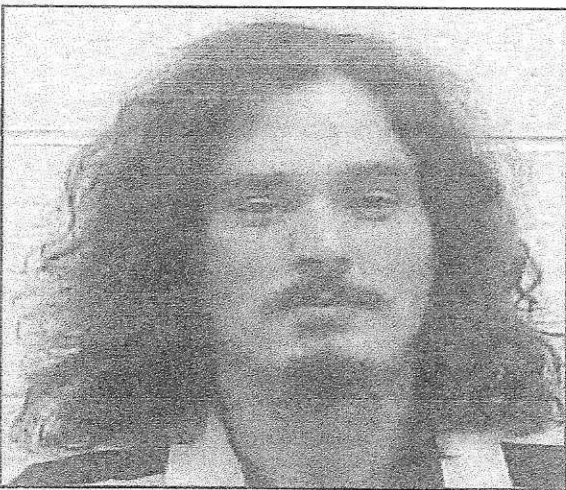

Investment Fraudster Sentenced Adviser Who Claimed to Invest in Fracking Defrauded Unsuspecting Family

When a Montana woman needed legal and financial help selling a family farm, she was introduced through a friend to Michael Van Auken.

He did good work for her and began offering his financial expertise to the rest of her family, having seemingly earned her trust. Van Auken

claimed to be both a lawyer and accountant who could help them invest. He even convinced the Montana woman's parents to invest their entire retirement account with him.

But in reality, Van Auken was neither an accountant nor a lawyer. He simply stole more than \$700,000

from the family between 2011 and 2015.

"He was a good talker and convinced them that he could manage it better and make more money for them," said Special Agent Sara Sampson, who investigated this case out of the FBI's resident agency in

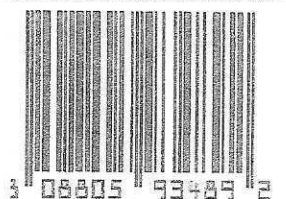

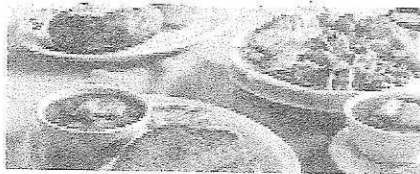
Michael Denny, 42, Shaw Ferry Road Lenoir City, was charged with Aggravated Burglary, Aggravated Assault, Theft of Property x2, and Violation of Order of Protection. Dep. L. Hawkins LCSO was dispatched to Shaw Ferry Road in reference to a physical domestic. Deputy arrived on scene and spoke with the vic-

tim, she stated just before she called 911 her ex-boyfriend, Michael Denny, arrived at her residence and made entry through the back door. Deputy did observe the back door was open, there was no signs of a forced entry, she advised she leaves the door unlocked. He came into the living room where her bed is, and began to take her car keys and her banking cards. In an attempt to stop him, he jumped on the bed with her and held her down. She stated she was in fear so she kicked him in the chest to get him off of her. He landed in the floor, she then grabbed her pepper spray and used it on Mr. Denny to defend herself from further attack. He took the pepper spray away from her and began to spray her with it,

following her into the bedroom continuing to use the pepper spray on her. She then called 911, he heard that she was calling and left the residence taking the keys to her 2002 Chevrolet Taril Blazer Red in color. Victim advised he did leave in that vehicle. She advised Deputy that Mr. Denny appeared to be extremely intoxicated and had been a drug user. He has not lived at the residence since October 25th of 2020 when Mr. Denny was arrested on Domestic charges. Victim also advised she did not consent to let Michael take her vehicle. A temporary order of protection was served on Mr. Denny on 10-20-2020 and is still active with victim being the protected person. This did

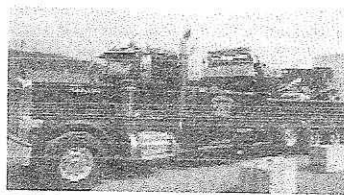

Ronald Simmer, 36, Poland Hollow Harriman, was charged with DUI, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, Violation of Implied Consent, and Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic.

Deputy W. Jenkins LCSO, was on routine patrol on Hwy 321 when he observed a white Honda traveling above the 55 MPH speed limit cross the fog line twice. Upon running the registered owner of the vehicle thru dispatch he came back with a suspended license.

