HHS Announces \$22 Billion in Funding to Support Expanded Testing, Vaccination Distribution

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) today announced two upcoming actions by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to provide more than \$22 billion in funding to states, localities, and territories in support of the nation's response to the COVID-19 pandemic,

as directed by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act.

Funding will provide critical support for testing and vaccination-related activities to jurisdictions before January 19, 2021:

More than \$19 billion will be allocated to jurisdictions through the existing CDC Epi-

demiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC) cooperative agreement. These awards will support testing, contract tracing, surveillance, containment, and mitigation to monitor and suppress the spread of COVID-19. Award recipients will include 64 jurisdictions including

Deputy, Sgt. C. Huchens, Dep. A. Parton and Dep. T. Branson arrived on scene and made contact with both subjects. Victim had swelling from his lips and dried blood on his mouth along with a broken flowerpot on the floor of the living room. Deputy spoke with Mrs. Majka who stated they had been drinking since noon at the Toqua Golf Club with their neighbors. They came back to the neighbors house around 3PM. She stated vic-

ed, the funding bill signed by President Trump in December has billions of dollars in new funding for COVID-19 testing and vaccinations," said HHS Secretary Alex Azar. "We're making these billions in new funds available to states as quickly as possible to support our combined efforts to end the pandemic."

"This funding is another timely investment that will strengthen our nation's efforts to stop the COVID-19 pandemic in America," said CDC Director Robert R. Redfield, MD. "Particularly now, it is crucial that states and communities have the resources they need to conduct testing, and to distribute and administer safe, high-quality COVID-19 vaccines safely and equitably."

dle inside of the vehicle and did retrieve it. Officer then made contact with the passenger Ms. Jennifer Stratton, when asked if she had any needles inside of the vehicle STRATTON responded "yes" and handed a small bag over. Officer then had STRATTON step out of the vehicle to conduct a search. Inside of the bag that STRATTON handed over were several loaded needles along with a crystal like substance believed to be methamphetamines. A search of the vehicle was then conducted where Officer located: (1.3 Grams) of what is believed to methamphetamines, (3.5) Xanax Pills, (1) Digital Scale with a white residue believed to methamphetamines, (2) cut straws with residue inside of them, (4) spoons, and several baggies ranging in sizes believed to be used for selling illegal narcotics. Also located was a cut straw with residue found in HUBBARD'S wallet. Both subjects were then placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. When in custody both subjects were mirandized and asked about the narcotics. HUB-

BARD was asked about the cut straw located inside of his wallet where he stated that it was 'his from a long time ago. HUBBARD stated that he used the cut straw to snort pills. Officer then asked HUBBARD where they were heading to and he advised that he was dropping STRATTON off at the SureStay to hang with some of her friends. When speaking with STRATTON she stated that she was being dropped off at the SureStay to hang out with some of her friends. She did not want to speak about any of the narcotics found in her possession. STRATTON did state that she uses methamphetamines, and uses needles to inject meth into her person. During a search after entering the jail, Deputy Henry noticed that Stratton had items inside her private area.

After placing Mr. Major into custody for the warrant LCPD Officers conducted a search of the vehicle and located inside a cigarette pack containing a plastic bag with crystal substance inside. Agents arrived on scene and took possession of the substance that did test positive

for the presence of methamphetamine and weighed approximately 1.5 grams. These actions did happen in Loudon County.
