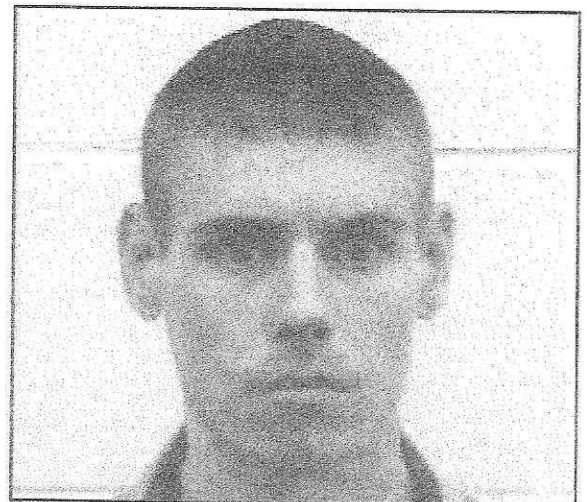

DUI Charge Follows Wreck in Loudon County

Former Rhea County Nonprofit Employee Indicted for Theft

Reynaldo Rivera worked for Rhea of Sunshine, Inc.

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Reynaldo Rivera, a former maintenance technician for Rhea of Sunshine, Inc.

Rhea of Sunshine (ROS) is a nonprofit located in Dayton, Tennessee that provides programs for individuals with intel-

lectual and development disabilities. It is primarily supported by public funds received from the Tennessee Department of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities. ROS owns multiples homes and vehicles to help serve its clients; ROS staff are responsible for maintaining and repairing them.

Investigators determined that Rivera used ROS funds to purchase vehicle parts for his personal use totaling at least \$11,871.

Rivera used the nonprofit's O'Reilly Auto Parts and Advance Auto Parts vendor accounts to purchase the parts for his personal vehicles and his pri-

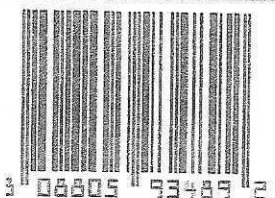

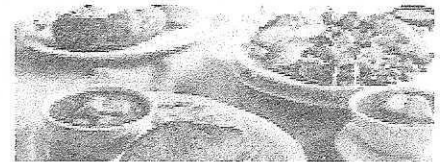

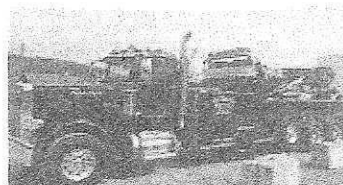

DUI

Karen Nelson, 61, Church Street Loudon, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent.

Deputy Green LCSO, responded to a report of a wreck at the intersection of Old Stage Road and Hwy 11 involving two vehicles. Deputy arrived on scene and spoke with both subjects involved. The complainant, advised he was stopped at the stop sign at the intersection behind several vehicles and the driver of the Buick, Karen Nelson, failed to stop and collided with the trailer hitch of his vehicle.

Deputy spoke with Ms. Nelson which had a very slowed and slurred speech. Ms. Nelson had difficulty answering basic questions and retrieving her documents and was unusually emotional. Deputy released complainant from the scene due to there being no vehicle damage. Deputy asked Ms. Nelson to exit the vehicle in which she agreed. As Ms. Nelson exited the vehicle she was very unsteady on

her feet. Ms. Nelson stated she had just left Jets Pizza where she consumed 3 or 4 alcoholic beverages in the span of 2-3 hours. Deputy requested Ms. Nelson to perform Standard Field Sobriety and ARIDE testing in which she agreed. Ms. Nelson was unable to follow instructions on all tests and stated she was unable to perform the "Walk and Turn" and "One Leg Stand" after several failed attempts.

Ms. Nelson did give indications of impairment during ARIDE Testing. Deputy took Ms. Nelson into custody for driving under the influence. Deputy requested a blood sample for chemical testing in which Ms. Nelson initially agreed. Ms. Nelson was transported to Fort Loudon Medical Center and upon arrival Ms. Nelson did refuse to sign the blood draw consent form provided by the ER Staff. Ms. Nelson was then transported to Loudon County Jail without incident where she was charged with driving under the influence and violation of implied consent. All the above did occur in Loudon County.

vate automotive repair business. For example, Rivera purchased multiple parts for a Chevrolet El Camino, which he was personally restoring.

The investigation also reveals that Rivera misused ROS's tax-exempt certificate when he made personal purchases. Rivera failed to pay at least \$1,157 in sales taxes.

Rivera admitted to purchasing vehicle parts for his personal use without the knowledge of his supervisor. He resigned from his position on January 23, 2019, prior to the start of the investigation.

In June 2021, Reynaldo Rivera was indicted by the Rhea County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$10,000.

"All Tennessee nonprofits, and especially ones receiving public money, must ensure they are taking steps to prevent fraud, waste, and abuse," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "While our investigators found several deficiencies in this case, a major problem was allowing

the former maintenance technician to order, charge, and accept delivery of auto parts without sufficient review of invoices."

The vehicle was swerving in his lane and made an abrupt lane change without signaling, which caused Deputy to brake to keep from hitting him. Deputy performed a traffic stop on the vehicle in

the parking lot of Gondolier on Hwy. 321 and identified the driver as Mr. Robert Tillery Jr., the offender. Deputy noticed the offender had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person.

Deputy asked the offender to step out of the vehicle when he noticed he had watery eyes, dilated pupils, and slurred speech. The offender was also unsteady on his feet. Deputy asked the offender how much he drank, to which he initially stated none but later said he had a few. Deputy asked the offender to perform standardized field sobriety testing, to which he agreed. The offender performed poorly on all tests given. Deputy placed the offender in custody and read him the TN implied consent form, to which he agreed to supply a blood sample for testing.

Deputy transported the offender to Fort Loudoun Medical Center, where the blood draw was conducted. Deputy then transported the offender to the Loudon County Jail.
