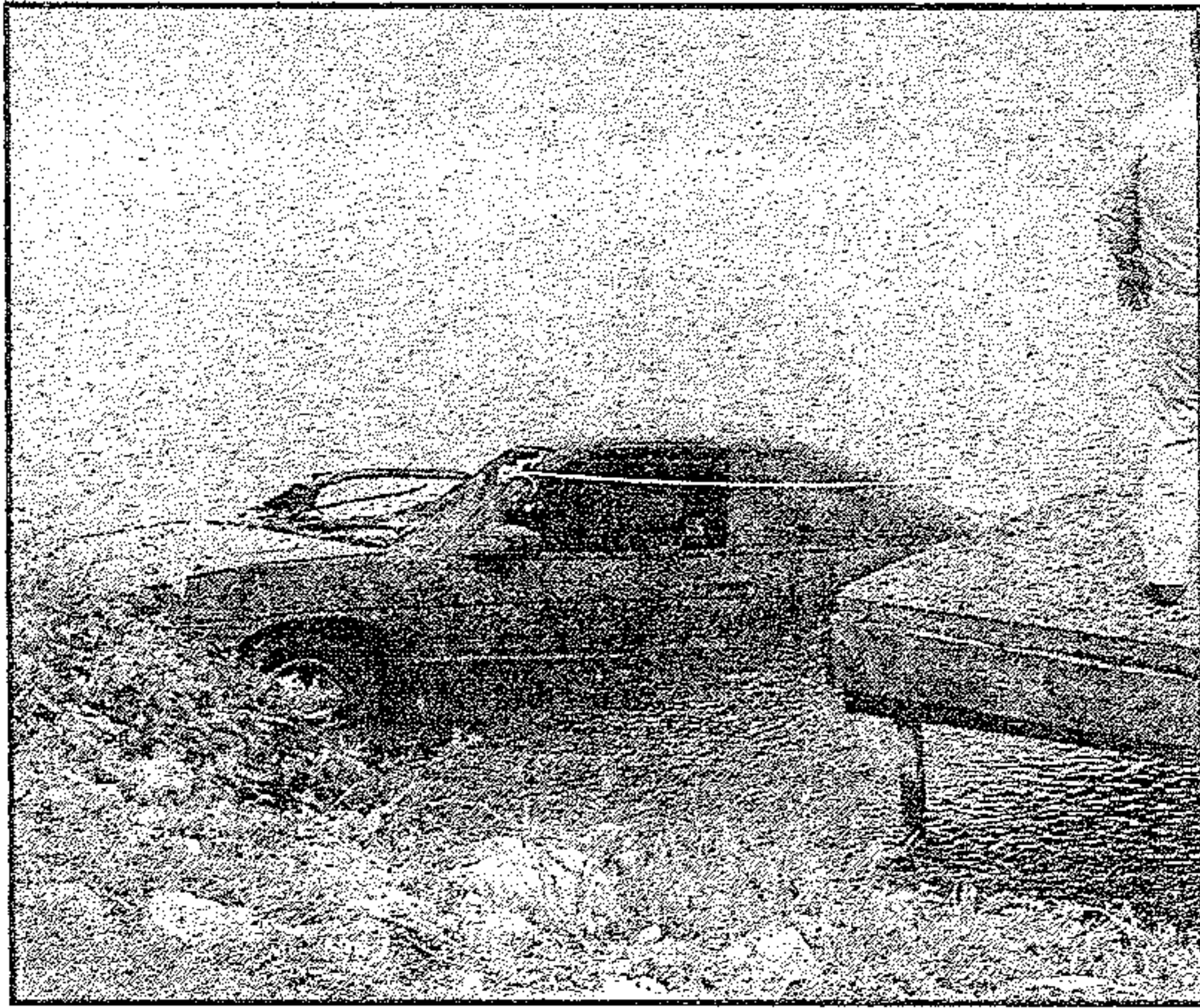
