Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a patrol in the area of 911 Highway 321 (WalMart) in Lenoir City, TN. While in the area Officer observed a black in color Dodge Charger with dark window tint to the point that you could not see into the vehicle. Officer conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle where the windows registered at 1%. Upon traffic stop Officer made contact with, Kristopher Daniel, driver and Melinda Carmichael, passenger. Prior to the traffic stop Officer had confirmed that DANIEL'S

license status was suspended through the Tennessee Portol when the registration was ran. Officer had DAN-IEL step out of the vehicle to speak to him about a citation. While speaking with DANIEL he stated that he was currently on probation for a drug paraphernalia charge. Officer then asked if he had anything illegal inside of the vehicle at which time he stated he had some "riggs" that he uses for methamphetamines. DAN-IELS retrieved the needles and handed them to Officer. DANIEL'S also mentioned prior to searching the vehicle that he had a "friend" who had left a zipper coin bag inside of his vehicle. Prior to the search CARMI-CHAEL was asked to step out of the vehicle where she had a small zipper coin bag. She handed the bag to Officer J. Ketner, where he located three individual baggies containing a crystal like substance that tested

positive for methamphetamines through TRU NARC (11.37 Grams). Also located inside of the zipper coin bag were two empty "dime bags", one matching the rest of the empty un-used "dime baggies" that were located inside of the center console of the vehicle. Inside of the center console were (100) one-hundred un-used "dime bags". Based off of Officer training and experience the un-used new "dime baggies" located inside of the vehicle along with the 11.37 grams of methamphetamines show indicators of the resale of illegal narcotics.



CHP is a competitive award program intended to reduce crime and advance public safety through community policing. CHP provides funds directly to law enforcement agencies to hire new or rehire additional career law enforcement officers, thereby increasing their community policing capacity and crime prevention efforts. Of the 183 agencies awarded grants today, approximately half will use the funding to focus on building legitimacy and trust between law enforcement and communities: 41 agencies will seek to address high rates of gun violence; 21 will focus on other areas of violence; and 19 will focus CHP resources on combating hate and domestic extremism or supporting police-based responses to persons in crisis. Since its creation in 1994. COPS has invested more than \$14 billion to advance community policing, including grants awarded to more than 13,000 state, local and Tribal law enforcement agencies to fund the hiring and redeployment of more than 135,000 officers. CHP, COPS' flagship program, continues to be in demand today: In FY21, COPS received 590 applications requesting nearly 3,000 law enforcement positions. For FY22, President Biden has requested \$537 million for CHP, an increase of \$300

million.
