



Reynolds Hill was charged with DUI.



business email compromise (BEC) scheme. Beginning in 2013, his employees regularly called the victim companies' customer service numbers to glean as much information as they could about the companies. They asked for details like names of key employees and their contact information.

They also sent phishing emails that gave them access to the companies' email systems—giving the fraudsters an even bigger trove of information about the victim companies.

"It was a big, sophisticated research effort," said Special Agent Jonathan Polonitza, who investigated this case out of the FBI's New York Field Office.

Armed with these details and two years of research, one of the fraudsters simply called the companies pretending to be a vendor. The caller told each company to change their bank account information for an upcoming payment.

The two companies wired several payments to the fraudulent accounts, adding up to more than \$120 million.

and bring him to the United States for prosecution. He pleaded guilty to wire fraud charges and was sentenced last December to five years in prison.

"Unfortunately, this is happening to a lot of companies because it's a crime that can be committed from the other side of the world," Polonitza said. "They also work very hard to remain anonymous."

BEC is a growing crime—with a staggering price tag. Between 2013 and 2019, the Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) received complaints of more than \$10 billion in losses from the crime.

But there are things you can do to protect yourself and your business. And if you are victimized, it's critical to notify law enforcement as soon as possible. In some cases, money can be recovered.

"It's very important to be careful in opening any email attachments," Polonitza said. "If something is suspicious, alert your company's security. If you are a victim in a case like this, the sooner we know, the sooner we can help."

If you or your company is affected by business email compromise, contact law enforcement immediately and file a complaint online with the IC3 at bec.ic3.gov.

> reports: New figures from the Office for National Statistics (ONS) found that in the year to September, police logged 44,771 knife crime offences. There were 617 homicides last year in England and Wales, with 40 per cent of those murders being

committed with a knife or sharp object.

Helen Ross from the Office for National Statistics Centre for Crime and Justice said: "In the last year, there has been no change in overall levels of crime, however, this hides variations in different types of crime."

"For example, there have been continued rises in fraud, vehicle offences and robbery, and decreases in burglary and homicide," adding that: "Although the number of offences involving a knife has continued to increase, there is a mixed picture across police forces".

The figures, which do not include data from Greater Manchester, due to a discrepancy in data logging, underline the scale of the knife crime epidemic currently plaguing the United Kingdom, a country with very strict gun laws.

For his part, London Mayor Sadiq Kahn naturally down plays the figures and the problem, saying in a statement, "The scourge of violent crime is still rising — and faster elsewhere than here in London. The only solution is to be both tough on crime & on the causes. When will the Government finally fully reverse their cuts to the police, youth services, schools, sports facilities & councils?"

However, under Kahn's leadership, the number of child stabbing victims in London has reached an 11year high as of November and the murder rate in the city has reached the highest it has been in a decade.

The police are doing everything within their power to crackdown on knife crimes but thanks to the mass influx of migrants, street gang activity is making this an almost impossible task.

This is what progressive liberal policies get a country. Lawmakers either ignorantly believe that the answer to ending mass violence is taking away guns or they are purposefully attempting to disarm the population to achieve total control (aka tyranny).

If criminals don't have guns, they will still find ways to hurt each other. It's completely ridiculous to believe that doing away with guns will somehow make a country safer. for services provided by nurse practitioners or other non-physician providers when the services are rendered "incident-to" a physician's services, but only if the physician provides direct supervision. TRICARE always pays the reduced rate for services rendered by non-physician providers regardless of whether a physician supervises. The government alleged that Dr. Chen's practice unlawfully billed government payors at the physician rate even when services were rendered by unsupervised nurse practitioners.

Under the False Claims Act, any person who presents false claims for payment to the United States is liable for three times the damages the government incurs as a result of the false claims and penalties ranging from \$5,000 to \$22,363 per violation, depending on when the violations occurred.

"False billing practices contribute to the rising cost of health care in our country, and cheat taxpayers out of billions of dollars each year," said U.S. Attorney J. Douglas Overbey. "This settlement demonstrates the continued commitment of the United States Attorney's Office to protecting the integrity of our federal health care programs."

"Medicare and other government health payment rules on non-physician providers are clear. While nurse practitioners may provide excellent care, billing their services at an inflated rate cheats taxpayers who are paying for these vital services," said Derrick Jackson, Special Agent in Charge of the Office of Inspector General of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. "Working with our law enforcement partners, we will continue investigating threats to federally funded health care programs."

"I applaud the Department of Justice and the U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Tennessee for their continued efforts to hold health care providers accountable to the American taxpayer," said Army Lt. Gen. Ronald Place, di-

rector of the Defense Health Agency. "The efforts of the Department of Justice to safeguard the health care benefit for our service members, veterans and their families is commendable. The Defense Health Agency continues to work closely with the Justice Department, and other state and federal agencies to investigate all those who participated in fraudulent practices."

This investigation was a coordinated effort by the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Tennessee; the Tennessee Attorney General's Office; the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Inspector General; and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Medicaid Fraud Control Unit. The investigation was prompted by a lawsuit filed in 2015 by a former

nurse practitioner at the practice, under the qui tam or "whistleblower" provisions of the False Claims Act, which permit private individuals to sue on behalf of the government for false claims and to share in any recovery. The relator's share of the recovery in this case is \$51,300.

The case is captioned United States and State of Tennessee ex rel. Forester v. Chang-Wen Chen, M.D. and Chang-Wen Chen, M.D., P.C., Case No. 3:18-cv-51 (E.D. Tenn.).

Assistant United States Attorneys L. Margaret Harker, Jeremy S. Dykes, and Jessica Sievert represented the United States.

The claims settled by this agreement are allegations only; there has been no determination of liability.