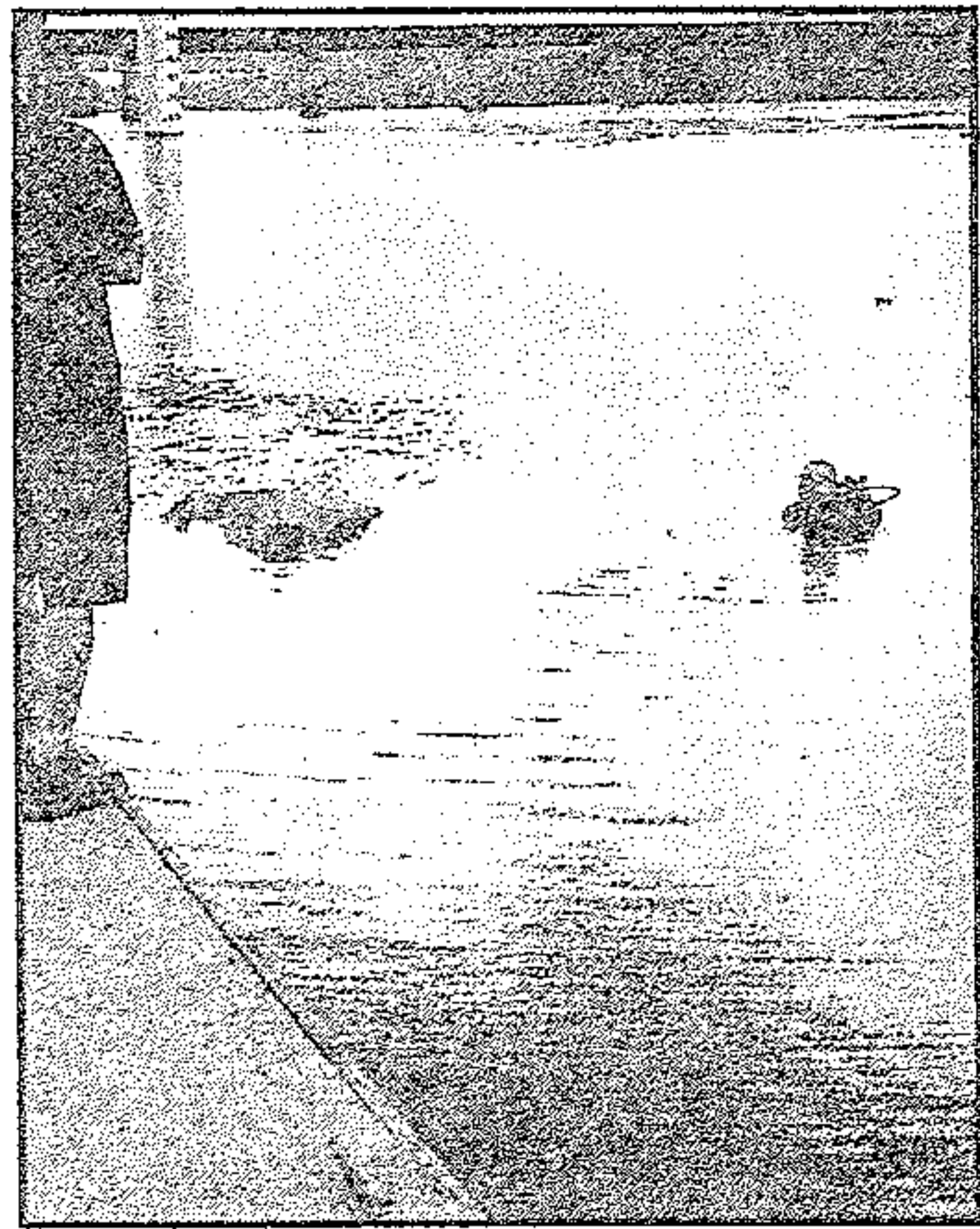

