'No Show' Hurley Continues to Be | Call in from Chili's this time Absent while Missing Mom's Election

Loudon County Commissioner for the 2nd District, Julia Hurley, was a big 'no show' on Tuesday's Primary Election Day. Hurley was recently quoted in a front page article of a local newspaper that she was going to vote (at the War Memorial Building precinct) Tuesday in spite of District Attorney General Russell Johnson's letter to Hurley's attorney, T. Scott Jones, asserting that Hurley is no longer a resident of the 2nd District, from the West 5th Avenue home she



apparently moved from last summer. Her not voting, according to District Attorney Johnson was, most likely, a product of the "sound advice of her attorney (Jones)" because "in order to vote in this or any election, each voter has to certify in writing with their signature, under penalty of perjury that they are still a resident of the address listed on their

voter registration". Johnson said, "if she had done so in the 2nd District, in my opinion, she would have been risking a possible charge of perjury if a grand jury had looked at the matter and determined that the 2nd District address was no longer her address and she misrepresented this information to the election officials and voted anyway."

"By not voting, I feel

that Ms. Hurley is acknowledging that she realizes she is no longer a resident of the 2nd District that she serves." Johnson stated. "I know that she was in Nashville







ville in plenty of time to return to vote (as these same people did). Besides that, she lives her life on social media and her postings show she was on her way home early Tuesday morning."

The question remains, what now? District Attorney General Russell Johnson indicated in his letter to Attorney Jones that he would consider filing an ouster suit to have Hurley removed from her County Commissioner position if she did not resign or move back into the 2nd District by today Friday, March 6th.

Attorney T. Scott Jones has forwarded letters to Johnson and the County Mayor and Administrator of Elections asserting that Hurley's move outside of the 2nd District is only a temporary move and, therefore, legal under the law - even though Hurley had leased out her former home when she purchased



the new one. The District Attorney, while acknowledging that the law does allow for temporary moves (such as someone assigned to military duty or a temporary work assignment), maintains that Hurley's move just across the 2nd District/5th District boundary was permanent in that she purchased a home of approximately \$350,000 in value with a principal residence mortgage that requires the home to be used as her principal residence.

County Commissioner Van Shaver of the 5th District is the one who pointed out to Hurley at a county commission meeting, soon after her home purchase and move into his district, that she had evidently made a mistake in not checking to see if her new home was still in the 2nd District or not. Hurley, at that time, seemed caught off guard and has missed numerous meetings since that time including the one Monday March 3rd.

Loudon County Attorney Bob Bowman was requested by Shaver and the other Loudon County Commissioners to look into the situation and a possible ouster suit, but Bowman wrote a letter to the County Commission declining to do so saying in part that state law on this issue was too vague as to the definition of what is a temporary move.

What is curious about Hurley not voting in this most recent Republican Primary is that she is a Republican, having served one term as a Republican State Representative, and working with the Republican State Executive Committee to require regular primary voting by elected Republican officials in order to be on the ballot as a Republican candidate. Also, Julia Hurley's mother, Julia Atchley-Pace, was on the ballot as a delegate for President Trump, so by not voting Julia Hurley did not vote for her own mother in this election.

Attorney General Barr made the announcement at an event in Florida entitled "Keeping Seniors Safe," which outlined his vision for protecting older Americans from financial harm. The event focused special attention on the threat posed by foreign-based fraud schemes that victimize seniors in large numbers. "This year, the Department of Justice prosecuted over 400 defendants, whose schemes totaled more than a billion dollars. I want to thank the men and women of the Department's Consumer Protection Branch, which coordinated this effort, and all those in the U.S. Attorneys' Offices and Criminal Division who worked tirelessly to bring these cases. The Department is committed to stopping the full range of criminal activities that exploit America's seniors."

"We have made great strides this year towards prosecuting those who seek to victimize some of our nation's most vulnerable citizens through scams and financial fraud," said U.S.

Attorney Overbey. "I would urge the public to continue bringing instances of elder fraud to the federal government's attention. Protecting our seniors remains one of the top priorities for the U.S. Attorney's Office, and we will continue to work with our local, state, and federal law enforcement partners to investigate and prosecute those who seek to cause harm to senior citizens within our district."

Elder Fraud Hotline

Attorney General Barr also announced the launch of a National Elder Fraud Hotline, which will provide services to seniors who may be victims of financial fraud. The Hotline will be staffed by experienced case managers who can provide personalized support to callers. Case managers will assist callers with reporting the suspected





These outreach efforts have helped to prevent seniors from falling prey to scams and have frustrated offenders' efforts to obtain even more money from vulnerable elders.




