Victim beaten and threatened with knife when he tries to leave assailant

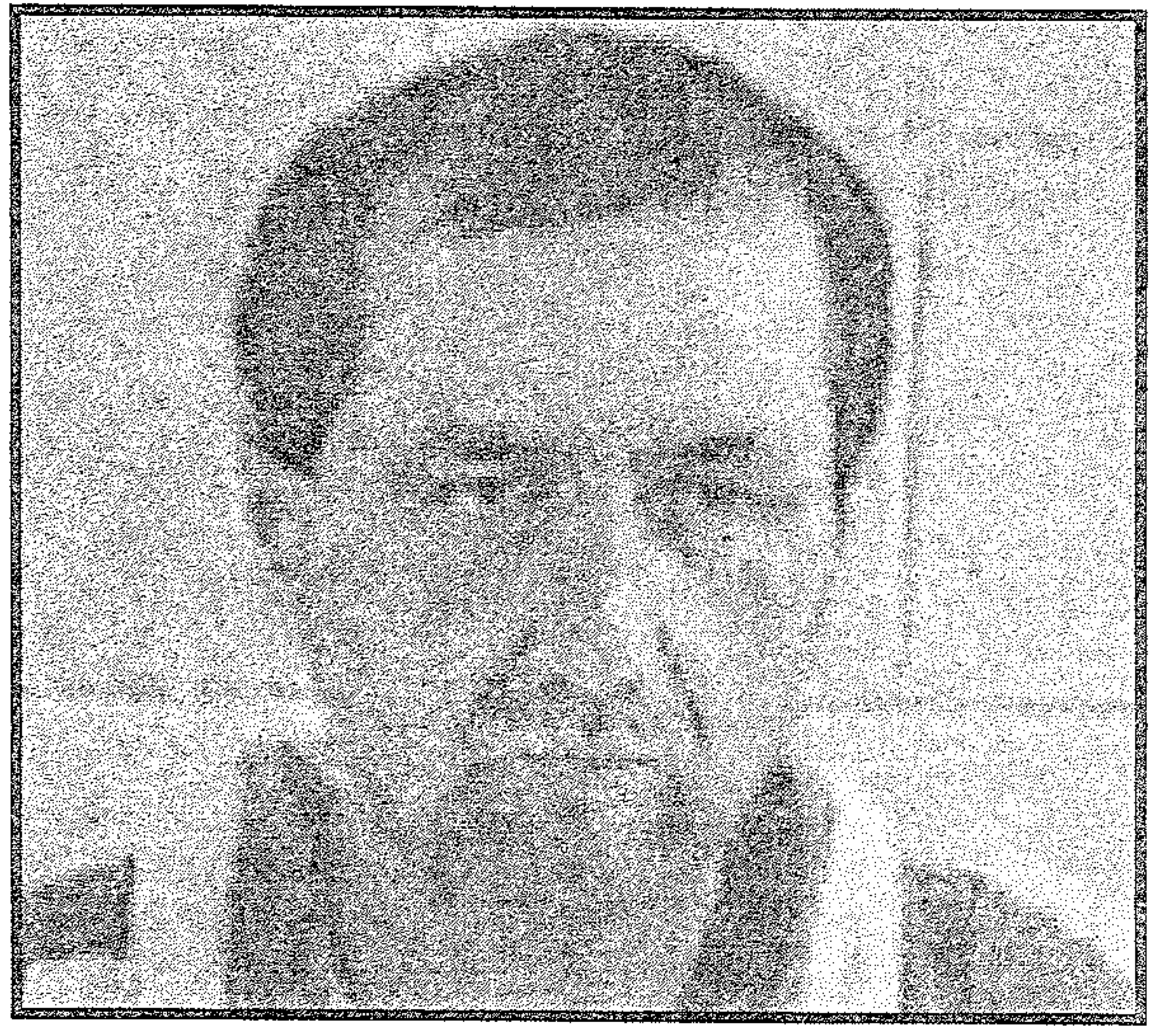

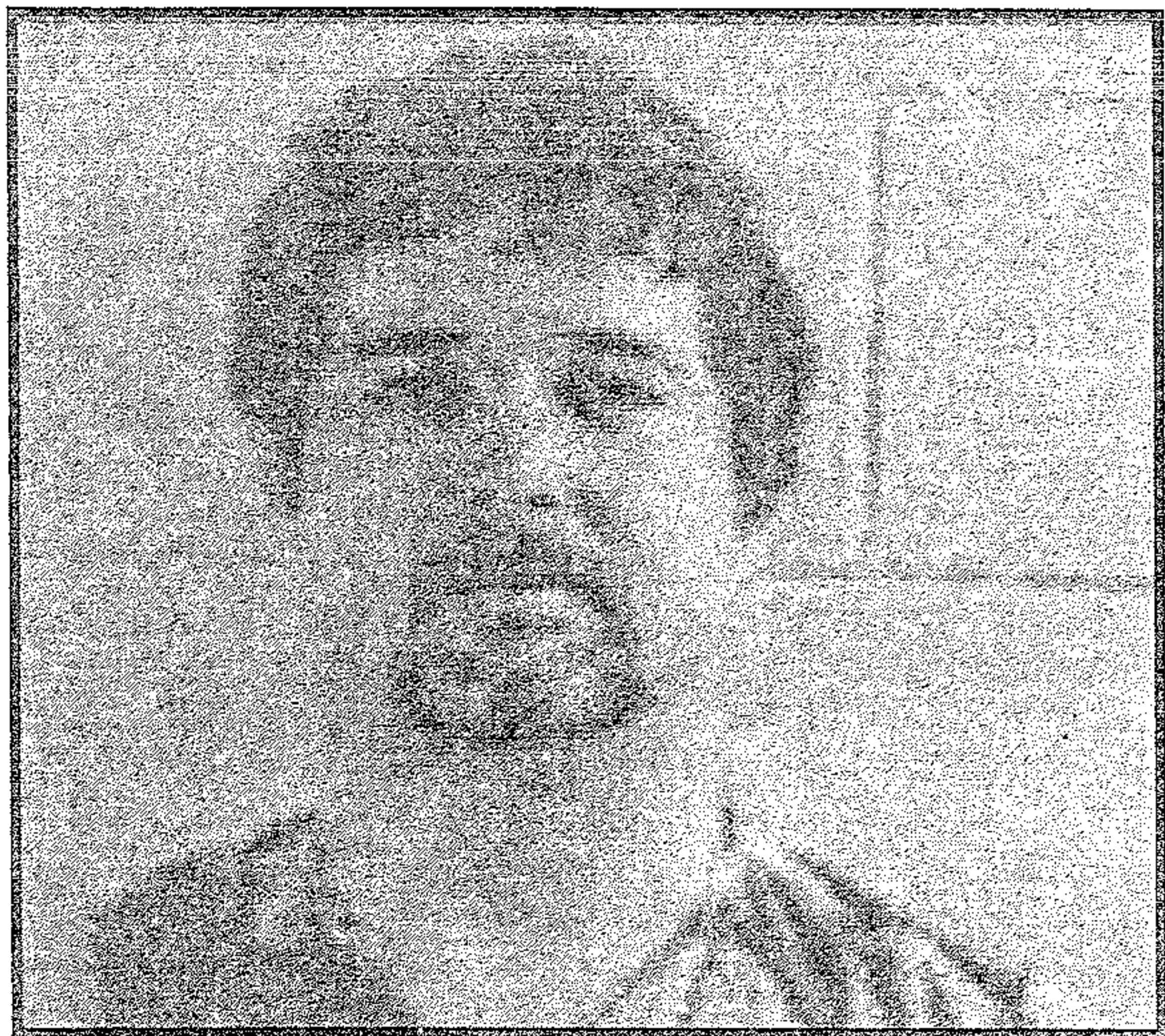

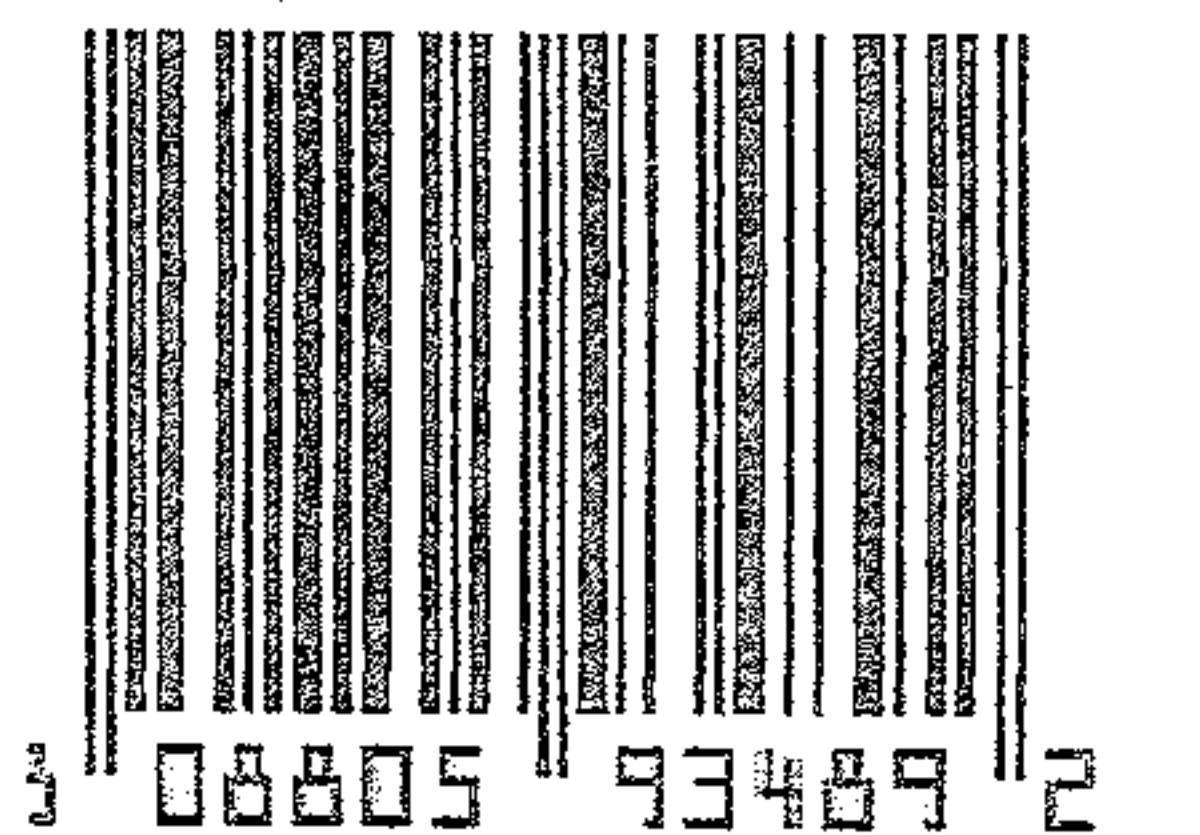

Of Drug Para., Simple Possession, and Unlawful Carrying or Possession of a Weapon. Deputy L. Hawkins LCSO, was dispatched to White Wing Road in reference to a domestic. Upon arrival no one in the residence came to the

front door after knocking. Michael Baker then attempted to flee the scene through the basement door, and was stopped by Deputies. Deputies then made entry into the residence and made contact with the victim, who stated that her and Baker had been arguing because she hid his weapon, and a few items because Baker was acting irate. Victim stated Baker then hit her in the side of the head, and threaten to do worse to her. The victim stated she was in fear for her life and that Baker had a gun because he kept his hands behind his back saying I will blow your brains out. Victim stated she was being held against her

will, and she began contacting her friends. Baker then realized law enforcement was at the door, Baker shoved 2 bags of meth in her hands and told victim to pocket them. Victim ran to the bathroom to hide. When Deputy entered the room where the victim was staying, 2 bags of meth was laying on the bed in plain view. Victim then lead Deputy to where Baker had a green bag where the firearms were located, 5 bags of marijuana, a bag of meth, 3 pills (zanax), 2 scales, and multiple baggies. Michael Baker was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.