Hear Her: CDC Campaign Highlights Warning Signs of Pregnancy-Related Deaths

Hear Her stresses the importance of listening to pregnant and postpartum women's concerns

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is launching Hear Her, a national campaign that brings attention to pregnancy-related deaths and provides education and encouragement to pregnant

and postpartum women (within one year of delivery).

The campaign seeks to raise awareness of potentially life-threatening warning signs during and after a woman's pregnancy. Hear Her will empower pregnant and postpartum women to speak up when something does not feel right, and encourage the people supporting

them to listen carefully and act when they hear their concerns.

Approximately 700 women die each year in the United States as a result of pregnancy-related complications. There are significant racial and ethnic disparities in pregnancy-related complications and deaths.

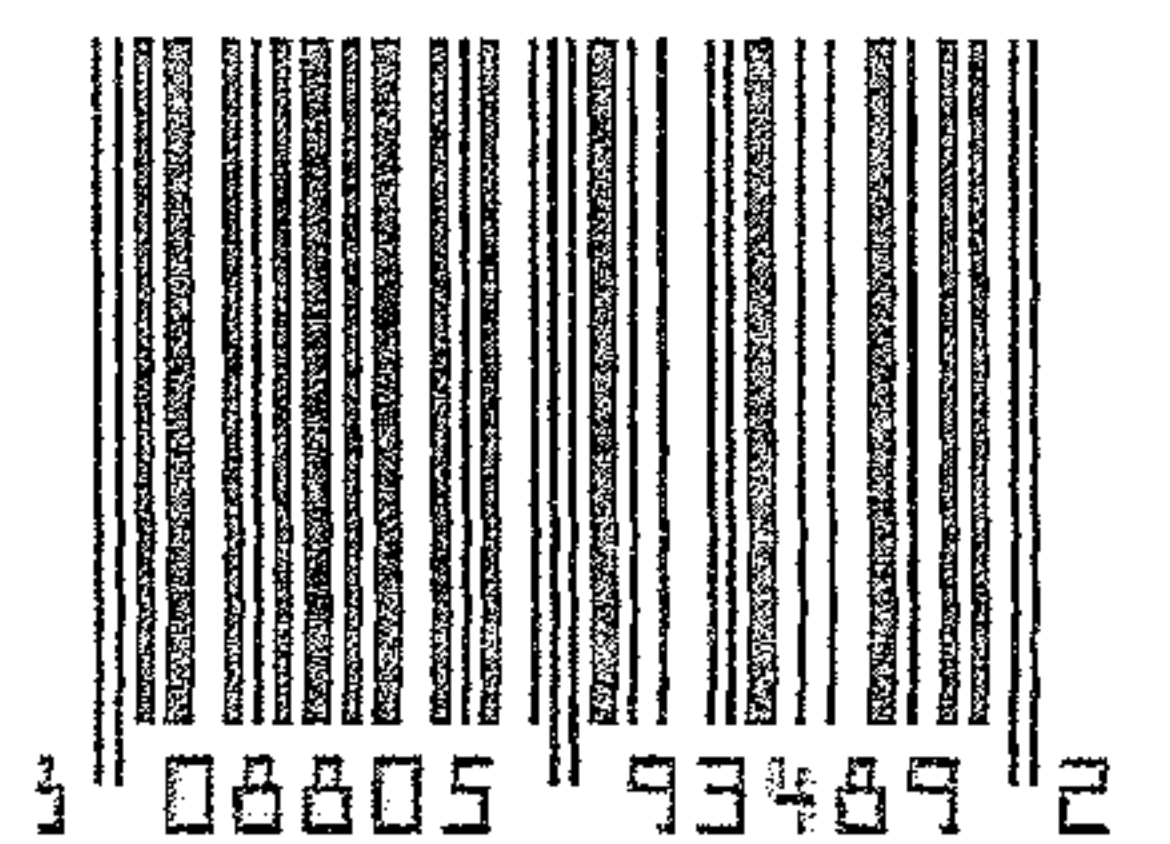

Thursday afternoon was an eventful one in the City of Loudon when dispatch received a call of a vehicle submerged in the lake. Loudon Police and Fire responded along with Priority Ambulance and the Loudon County Rescue Squad and Dive Team.

After responding to the scene divers entered the water along with Loudon Fire Department to secure the scene for the divers protection. A short time later divers found the vehicle and re-

ported it was an older model vehicle possibly a camaro or monte carlo.

James Wrecker Service was on the scene as well and pulled the vehicle from the water up the bank before securing it and towing it away.

