Former PTO Co-Presidents Stole from Glencliff Elementary PTO

Couple indicted by the Davidson County Grand Jury

by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Phillip Nickins and Griselda Castaneda-Camacho (aka Grace Nickins). Nickins and Castaneda-Camacho served as co-presidents of the Glencliff Elementary School Parent Teacher Organization (PTO)

investigation for the 2017-2018 PTO by utilizing the school-year.

The Comptroller's Office began its investigation after PTO officials reported that funds had been misappropriated from the PTO bank account.

Investigators determined that Nickins and Castaneda-Camacho stole at least \$7,818.94 from the

following schemes:

A PTO debit card was used to make unauthorized ATM cash withdrawals totaling at least \$3,789.38. This amount also includes overdraft fees ATM usage fees.

Officer Lankford LPD, received a call of a domestic disturbance at vale st Lot C in the city of Loudon upon arrival spoke to complainant who stated around 5:30 pm she received a call from her husband a Jimmy Gibson who stated the kids had destroyed the house and he taught them a lesson. Complainant stated she hurried home from work as quickly as possible to find her husband Jimmy Gibson intoxicated and that he had struck there Nine year old child on his right buttock causing severe bruising and visable marks. Jimmy Gibson also struck there twelve year old son about the face and head area causing redness.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, responded to 911 Highway 321 (WalMart) in Lenoir City, TN, in reference to a male subject who caught by loss prevention employees shoplifting on two separate occasions today. Prior to arrival dispatch advised that the male subject that was caught by loss prevention had fled from them at which time they stated the male got into a white in color Uhaul Van and left WalMart property. While in the area officers were able to locate the Uhaul Van in the Food City parking lot, the van was left unattended and locked. While observing the vehicle and its contents from the outside

Officer noticed in plain view a gray in color Reebox backpack was sitting inside of the van that the male subject was seen leaving the store with along with a white hoodie.

Shortly after staging in the area of the van Officer located a male subject matching the description of the shoplifter, shorts with a green stripe, white shoes, and a gold necklace. Officer approached the male and gave several commands to stop and to come here. The male then fled on foot where Officer followed after, crossing over Highway 321 into the parking lot of Zaxbvs where he was then placed in custody.

Once in custody a key that belonged to the Uhaul was located in the males pocket. During the investigation the name of Anthony Moss was given from the male in custody. We confirmed that was

not his name or information. The prisoner stated that he gave his bothers name and D.O.B and that his name was Kenneth Moss. Once WalMart checked his name through their system they advised that KENNETH was criminally trespassed from

all WalMart property from a prior theft incident. The total amount of items stolen came out to be \$245.00 in US currency. During the investigation KENNETH advised that he stole the items to get gas money to return back to Knoxville, TN.



least \$617.75 using the PTO's debit card. These purchases included many items such as women's clothing, a child's car seat, fast food, online gaming items, and pharmaceutical products.

The couple failed to account for \$3,411.81 in PTO sales from a chocolate fundraiser. The fundraiser had the potential for gross sales of at least \$13,320 but only \$9,908.19 was deposited into the PTO's bank account.

The investigative report also reveals that Castaneda-Camacho presented a falsified bank document to school officials in an attempt to conceal the misappropriation. The fictitious document on bank letterhead claimed that a bank error had resulted in the PTO's account being merged with the couple's personal account. Bank personnel confirmed the letter was fraudulent.

In September 2021, Phillip

Nickins (aka Phillip Nickens) and Griselda Castaneda-Camacho were each indicted by the Davidson County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$2,500, and one count of credit card fraud over \$2,500.

"School support organizations often fall victim to theft," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "In nearly every case, parent volunteers are trusted to handle money without adequate oversight. School support groups are required to implement basic controls to safeguard funds and property.



kept reaching for the center console and the floor board and stated all Officer have is a roach.


