Brown conspired with others, used deception to obtain unauthorized control over more than \$600K of the 76 year old victim. The victim resides in Lenoir City, she was told she had won the Golden Casket Lottery worth over 3.5 mil-

lion. Victim was instructed to mail or wire money to various locations eventually totaling over \$600K.The victim was told she needed to pay \$150K, and to make 2 packages with \$75K in each

Then on 10/22/21 she would meet someone at the Lenoir City Walmart parking lot to transfer the cash packages, by this time the victim realized she was part of a lottery scam. Victim prepared 2 packages but did not put any money in them. Brown flew in from Jamaica on 10/20/21 he drove from Florida to Lenoir City with Marklyn Forrester. A man known as Richard arranged for another person to meet with victim to pick up the package. They were then to meet with Brown and Forrester at the Walmart parking then phoned the co-conspira- McFarlane. tors to help arrange the cash parking lot and watched as ment.

Dakota Giles, 22, Deck Road Crossville, was charged with Mfg Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Driving on Revoked/Suspended License, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 and Interstate 40 in Lenoir City, TN. While in the area Officer observed a gray in color Ford Ranger disregard the stop sign at Loves Truck Stop where it entered onto Highway 321 failing to yield to the right-away of traffic. Officer conducted a traffic stop on the pickup on the Interstate 40 WB ramp in Lenoir City, where Offi-

cer made contact with the driver, Dakota Giles, of Crossville, TN and the passenger, Rachel Garland, of Rockford, TN. Upon his initial approach to the vehicle Officer noticed that GILES appeared extremely nervous, fidgefy, and short spoken. While speaking with GILES he stated that he did not have a valid license and stated that he may have a warrant out of Blount County, TN. Officer had GILES step out of the vehicle to speak with him about his license and the possible warrant, during this time dispatch confirmed that GILES had a revoked license. When GILES stepped out of the vehicle Officer noticed several

empty "dime bags" and what he believed was a glass pipe used to smoke methamphetamines'. When asked about the paraphernalia, GILES stated that he had some "dope" in a glasses container on the drivers side of the pickup. GILES was detained and GARLAND was asked to step out of the vehicle. Located during a probable cause search of the vehicle was, (3.52 grams) of a crystal like substance that tested positive for methamphetamines through TRUNARC. (1) one bong used to

some methamphetamines, (1)one glass pipe used to smoke methamphetamines, (1) one blue glass pipe with marijuana residue and (6)six empty "dime bags". Located in the bed of the pickup was a green zipper pouch that contained (9)nine needles and (2) two cut straws that matched the same straw that was later located in GILES pocket once in custody. Both the bong and glass pipe were located in the passengers side floor board of the vehicle under Garland's feet.

Amber Scott, 26, Park Street New Port, KY was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Simple Possession, Poss. Of Drug Para., Public Intoxication, Contraband in a Penal Institution, Criminal Impersonation, and Prevention or Obstruction of Service.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, responded to 911 Highway 321 (WalMart) in Lenoir City, TN, in reference to a welfare check on two individuals that were passed out inside of a gray in color Honda Accord. On scene Officer made contact with the vehicle in question, in row 10. While observing the vehicle Officer noticed a male passenger and a female driver slumped over in their seats. Officer spoke with the driver who gave the name of, Dnisha. Driver who appeared lethargic and pale in color stated that they had been in the parking lot for around two hours. While speaking with the driver Officer noticed several needle caps inside of the vehicle. when asked about the needle caps the driver stated that she uses needles to inject methamphetamines.

During investigation with

the driver, Officer Ketner, detained the passenger David Messer due to his disruptive and aggressive behavior after locating drug paraphernalia. During the detaning of MESSER, the driver who gave the name of, Dnisha, fled on foot in the WalMart parking lot. Officer followed the female subject on a short foot pursuit where she was taken down to the ground and quickly placed her into custody.

The female subject that gave the name of, Dnisha, was positively identified as Amber Scott of Kentucky. SCOTT was mirandized where she stated that she lied about her name due to warrants. SCOTT also stated that when she arrived at WalMart she used Heroin. While at the jail (1) one baggie of a crystal like substance (1.19 Grams) believed to be methamphetamines along with (1)one baggie of a brown powder like substance (0.96 Grams) believed to be heroin was located inside of SCOTT'S pants by a female Loudon County Jailer. Located in the vehicle during the probable cause search was an empty "dime bag" and a spoon with cotton and residue on it.