Sgt. Scott Newman LPD was on scene and reported they have preliminarily discovered the vehicle is a 1998 Monte Carlo and according to the NCIC it was reported stolen from Knox County shortly thereafter. Sgt. Newman stated they believe the vehicle may have been

dumped in the Notchin Hill area and it floated to the area where it was finally discovered. They are still searching for more information as well.

Robyn Roberts, 38, Laura Lane Friendsville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. I & II, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Domestic Violence.

According to the report, Deputy W. Jenkins LCSO, responded to Laura Ln. Greenback for a domestic. Deputy made contact with the victim, and Robyn Roberts, offender. Roberts advised Deputy that she and the victim got into an argument and that she pushed her hand into the victims face.

The victim also advised Deputy that during the course of an argument that the offender had scratched his head and hit him in the eye. The victim had a 3 to 4 inch bloody scratch on his head and a red left eye. Deputy detained Roberts and placed her into the back of his cruiser.

While Deputy was doing that Deputy Hawkins stepped into the house with the victim to finish collecting statements. While the victim was giving Deputy Hawkins his statement he handed him an Advil pill container and stated that the offender's drugs were inside it. There were also several needles used to consume narcotics about the house.

Deputy read Roberts her Miranda Warning and then asked her if the narcotics and paraphernalia were hers. The offender advised Deputy that the narcotics and paraphernalia were hers. Roberts went on to advise Deputy that the bag on top was heroin and the rocks below the bag were crack cocaine.

She also advised that her crack pipe was in the bathroom which was recovered

by Deputies. A metal spoon with residue on it was recovered from Roberts purse. Roberts stated that she uses the spoon to consume narcotics. Roberts was transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. Narcotics Deputy Marty Stanley weighed and tested the narcotics via TruNarc. The first bag weighed 0.9 grams and tested positive for a combination of Heroin, Fentanyl, and Cocaine. The rocks tested positive for cocaine and weighed in at 1.81 grams. A statement was collected from the victim. A DCS referral will be made do to a juvenile living in the house This did happen in Loudon County Tn.

American Indian/Alaska Native and Black women are two to three times more likely to die from a pregnancy-related complication than white women. Considering that 2 out of 3 of these deaths can be prevented, much pain and heartbreak could be avoided.

Recognizing urgent maternal warning signs and getting an accurate and timely diagnosis can save lives during pregnancy and up to a year after delivery.


