



Officer R. Miller LCPD, conducted a traffic stop on a white vehicle for a window tint violation (21%) and a light law violation (drivers side head light).

Upon contact with the vehicle both the driver and passenger exited the vehicle where Officer Miller and Officer Ketner made contact with the two who were later identified as Mr. David Coleman (driver) and Mr. Christopher Crandall (passenger).

While speaking with officers a needle was located near CRANDALL on the ground, when asked if the needle belonged to him, CRANDALL stated that it was his needle and forgot that it was in his pocket so he had dropped it on the ground.

CRANDALL advised that he had used the needle earlier to inject methamphetamines into his person. When speaking with COLEMAN he stated that there were no illegal items inside of the vehicle and gave permission to search the vehicle. COLEMAN Both CRANDALL were placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon Co. incident. without Jail When both COLEMAN & CRANDALL were placed under arrest they were both separately mirandized and both stated they would agree to talk. CRANDALL advised that he had no idea COLEMAN had the methamphetamine in the vehicle with him at the time of being stopped by law enforcement.

COLEMAN stated that he does use methamphetamines. When asked how he uses he stated that he smokes it from a glass

Micah Viles, 25, Knob Road Vonore, was charged with Simple Possession x3, and Man/sell/Del/Resale Sch. II.

Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, was dispatched to Steekee Road for a suspicious vehicle parked behind a barn with its lights on. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with Mr. Micah Viles who stated that he and his girlfriend had pulled behind the barn to fool around and became stuck in the mud. Theft

Investigators found that Dickens used A.C.T.I.O.N. credit cards to make personal purchases; however, investigators were able to determine that Dickens reimbursed the nonprofit for the personal purchases she made.

Additionally, investigators are questioning purchases totaling \$17,200 made with A.C.T.I.O.N funds. In some instances, purchases for food, travel, and supplies were not recommended a number of supported with itemized receipts or detail. Therefore, investigators could not determine if the purchases were exclusively for A.C.T.I.O.N. purposes.

Johnson County Safe Haven, a nonprofit that supports victims of domestic violence, acted as the fiscal agent for A.C.T.I.O.N.

Comptroller investigators found that Safe Haven's ex-

ecutive director improperly used the nonprofit's credit card to make personal purchases, and he included family members and a family friend on the Safe Haven cell phone account. Although the entity's credit card and phone account should not be used for non-business purposes, investigators were able to confirm the executive director and his family friend paid the amounts owed to the organization.

"Our investigators have changes to strengthen financial accountability and oversight within these nonprofits," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "I encourage the organizations' of directors to review these recommendations and implement the appropriate correc-



nington then fled down the driveway of Sugarlimb Rd where his vehicle became immobilized.

He then attempted to flee on foot and resist arrest where Deputy then conducted a short foot pursuit and used soft empty hand control techniques to take Isaac into custody. Deputy observed the odor of a strong alcoholic beverage coming from Isaac's person.


He then refused to perform Standardized Field Sobriety Testing along with giving a blood or breath sample. Upon search of the vehicle Deputy then located a glass pipe used to smoke methamphetamine in the back of the driver seat.

It was then found that

Isaac had three active warrants out of Blount County and had a suspended drivers license, confirmed through dispatch. Contact was then made with the back seat passenger Elizabeth Kress who was found to have one active warrant out of Loudon County. She advised that she begged for Isaac to stop the car but he would not putting her in fear.

Both were then transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. Once taken inside of the jail, it was found that Ms. Kress had 0.63 grams of a crystal like substance inside of her person. Deputy patrol vehicle suffered damage to the left front bumper and had to get two front tires replaced. All of this did occur in Loudon County, TN.
