



Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 and Interstate 40 in Lenoir City, TN. While in the area Officer observed a black in color Lincoln sedan with the Tennessee Registration that displayed (Y3882L). While behind the vehicle Officer noticed that the sticker on the plate displaying the year was unreadable. Officer ran the registration where dispatch advised that the registration expired in March of 2020. Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle in the area of Interstate 40 near mile marker 346.2 where Officer confirmed that the year sticker on the vehicle was altered Contact was made with two subjects the driver was from Crossville, TN, driver, and Jennifer Watson of Rockwood, TN, passenger. While speaking with both subjects WATSON stated that she was wanted out of Loudon County, TN for narcotic charges. Officer had WATSON step

out of the vehicle where he conducted a warrant check on both her and WALKER. through TUR NARC.

A probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted where (2) digital scales that had a crystal like residue located on them, (1) red cut straw with a crystal like substance inside of it, (2) red rubber containers that had a crystal like substance inside of them, and several needles. All items were located in the passengers side of the vehicle. The two red rubber containers were located in the back floor board of the vehicle.

Dispatch confirmed that WATSON had a FTA Capias Warrant out of Loudon County, TN and also advised that she had an active warrant out of Roane County, TN. WALKER also had an active warrant out of Roane County. During the investigation WATSON appeared extremely nervous where Officer Ketner asked if she would grab her purse out of the vehicle. In plain view of WATSON'S purse was a clear needle cap with a crystal like substance inside of it that tested positive for methamphetamines (0.75 Grams)
