

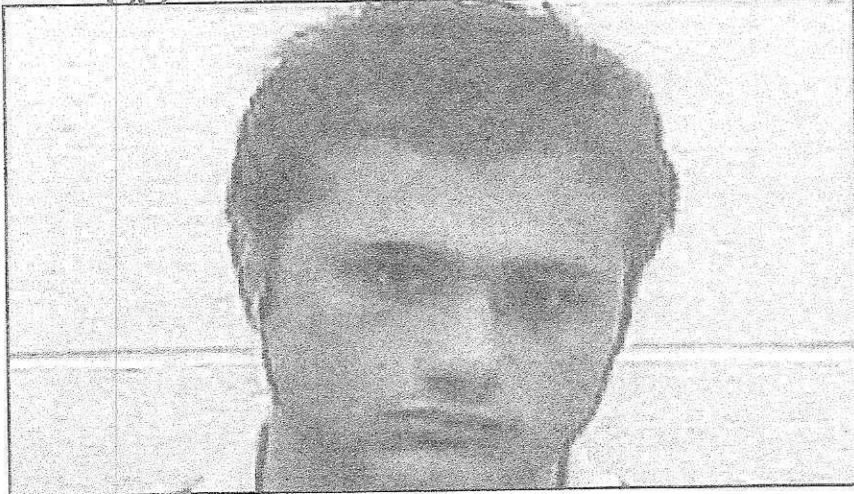

Xanax Found on Shoplifter in LC

Man Who Stole Radiological Devices Sentenced FBI and Phoenix Police Department Successfully Neutralized Dangerous Material

On an early Sunday morning in April 2019, a Phoenix-area man got hold of dangerous radiological materials and was intent on hurting himself and others.

It was a volatile and unique situation, but something that the FBI and local law enforcement had pre-

pared and trained for.

Jared Atkins stole three radiological devices that contained a radioactive substance known as Iridium-192 from his workplace, along with the tools to open the devices and expose substance. The devices would normally be used in a controlled environ-

ment for examining underground pipes.

Uncontrolled, however, this material could be dangerous. Atkins knew this and told his family he was using the material to end his life, knowing he would harm anyone who tried to stop him.

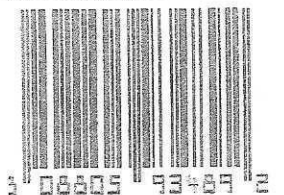
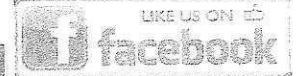

Ethan Howell, 20, Bat Creek Road Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault, Aggravated Assault, and Theft of Property.

Deputies were dispatched to Bat creek Rd. in reference to a physical domestic. Dispatch advised the victim ran outside to call 911 after her boyfriend became irate and threw her the ground with their baby in her arms and threatened to kill her with a knife and a baseball bat. Dispatch advised the victim could not get the baby from the offender and would be waiting at the end of the driveway. Upon arrival Deputies made contact with the victim. She advised Ethan Howell, the offender was inside with a knife high on meth. She was extremely upset and scared and worried

about their baby daughter still inside the residence. Deputy Lane and Deputy Luke Hawkins along with Sgt. Matthew Faigiana advanced the house to attempt to make contact with the offender. After several verbal commands Mr. Howell, came to the door and was detained. Inside the residence was Mr. Howell's grandmother and the child. Child was unharmed. Grandmother, advised victim was holding the baby in the living room after an argument ensued between Mr. Howell and victim when Mr. Howell grabbed the victim by the backpack she was wearing and slung her to the ground, and open hand slapped her in the face. Mr. Howell then walked away when the victim went to get some her stuff in the back room to leave, Mr. Howell

grabbed a knife and said "I will F&^%#*# kill you." As the victim was actively trying to flee the offender picked up a baseball bat and acted like he was going to hit her with it, When the Grandmother told him to leave her alone. The Victim finally got outside when she called 911. The grandmother's statement was all recorded on

Sgt. Matthew Faigiana's body camera. The victim's statement was very consistent with the grandmother's recorded statement. The Victim was offered to be took to a safe place and declined. Mr. Howell was placed into custody and charged with Aggravated Domestic and transported to Loudon County Jail. All said did occur in Loudon County.

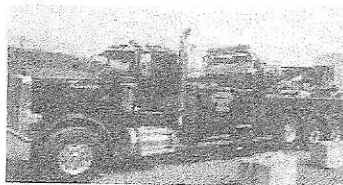

with the radiological material in his car, Atkins went back to his apartment and engaged in a standoff with law enforcement.

“The energy coming from this material is pretty powerful, and everyone on our team wanted to be out there doing what we were trained to do to protect the community from it,” said Special Agent Jay Henze, one of the bomb techs in the FBI Phoenix Field Office at the time.

The situation created a dual challenge: to safely arrest Atkins and to safely contain the material. This required significant coordination and teamwork across agencies.

The investigative team—which included the FBI’s Joint Terrorism Task Force and Phoenix Police Depart-

ment, with support from the FBI Phoenix Stabilization Task Force and laboratory and intelligence analysts—set up a command post at a nearby fire station and came up with a plan. First, they had to verify the radiological material was in Atkins’ car. Bomb techs broke the window of the car and verified all three devices were there.

After consulting with experts at the U.S. Department of Energy and other scientists, bomb techs then used specialized equipment to secure the material. The devices were then sent to a laboratory for analysis and evidence preservation.

After a two-hour standoff, the Phoenix Police Department and the FBI convinced Atkins to surrender.

Atkins pleaded guilty to weapons of mass destruction charges and was sentenced in March to 15 years in prison.

Critical to the successful outcome was the fact that FBI Phoenix and the Phoenix Police Department had a long history of working together and training for a scenario like this one. The FBI Phoenix Stabilization Task Force—stabilization is the term for neutralizing the threat of a radiological device—had been preparing for this since 2012. They had thought through similar scenarios and prepared equip-

ment and plans to respond.


“We had training for this from scientists who make this equipment and who know all about radiation and how it works. We had some of the best training you could get on how to handle radiological materials,” Henze said. “Almost eight years of preparation helped us to be successful on game day.”







Mary Presley, 50, Corinth Church Road Loudon, was charged with General Session Capias, Criminal Trespass, and Theft of Property.

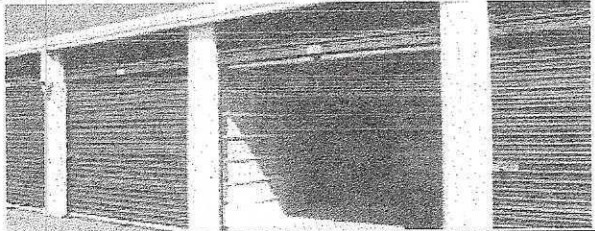

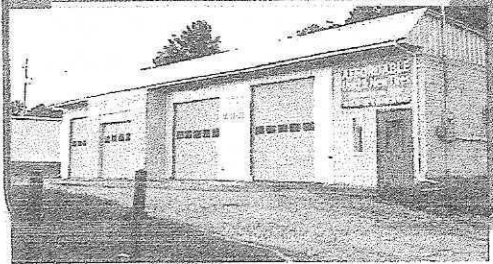
