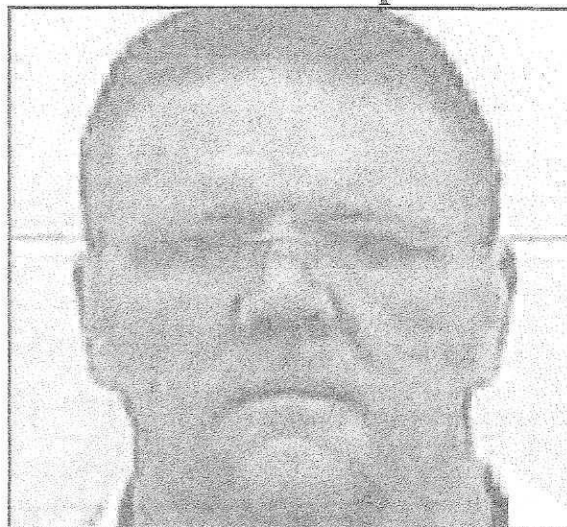

## Studies Show More COVID-19 Cases in Areas Without School Masking Policies

CDC released three studies in the Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR) that highlight the importance of using layered prevention strategies including universal masking to stop the spread and minimize disruptions to school operations for safe in-person education. These studies

found that school districts without a universal masking policy in place were more likely to have COVID-19 outbreaks. Nationwide, counties without masking requirements saw the number of pediatric COVID-19 cases increase nearly twice as quickly during this same period.

One report from Arizona revealed that schools in two of the state's most populous counties were 3.5 times more likely to have COVID-19 outbreaks if they did not have a mask requirement at the start of school compared with schools that required

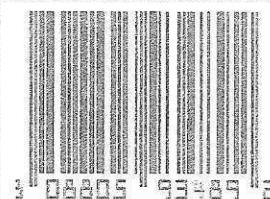

## DUI+

Haleigh Kressin, 30, Jade Lane Oak Ridge, was charged with DUI, Violation Implied Consent, and Child Endangerment x2.

Dep. L. Hawkins LCSO, was dispatched to a reckless driver on Interstate 75 Northbound. Two callers advised a Kia Optima, silver or tan in color, was traveling Northbound on I-75 failing to maintain it's lane and driving off the roadway. Deputy entered I-75 at the 72 mile marker and observed the described vehicle traveling Northbound.

The vehicle was crossing the inside yellow line and jerking back into its lane in an aggressive manner. As Deputy approached the Tennessee River Bridge, the vehicle crossed the inside yellow line once more

and nearly struck the barrier where it connects to the bridge. Deputy initiated a traffic stop on a 2015 Kia Optima TN Temporary registration, QN8HECY, on I-75 Northbound at the 75.2 mile marker. The vehicle slowed down to approximately 40 mph, then it turned off the roadway into the median.

Due to the extremely unsafe location the vehicle stopped at, Dep. C. Rogers assisted him by blocking the left lane of traffic. Deputy approached the vehicle and made contact with the driver, Haleigh Brooke Kressin. She appeared disoriented, and was unsure what was happening. Deputy asked her where she was coming from, she advised, "Georgia, I'm just trying to get home." Deputy noticed she

had two children in the back seat of her vehicle. Six year-old and two year-old, both her daughters. Deputy could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle, she had glossy/bloodshot eyes and was slurring her words. Dep. Rogers advised me he could see individual wine bottles in the passenger floor board.

Mrs. Kressin consented to S.F.S.T. and preformed unsatisfactory. She was then placed into custody and read the Blood and/or Breath Consent Advisement. She refused to provide a sample. Based on the observation of Mrs. Kressin's driving, S.F.S.T., and my training and experience, Deputy believed her to be under the influence of alcohol. Mrs. Kressin was read her Miranda Rights, and asked, "Do you believe you're too intoxicated to be

driving?" She replied, "No." She then continued to thank me for stopping her, saying "Everything happens for a reason." Haleigh Kressin created an extremely dangerous environment in which her two children were in.