The Hear Her campaign encourages

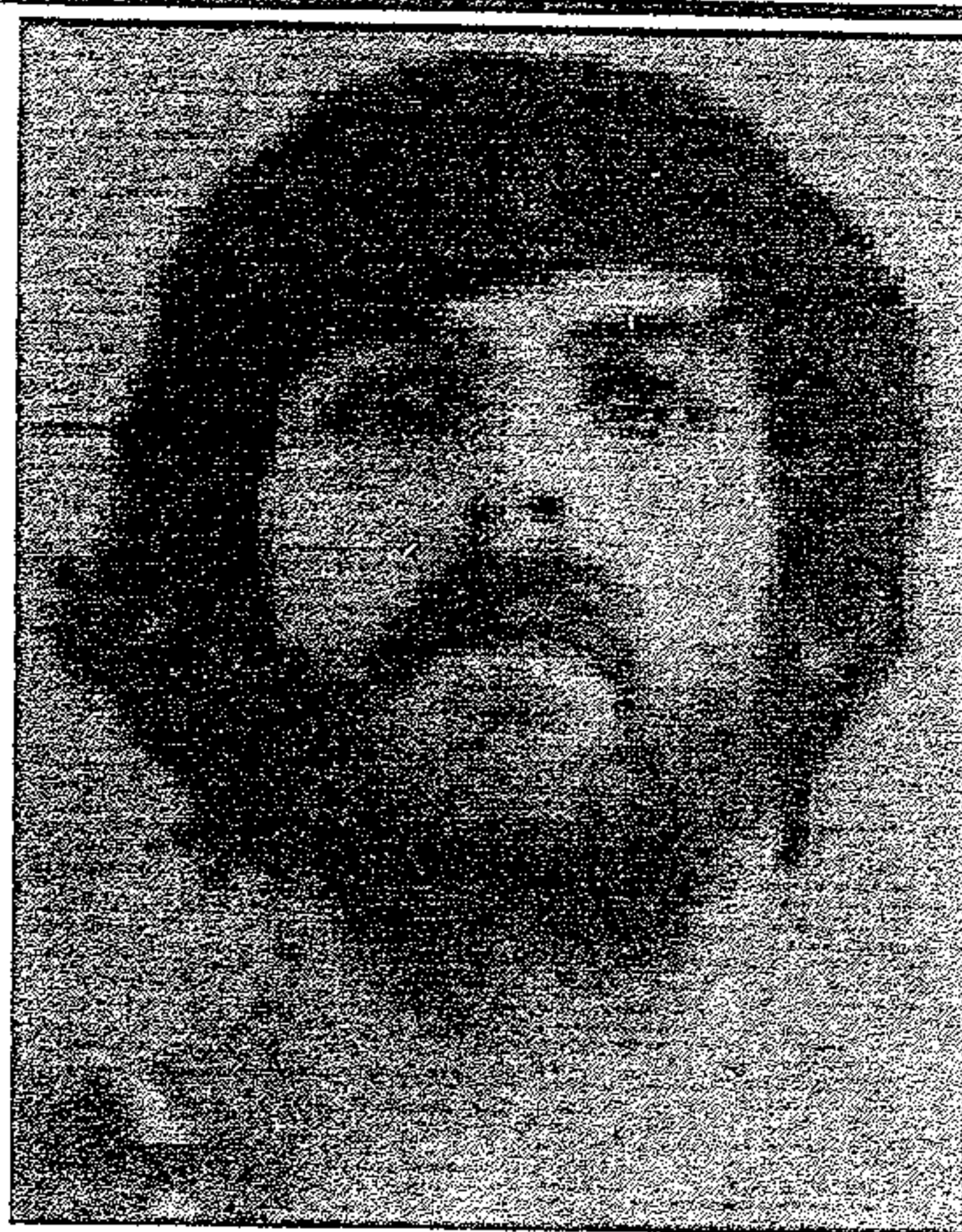

Makalia Robinson, 18, Ford Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession x2, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch.!, Man/Del/ Sale or Possession of Meth, Criminal Impersonation, and Poss.of Drug Para.

Cody Price, 29, Three Point Road Vonore, was charged with Simple Possession x2, Man/Sell/Poss. of Controlled Substance x2, Criminal Impersonation, Man/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, and Poss.of Drug Para.

Cpl. Chris Jenkins LCSO, went to a dead-end road off of Hotchkiss Valley with no residences on the road. Cpl. observed a male and a female standing in front of the vehicle with the hood up and both at the engine compartment. Cpl. spoke with the female later identified as

Ms. Makalia Hope Robinson. Cpl. attempted to identify the male but he was being evasive about his identity. The male refused to look at Deputy and kept working under the hood of the vehicle. The male advised his name was Cody Allen and advised he did not know his Social Security Number. The male was later identified as Cody Allen Price. When other officers arrived, Cpl. deployed K9 Deja to conduct a free air sniff of the vehicle. K9 Deja gave a positive indication of the odor of illegal narcotics coming from the vehicle. Approximately 0.66 grams of crystal methamphetamine, two baggies of Fentanyl weighing 2.32 grams and 1.92 grams, one baggy of Heroin with Fentanyl weighing 1.9 grams, one suboxone pills and a baggy of marijuana weighing 0.5 grams were found in a container under the hood of the vehicle. A baggy of marijuana weighing ap-

proximately 1.65 grams, two sets of digital scales, and additional baggies were found inside the vehicle. Neither subject claimed ownership of the narcotics. \$5,625 in US currency was found on Price's person which was subsequently seized. The drug items were tested using the TruNarc by Investigator Marty Stanley. This happened in Loudon County, TN. Both were transported to the Loudon County Jail.

