




Guilty

Courtney Bingham (age 36 now) pleaded guilty in Loudon County Criminal Court today to five felony charges related her sexual relationship with a 16 year old boy in November and December 2018 soon after she had turned 35 years old. An investigation was conducted by Jason Smith who was a detective with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office. Bingham was set to go to trial next week on September 15th, but entered the guilty plea today in lieu of a trial by jury. She pleaded guilty to four felony counts of Aggravated Statutory Rape and received a sentence of four years to serve on each conviction. Three of the four year sentences will run consecutive to each other for an effective sentence to serve of 12 years. Bingham also

pleaded guilty to one felony count of Solicitation of a Minor to Commit Statutory Rape by Authority Figure and received a four year sentence on that charge as well which is to run concurrently with the 12 year sentence on the other four felony convictions. Essentially, Bingham ended up with a 12 year sentence to serve in TDOC custody at a minimum of 35% before she is eligible for the possibility of parole. She will be on the Sex Offender Registry for Life and subject to monitoring, including monitoring of her internet activities.

Part of the reason for pressing this case to trial, which resulted in what I consider to be a significant result for the State, was the difference in ages between the defendant and victim, the defendant's position of trust in the church, and her prior multiple felony criminal his-

tory."

ADA Kennedy said, "I, too, am pleased that this case has resolved on the defendant's guilty plea. I hope that this result gives some much-needed closure to the victim and his family, as well as the community."

Bingham is turning herself in to the Loudon County Jail on October 11th to go into custody to begin serving her TDOC sentence.





"With the new school year underway, the safety of our nation's students remains paramount," said COPS Office Director Phil Keith. "Although this school year may look different at the start, now is the ideal time to make preparations to enhance school safety for when all of our children are back in the classroom."

The Students, Teachers, and Officers Preventing School Violence Act of 2018 (STOP) School Violence Act of 2018) gave the COPS Office authority to provide awards directly to states, units of local government, Indian tribes, and public agencies (such as school districts and law enforcement agencies) to improve security at schools and on school grounds in the jurisdiction of the grantee through evidence-based school safety programs. The three awards announced today can be used for coordination with law enforcement; training for local law enforcement officers

to prevent student violence; metal detectors, locks, lighting, and other deterrent measures; technology for expedited notification of local law enforcement during an emergency; and other measures that provide a significant improvement in security. 