During an inventory of the vehicle, 2 four-pack Sutter Home wine cases were found in the passenger floor board, and the one lid that appeared to belong to the same bottles was found in the driver side floor board. Four of the eight bottles were missing. An empty one was found in the back passenger seat, under car seat.

The juveniles were transported to The Loudon County Sheriff's Office to be picked up by a friend of Mrs. Kressin. The friend arrived to took custody of the two juveniles.

All the above did occur in Loudon County, Tennessee.

universal masking on day one. Universal masking is an important component in the recommended layered prevention strategy for schools, and this study continues to demonstrate that facemasks when used as part of the larger strategy can reduce spread of COVID-19 and prevent outbreaks in schools.

Another report found that during the two weeks following the start of school, the average change in pediatric COVID-19 case rates was lower among counties with school mask requirements (16.32 per 100,000/day) compared with counties without school mask requirements (34.85 cases per 100,000/day). This highlights the impact that universal masking policies can have on the communities that sur-

round these school districts, as the impact of the policies can reduce the burden on the health care systems that support these school districts.

A third report studied COVID-19-related school closures and found that despite an estimated 1,801 school closures so far this school year, 96% of public schools have been able to remain open for full in-person learning. The continued focus on providing students with a safe environment for in-person learning is one of the main priorities for CDC's guidance, and can be best achieved by following a layered prevention strategy.

These studies continue to demonstrate the importance and effectiveness of CDC's Guidance for COVID-19 Prevention in K-12 Schools

to help districts ensure safer in-person learning and stop the spread of COVID-19. Promoting vaccination of eligible persons, mask wearing, and screening testing are all proven methods to continue to work towards the end of the COVID-19 pandemic.

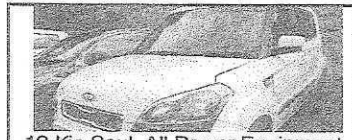

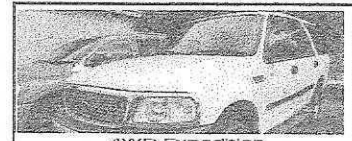

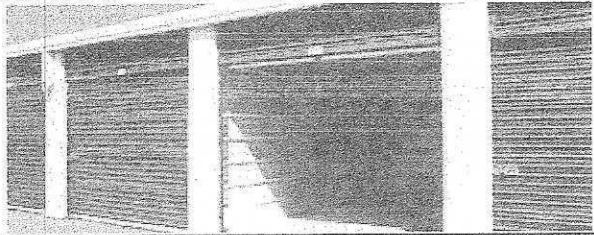

Steven Birchfield, 51, Craigs Chapel Road Lenoir City, was charged with Mfg/Sell/Poss. Of Controlled Substance x 4, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Investigators and deputies with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office conducted a traffic stop on Steven Ray Birchfield's vehicle for prior knowledge of Birchfield having an active warrant for his arrest. Deputies located Birchfield as the passenger in the vehicle and female as the driver. Birchfield was taken into custody and searched incident to arrest. In Birchfield's wallet was a baggy containing gray powder which later tested positive as Heroin and Fentanyl Compound (Schedule I). Deputies located \$660 in US currency was located inside the wallet which was comingled with recorded con-

trolled buy funds and seized. Birchfield was transported to the Loudon County Jail. Investigators obtained written consent to search female and Birchfield's residence from female. Approximately 0.44 grams of methamphetamine, 8 separate bags of marijuana and a marijuana cigarette totaling 14.49 grams, five 1 mg Clonazepam pills, three 1 mg Alprazolam pills, two 2 mg Clonazepam pills totaling 9 Schedule IV pills, a magnetic box with meth residue, four glass meth pipes, two digital scales with meth residue, 8 long guns and several boxes of ammunition were found during the search of the residence. Birchfield is charged with Man/Sale/Del or Poss of Schedule I Heroin, Man/Sale/Del or Poss of Schedule VI Marijuana, Man/Sale/Del or Poss of Schedule IV, Possession of Methamphetamine and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. This happened in Loudon County, TN.
