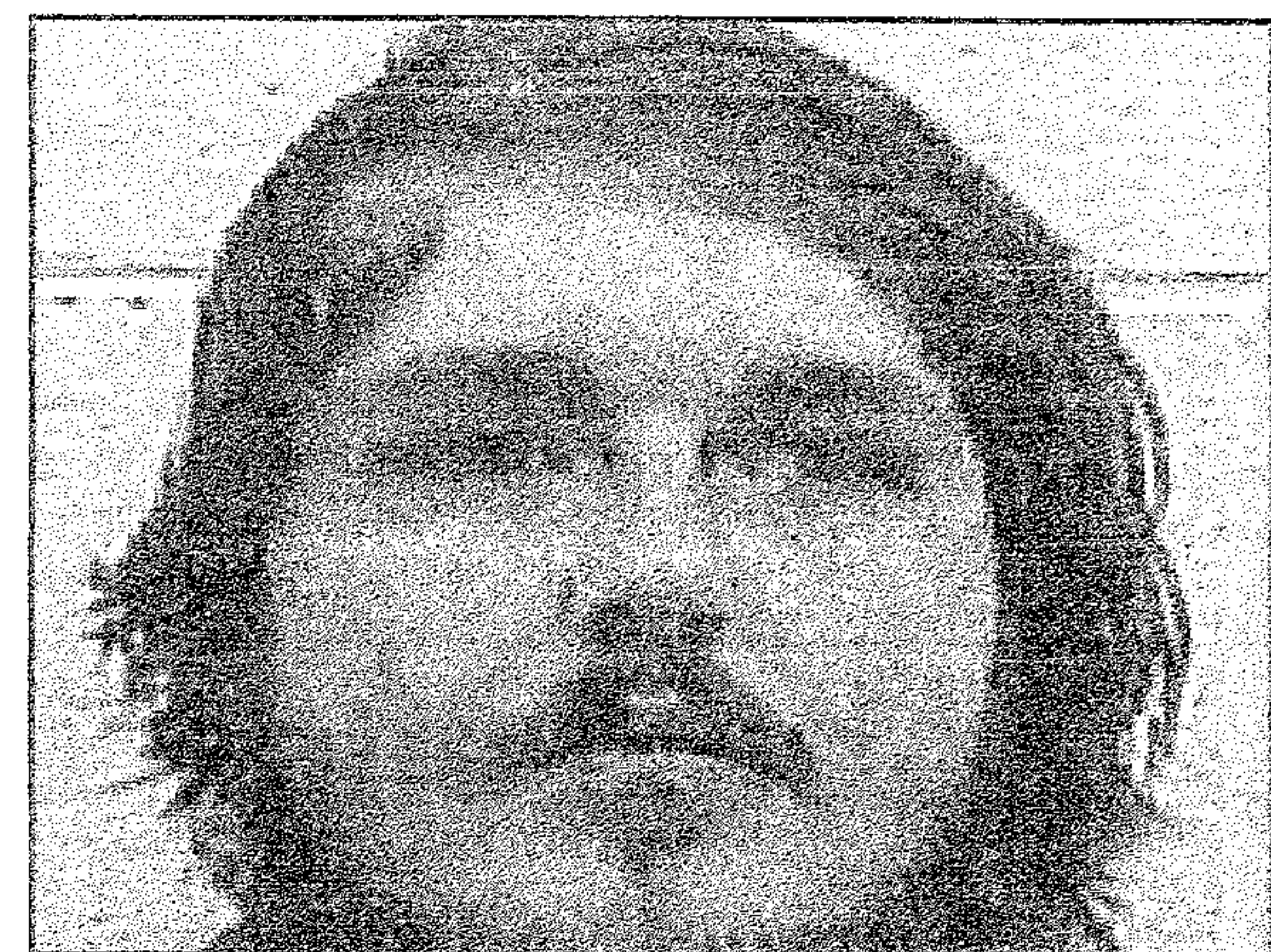

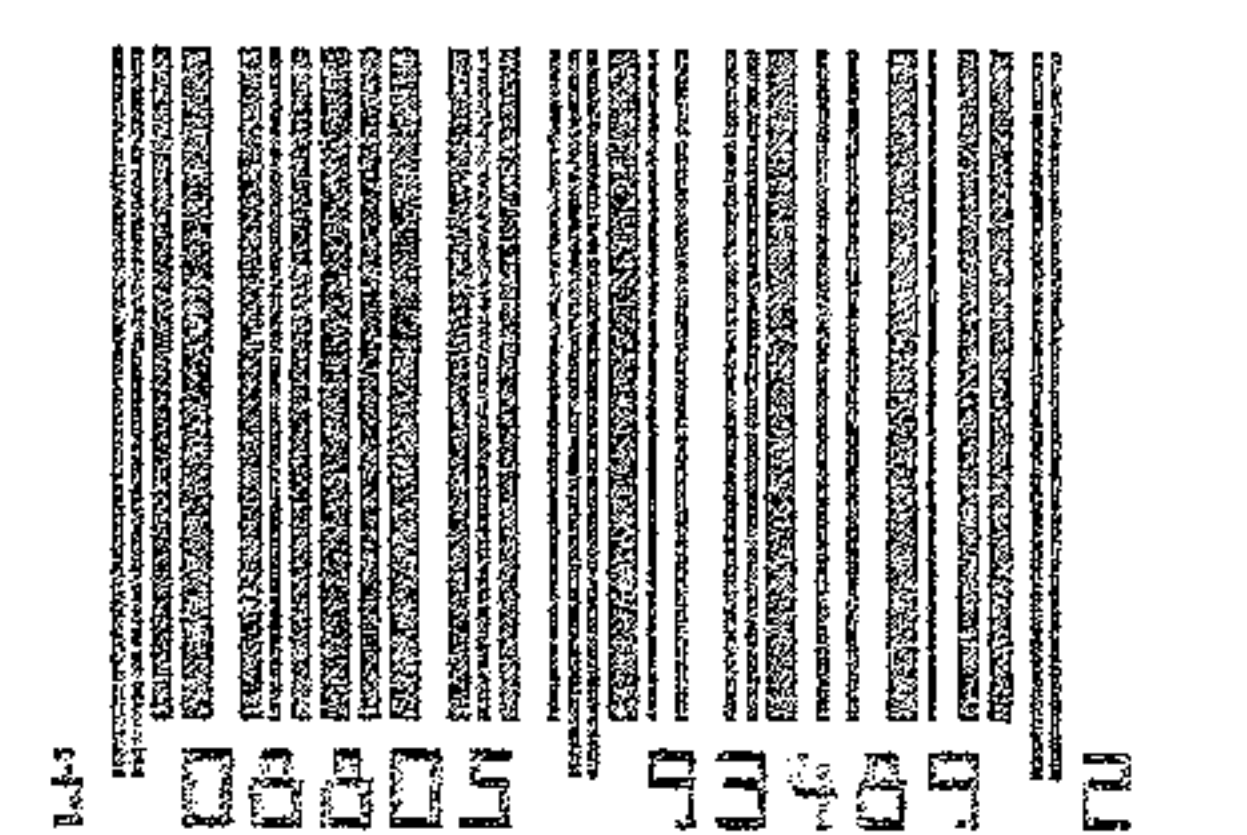

Cynthia Kellam, 52, Anglewood Drive Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Evading, and Reckless Driving. Officer Dunkelberger LCPD, was dispatched to EZ-Stop Food Mart, Hwy 321 N in Lenoir City, TN, in reference to a drunk driver. Officer was traveling on Hwy 321 N towards the EZ-Stop when the dispatcher advised me that the driver was leaving the EZ-Stop. Officer observed the vehicle identified by the dispatcher turning right out of the parking lot of EZ-Stop to merge onto the I-75 NB on ramp from Hwy 321 N. Officer was able to identify the vehicle by the description given to him and attempted to initiate a traffic stop on the on ramp. The offender

merged onto I-75 NB and continued to flee. The vehicle was traveling north in the traveling lane at speeds of roughly 80 miles an hour and was drifting from fog line to the center line. Officer continued to initiate the traffic stop and the driver continued to flee. Traffic was very light. At roughly mile marker 84, the vehicle pulled over on the shoulder and stopped.
