



Victim left for about an hour and tried to find a hotel room but stated that she could not find an empty one around due to the football game so she returned home. Officers went in the residence and made contact with Potter and took him into custody without incident. Officers noticed a numerous amount of firearms distributed around the house and seized all the weapons that they could locate.



Thomas Childress, 24, Buttermilk Road Lenoir City, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy Jenkins Clav LCSO, responded to Buttermilk Rd in reference to a burglary in progress. Upon arrival, Deputy then made contact with victim who advised his son Thomas Austin Childress had broken into the house through the back door. While in fear, victim then locked himself in his room and barricaded the door. He advised that Thomas Childress then attempted to break down the door to his room to get to him but could not get it opened. This was the third response to the address for the day for a domestic situation. Victim also advised that Thomas had made suicidal threats earlier in the day and had been

off of his medication for five weeks. Deputy observed the back door to be damaged from forced entry to the residence.
