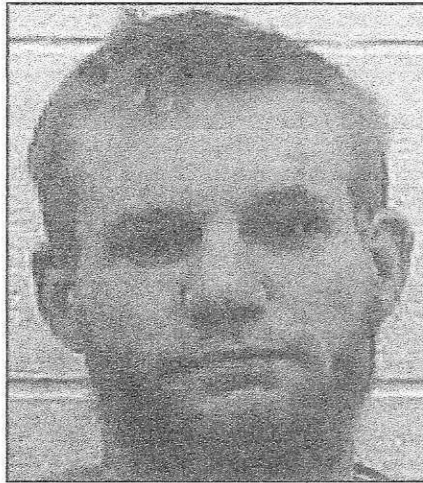

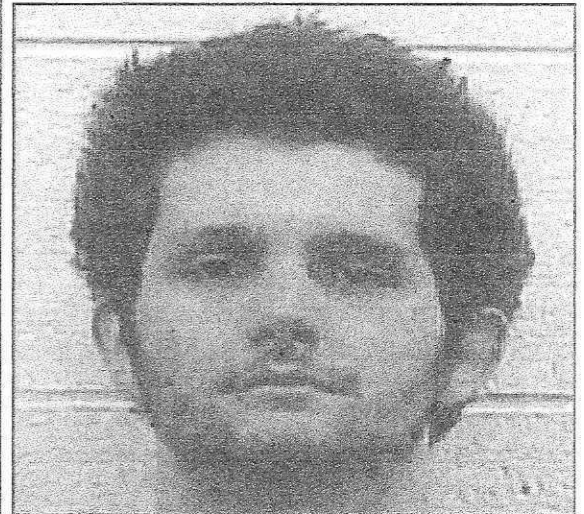

Stuck in the Mud While Fooling Around Ends With Charges

Johnson County Nonprofits Investigated, One Leader Indicted for Theft

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office has released two investigative reports that detail improper actions within two Johnson County nonprofit organizations – A.C.T.I.O.N. Coalition and Johnson County Safe Haven – which both receive government grants.

The former executive director of A.C.T.I.O.N., Angela

Wills Dickens, has been indicted for theft over \$2,500 after investigators found that she misappropriated A.C.T.I.O.N. funds totaling at least \$3,674.

A.C.T.I.O.N. was created to collaborate with community organizations to provide educational resources that help reduce tobacco, drug, and alcohol use among Johnson County youth.

Dickens allowed the nonprofit to pay for a family member's cell phone plan and cell phone equipment totaling at least \$3,462. She also used the nonprofit's funds to purchase food from a local grocery store for her personal use totaling at least \$212.

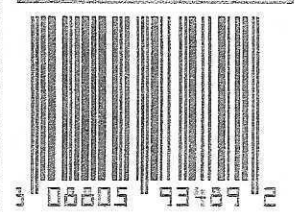

David Coleman, 57, Mimosa Circle Maryville, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Christopher Crandall, 28, Northshore Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, conducted a traffic stop on a white vehicle for a window tint violation (21%) and a light law violation (drivers side head light).

Upon contact with the vehicle both the driver and passenger exited the vehicle where Officer Miller and Officer Ketner made contact with the two who were later identified as Mr. David Coleman (driver) and Mr. Christopher Crandall (passenger).

While speaking with officers a needle was located near CRANDALL on the ground, when asked if the needle belonged to

him, CRANDALL stated that it was his needle and forgot that it was in his pocket so he had dropped it on the ground.

CRANDALL advised that he had used the needle earlier to inject methamphetamines into his person. When speaking with COLEMAN he stated that there were no illegal items inside of the vehicle and gave permission to search the vehicle. A search of the vehicle revealed (1) glass pipe with a charred bottom used to smoke methamphetamines, (1) medicine bottle that was located under the drivers seat containing (2) baggies of a crystal substance believed to be methamphetamines (8.3

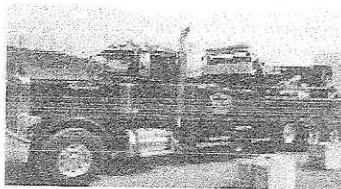

Grams).

