FBI leaders recently recognized the alumni association's 58 chapters and their uniquely local efforts to help their neighbors while also helping the FBI carrying out its mission to protect and serve.

"Everything the FBI is trying to accomplish depends upon having the trust and support of the American people," FBI Deputy Director Paul Abbate said at the group's annual conference in Las Vegas in September.
