



Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 and Adesa Blvd in Lenoir City, TN. While in the area Officer observed a silver in color Chrysler 200 that was driven by Devin Kelley of Lenoir City whom Officer knew from prior knowledge was driving on a revoked license status. Officer was confirmed that KELLEY was driving on revoked for DUI. Officer then conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle in the parking lot of the Kings Inn, in Lenoir City.

Upon making contact with the vehicle Officer noticed a strong odor of marijuana coming form inside of the vehicle. KELLEY stated that he may have a gram or two of marijuana somewhere inside of the vehicle. A probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted where Officer located a green bag in the back seat of the vehicle. The contents of the bag revealed, 22.74 grams of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana, a digital scale, several empty baggies believed to be used to package marijuana for resale, and a marijuana grinder. KELLEY stated the bag and its contents did not belong to him, but stated that the marijuana roaches located in the same bag did belong to him. David Hardy,34, Oostanali Road Loudon, was charged with Prohibited Weapon, DUI, Driving on Suspended Revoked License, Simple Possession, and Implied Consent.

Dep. L. Hawkins LCSO,

was dispatched to Ford road in reference to a wreck with injury. Deputy arrived on scene and spoke with David Hardy, the driver of the 2015 Toyota Camry that had been wrecked. He advised Deputy he was traveling down Ford road when he left the roadway to the right and crashed into the ditch. The odor of an alcoholic beverage was coming from his person, Deputy asked if he had had any alcoholic beverages today and he advised yes. He drank three beers and a shot of liquor. Deputy asked for his consent to preform S.F.S.T. and he denied. He then stated, "Let's just get on with this." Based on my training, experience and observation of Mr. Hardy, Deputy believed him to be under the influence. He

was placed into custody and read his Miranda Rights. He agreed to continue to answer questions and Deputy asked him, "Do you think you were too impaired to drive today?" and he responded, "Yes." Deputy read the Blood Breath Consent Advisement form to Mr. Hardy and he refused to provide a sample. The Loudon County Dispatch advised me Mr. Hardy's Driver License status was Revoked for DUI as well. Mr. Hardy requested me to give his property to his friends on scene, his property was in the pockets of his pants. While retrieving his property, metal knuckles were found in his left pocket. Mr. Hardy confirmed they were his. Dep. B. Pesterfield was conducting a vehicle inventory of his vehicle and 6.9 GM of marijuana was found in the center con-sole. Mr. Hardy confirmed the marijuana was his. While asking Mr. Hardy if the marijuana belonged to him Deputy asked, "Did you smoke any marijuana today?" and he replied, "Yes."







prescriptions were not legitimate. The United States alleged that the types of red flags that Olive Street and Shlafshteyn ignored included clear instances of tampering with written prescriptions; dangerous combinations of drugs commonly sought after for recreational purposes; and amounts of opioids that exceeded CDC guidance by as much as 17.5 times the recommended maximum daily dosage.

In the complaint, the United States further accused Olive Street of routinely dispensing prescriptions for Subsys, an oral fentanyl spray, which is subject to heightened FDA restrictions and indicated only for opioid-tolerant patients experiencing breakthrough pain due to cancer. The United States contended that Olive Street and Shlafshteyn knowingly dispensed high dosages of Subsys to patients who did not qualify for the drug, and that the vast majority of the Subsys

Olive Street dispensed was prescribed by Philip Dean, Dean, a Warrenton, M.D. Missouri neurologist, pleaded guilty to illegally distributing prescription opioids in 2018, including to women with whom he had lived and with whom he had had personal relationships.

The United States alleged that even though Shlafshteyn knew Dean was having intimate relationships at least one of the women for whom he was prescribing controlled substances, Shlafshteyn and others at her direction continued to dispense Dean's controlled substance prescriptions to that patient and to other patients of Dean. Further, according to the civil complaint, as the managing employee of Ol-ive Street, Shlafshteyn had the control and authority to effect compliance with the FCA and CSA.

According to the settlement agreement, effective September 30, 2021, Shlafshteyn surrendered her Mis-

souri pharmacy technician license and Olive Street terminated its enrollment in the Transmucosal Immediate Release Fentanyl Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy (TIRF REMS) Program, the FDA-mandated program that had allowed Olive Street to dispense immediate-release fentanyl drugs like Subsys. The parties further agreed to enter into a consent decree of permanent injunction pro-

hibiting Shlafshteyn from participating in the dispensing of controlled substances or being employed by any establishment that does so, prohibiting Olive Street from seeking enrollment in the TIRF REMS Program, and detailing many additional specific parameters limiting the circumstances under which Olive Street is permitted to continue dispensing controlled substances.




Agg. Assault

While enroute, Loudon County Dispatch advised a females brother and husband had been in an argument and her brother attacked her husband with a machete. Once Deputy arrived on scene, Officer Espinoza and Deputy Mills were speaking with the victim, who had lacerations to both hands. The victims wife, stated that her husband arrived at the residence after getting beer and her brother, Walsre Herrera, came out of the bedroom with a machete and began to swing it at the victim cutting a beer can out

of his hand. The two then struggled over the machete at which point Herrera pinned victim to a chair in the living room pressing the machete to his throat stating he was going to kill him. The struggle continued to the front porch of the residence at which time victim told his son to call 911. Herrera then grabbed the machete and threw it in the woods where it was later located.