Both COLEMAN & CRANDALL were placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon Co. Jail without incident. When both COLEMAN & CRANDALL were placed under arrest they were both separately mirandized and both stated they would agree to talk. CRANDALL advised that he had no idea COLEMAN had the methamphetamine in the vehicle with him at the time of being stopped by law enforcement.

COLEMAN stated that he does use methamphetamines. When asked how he uses he stated that he smokes it from a glass pipe.

Charges

Micah Viles, 25, Knob Road Vonore, was charged with Simple Possession x3, and Man/sell/Del/Resale Sch. II.

Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, was dispatched to Steekee Road for a suspicious vehicle parked behind a barn with its lights on. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with Mr. Micah Viles who stated that he and his girlfriend had pulled behind the barn to fool around and became stuck in the mud. Deputy then asked Mr. Viles if he had anything illegal on him at which time he handed Deputy a small baggy of Marijuana weighing approximately .56 grams. Deputy then spoke with female who stated that they where just trying to turn around and became stuck. Consent to search the vehicle was given. Deputy observed a light blue purse laying in the passenger seat with a small multicolor case inside. Upon

track marks on his right arm. Mr. Micah Viles was taken into custody for Man/Sale/Delivery of schedule 2 Methamphetamine weighing approximately .32 grams, Simple Possession Schedule 6 marijuana weighing approximately .56 grams, simple Possession schedule 3 Suboxone and Simple Possession schedule 4 Clonazepam. Mr. Micah Viles was transported to the Loudon County jail without further incident.

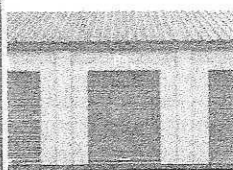

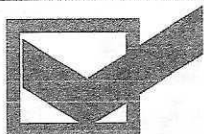

Theft

Investigators also found that Dickens used A.C.T.I.O.N. credit cards to make personal purchases; however, investigators were able to determine that Dickens reimbursed the nonprofit for the personal purchases she made.

Additionally, investigators are questioning purchases totaling \$17,200 made with A.C.T.I.O.N. funds. In some instances, purchases for food, travel, and supplies were not supported with itemized receipts or detail. Therefore, investigators could not determine if the purchases were exclusively for A.C.T.I.O.N. purposes.

Johnson County Safe Haven, a nonprofit that supports victims of domestic violence, acted as the fiscal agent for A.C.T.I.O.N.

In a separate investigation, Comptroller investigators found that Safe Haven's ex-

ecutive director improperly used the nonprofit's credit card to make personal purchases, and he included family members and a family friend on the Safe Haven cell phone account. Although the entity's credit card and phone account should not be used for non-business purposes, investigators were able to confirm the executive director and his family friend paid the amounts owed to the organization.

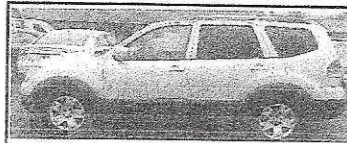
"Our investigators have recommended a number of changes to strengthen financial accountability and oversight within these nonprofits," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "I encourage the organizations' boards of directors to review these recommendations and implement the appropriate corrections."

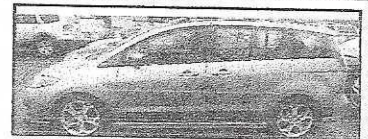

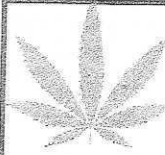
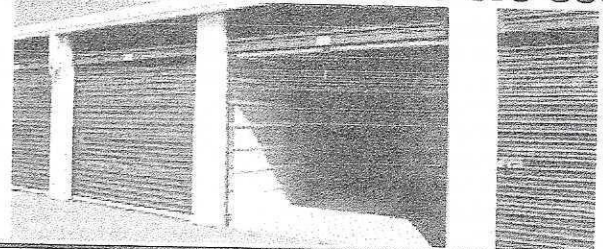
