

Troy Jamerson, 48, County Road Etowah, was charged with Violation of Probation x2, and Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth.

Deputy Green LCSO, responded to Hwy 72 S. in reference to a stolen motorcycle. Deputy spoke with the complainant, which stated he let a subject by the name of Troy Jamerson test drive the motorcycle approximately 5 hours prior and he had not returned and was unable to reach him via phone. While gathering information victim was notified by a friend that Mr. Jamerson had called and advised he had ran out of gas at the 72 Market & Deli. Deputy requested warrant checks through dispatch which advised Mr. Jamerson had two active warrants out of Loudon County for Violation Of Probation (Original Charges: Simple Possession

and Possession of Meth) Deputy responded to the 72 Market and Deli and made contact with Mr. Jamerson inside the store and verified his information. Deputy took Mr. Jamerson into custody. Deputy asked Mr. Jamerson if he had any illegal contraband on his person in which he advised he had a pipe and a small amount of Meth. Upon search of Mr. Jamerson Deputy recovered a small black case in his front left pocket containing a small baggie with a crystal like substance believed to be Methamphetamine which weighed approximately .8 grams (Substance is awaiting test from the TruNarc device). Deputy transported Mr. Jamerson to Loudon County Jail where he served both warrants and charged him with Possession of Methamphetamine. All the above did occur in Loudon County, TN.



Chalice Bowman, 21, Carousel Road Chattanooga, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Vandalism, Open Container, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Simple Possession

Deputies with LCSO, were dispatched to a reckless driver on 175 NB. Deputy C Gray and, Deputy C Rogers, observed the suspect vehicle and the complainant exit at the 81mm. Upon contact with the driver, Ms. Chalice Bowman, Deputy smelled a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the offender's person. Ms. Bowman was not forthcoming with questions regarding the manner of her driving or current circumstance.

Deputy Gray observed a marijuana roach in the passenger seat while Deputy was speaking to the offender. Deputy then had Ms. Bowman exit the vehicle at which time she

did consent to SFST/ARIDE testing. Ms. Bowman did show clues of impairment and was taken into custody. Upon the probable cause search of the vehicle, Deputies recovered 1 gram of marijuana, multiple marijuana apparatus, a bag of marijuana seeds, and a flask with a liquid that smelled like an alcoholic beverage.

Deputy did supply and read TN Implied Consent to the offender and Ms. Bowman continuously spoke over him and refused to answer. Ms. Bowman was transported to the Loudon County Jail by Deputy C Lane and during the transportation, the offender tore off an interior light inside the vehicle and damaged the partition within the vehicle. Ms. Bowman was also charged with Simple Possession, Vandalism and cited with Open Container, Drug Paraphernalia, and Violation of Implied Consent. Said did occur in Loudon County, TN.
