



### Weed

Billy Mayo, 24, Yelverton Street Alabama, was charged with Simple Possession. Deputy K. Palmer LCSO, observed a grey vehicle traveling on Interstate 40. Deputy observed the vehicle did not have its headlights on. Deputy stopped the vehicle at the 368 mm. When Deputy approached the vehicle he could smell a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. Deputy had the driver Billy Mayo exit the vehicle, and ask if he had anything illegal in the vehicle. Mayo stated marijuana but he threw it out the window when Deputy turned his blue lights on. Deputy Gray

arrived on scene and deployed his K9 partner which alerted on the vehicle. Deputy Gray and Mills searched the vehicle at which time Deputy located a clear plastic baggy with approx.. 13 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana located in a car seat that a 6 week old baby was in prior to the mother getting the baby out for the search. Mayo stated it was his. Billy Mayo was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

## Domestic charge and bond violation