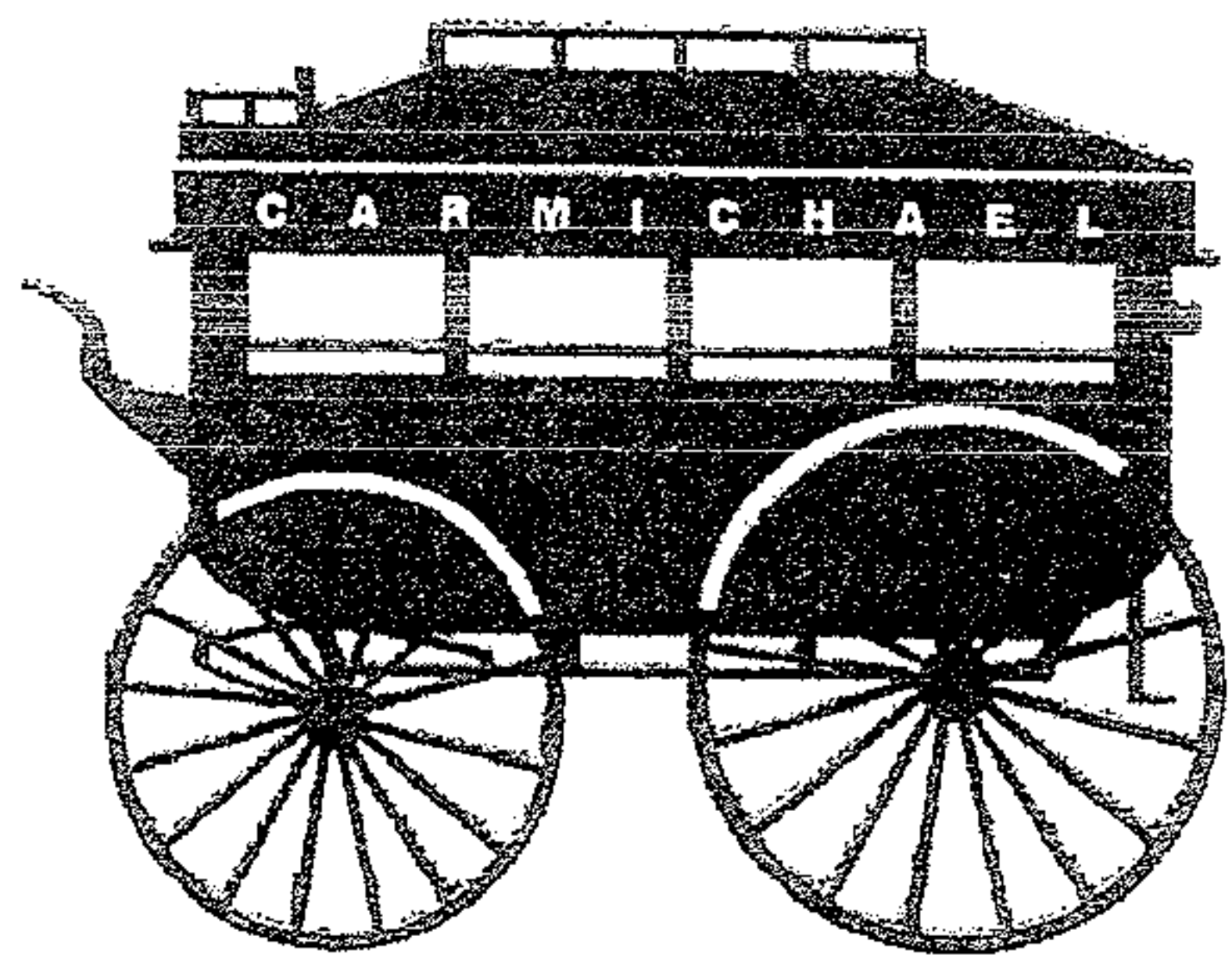

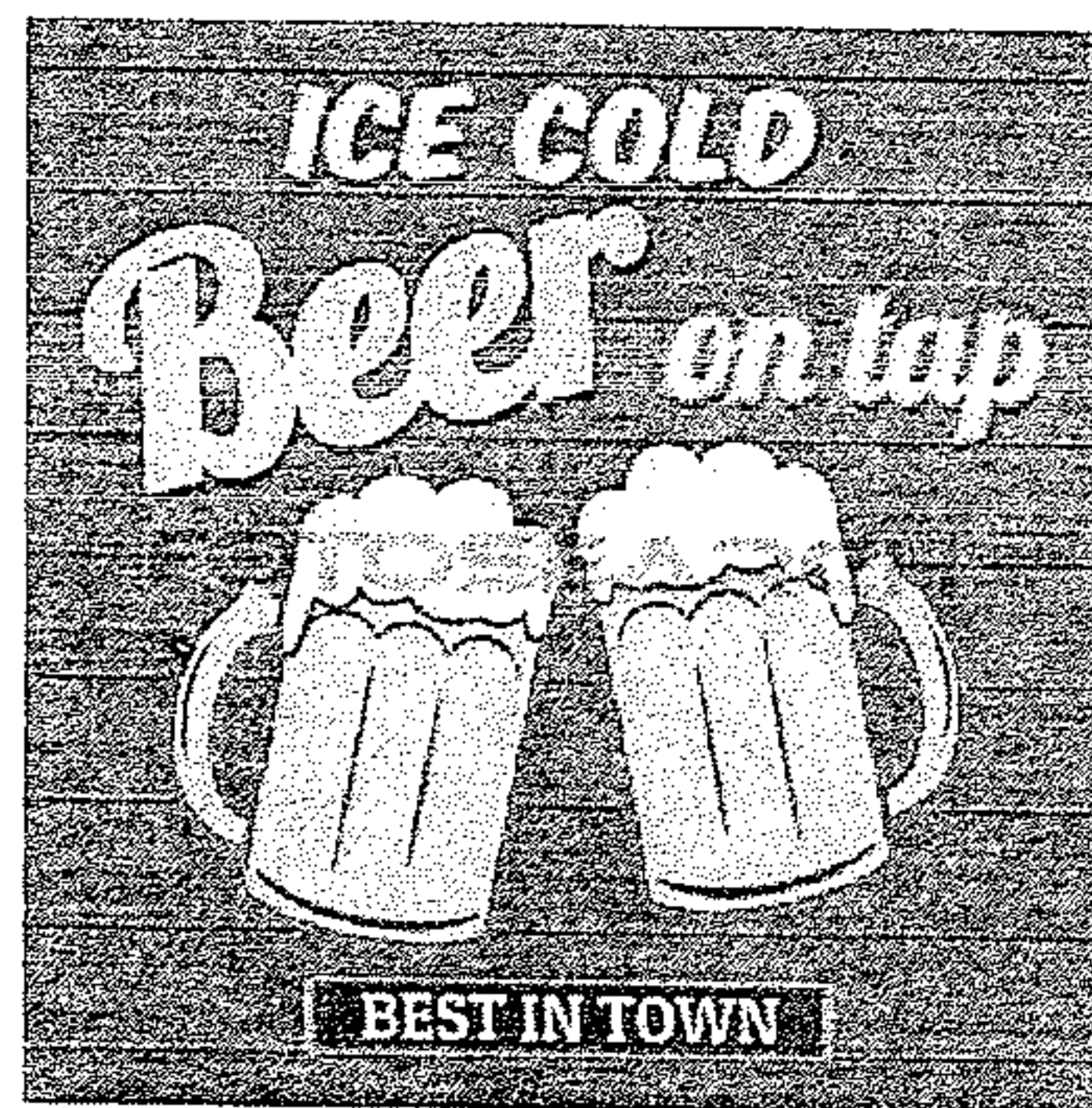

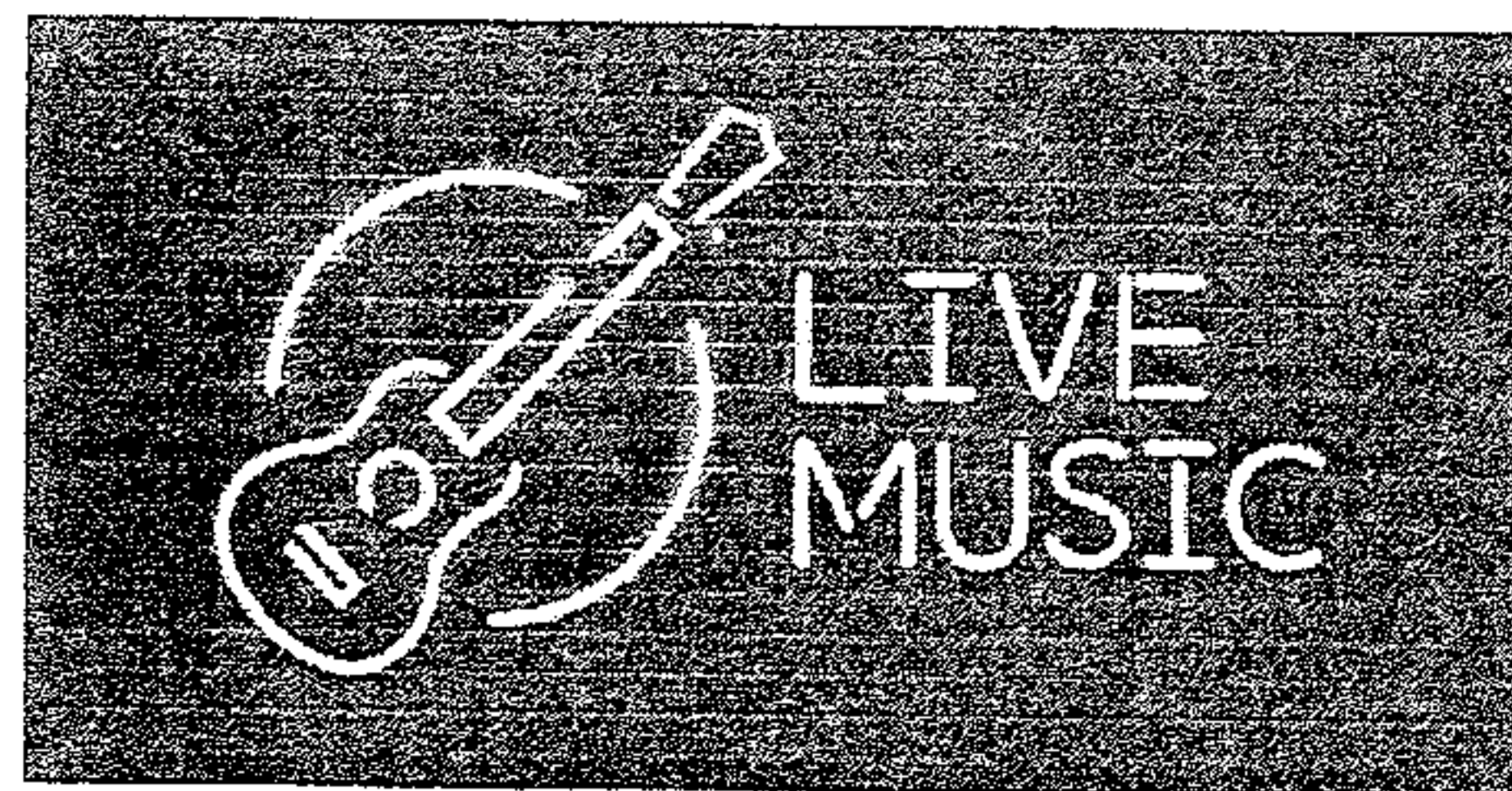

Division of Reproductive Health at the National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion. "Women know their bodies and can often tell when something is not right. We hope Hear Her will help people recognize maternal warning signs and quickly get the care women need."

Everyone has a role to play in preventing pregnancy-related deaths.

If you are pregnant or were pregnant within the last year and feel that something is wrong, talk to your health-care provider. If you are experiencing an urgent maternal warning sign highlighted on the Hear Her website, get medical care immediately. Continue to share your concerns until you are heard, and your questions are answered.

Partners, friends, and family can help loved ones get the care they may need and learn the warning signs that indicate immediate medical care is needed.

Healthcare providers can listen to patients and make sure concerns are adequately addressed.

Maternal mortality prevention

Maternal health is a complex public health issue that requires a multifaceted solution. The Hear Her campaign is one of many strategies that CDC, other federal partners,