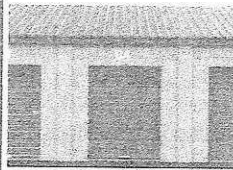

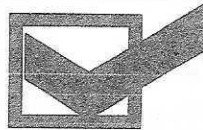

Helena, Montana, which is part of the Salt Lake City Field Office.

Van Auken told the family he planned to invent a new drill bit that would be lucrative for the oil fracking industry and said he'd invest some of their funds in it.

Instead, he spent most of the family's money in foreign currency exchange trading, an extremely risky activity sometimes compared to gambling. He also spent some of the funds on his personal living expenses.

"He was essentially throwing this family's money away, and they gave him more and more over time," Sampson said.

Van Auken created a lengthy paper trail to back up his lies. He told the family their investments were profitable.

But warning signs did start to show. The Montana woman noticed a change in Van Auken's behavior, and he admitted lying to her about some of the investments.

The victim did not know where to turn until a friend encouraged her to contact the FBI.

"The victim in this case was very brave," Sampson said. "She made a mistake in getting Van Auken involved in her family's lives, but she contacted us and saw the case through to the end."

Investigators began digging into the financials and learned that where the actual money went was not consistent with what the documents said.

The family collectively lost more than \$700,000. Much of that was the woman's parents' retirement accounts, and some of the funds belonged

to the original victim herself and her young adult children.

The impact was devastating. While the younger victims will have time to recover financially, the woman's parents are now deceased, and they lost their entire retirement savings. They'd hoped to pass those funds on to their children and grandchildren.

Additionally, Van Auken claimed to be paying taxes on the family's funds, but he never did. So the surviving relatives are also dealing with tax debt, Sampson said.

Van Auken pleaded guilty in January 2020 to wire fraud, money laundering, and filing a false tax return. In May 2020, he was sentenced to 28 months in prison.

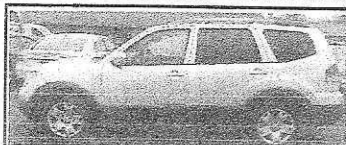
The investigative team, which included FBI agents and forensic accountants as well as partners from the

Internal Revenue Service, wanted to get justice for the family.

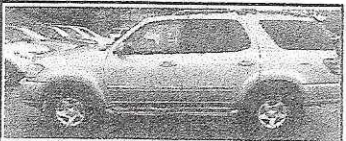
"This wasn't just a small town thing that's going to be swept under the rug," Sampson said. "He committed a crime, and we wanted to bring it to light and make sure it couldn't happen to anyone else."

While anyone investing should do careful research, Sampson pointed out that the victim in this case had done research and was still swindled. The key is to listen to your gut instincts and ask lots of questions.

"The story of this case is that you can be careful, and it can still happen to you," she said. "If it does, don't be embarrassed—report it to law enforcement. It can happen to anyone, and it happens to a lot of people. If we can prevent the person from hurting someone else, we'll do our best to do that."

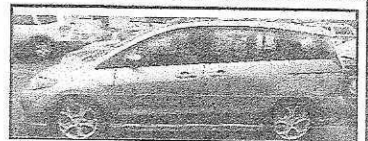

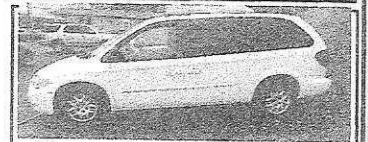

Julie Sliger, 41, Tiberius Road Knoxville, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. III, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Poss. of Drug Para, and Display of Registration Plate.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, conducted a traffic stop on a green in color Honda Civic for a registration violation (no tag on the vehicle). Upon traffic stop Officer made contact with the driver who identified as Ms. Julie Sliger. SLIGER advised she had bought the vehicle from a friend a couple days ago and has still not had time to register it, but was able to provide the vehicle title. During the traffic stop Officer asked SLIGER if she had anything illegal inside of the vehicle, where she stated "no", and gave

permission to search the vehicle. During the search of the vehicle Officer located: (1) Glass pipe with a charred bottom believed to be used to smoke methamphetamines inside of SLIGERS purse. 





Aggravated Assault and More

Troy Cunningham, 28, Canton Hollow Road Knoxville, was charged with Aggravated Assault, Domestic Assault, and Contraband in a Penal Institution.
