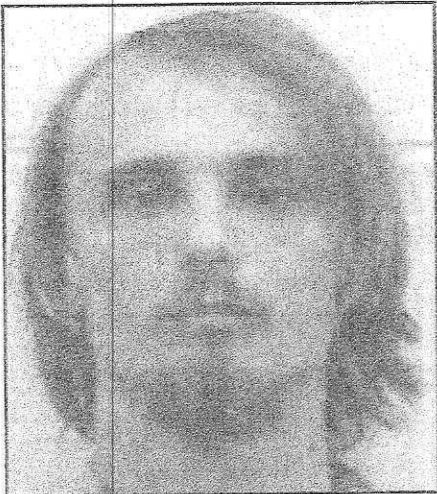

Alleged MS-13 Leader Added to FBI's Ten Most Wanted Fugitives List

Yulan Adonay Archaga Carias, aka Alexander Mendoza and "Porky," Is Wanted on Racketeering, Gun, and Drug Charges

The alleged leader of the violent MS-13 transnational criminal organization for all of Honduras has been added to the FBI's Ten Most Wanted Fugitives list. The FBI is offering a reward of up to \$100,000 for information leading directly to his arrest.

Yulan Adonay Archaga Carias, also

known as Alexander Mendoza and "Porky," has been charged in the Southern District of New York with racketeering conspiracy, possession of machine guns, and cocaine importation conspiracy. "He's wanted for, among other crimes, facilitating the transportation of multi-ton loads of

cocaine through Honduras into the United States, as well as possession and conspiracy to possess machine guns that were used by gang members to support international drug trafficking," said Supervisory Special Agent Nick Durgin.

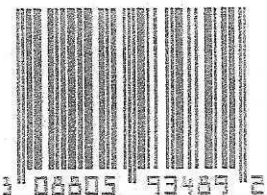

Christian Barnes, 25, Carding Machine Road Loudon, was charged with General Session Capias, Illegal Possession/Fraudulent use of Credit Card.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, observed a white in color Chevy Silverado with the Tennessee Registration of CWV210 traveling south on Highway 321 in Lenoir City, TN. Officer had know from prior knowledge that the pickup had been used in a crime that occurred in Lenoir City days prior. Officer conducted a traffic stop on the pickup in the parking lot of Tractor Supply in Lenoir City for the display of regis-

tration. Registration on the pickup came back to a Mitsubishi sedan. Upon traffic stop Officer made contact with, Huston Monger, Driver, Christian Barnes, passenger, and a female passenger. Officer had MONGER step out of the vehicle due to his extreme nervousness and the registration not coming back to the vehicle. While speaking with MONGER, Officer asked him if he mind to empty his pockets at which time he did. MONGER stated that he had a "marijuana blunt" at which point he handed it to the officer (0.54 Grams). Also located in his jacket pocket was a black container that had (2) Glass pipes believed to be used to smoke methamphetamines, (1) Cut plastic pen with a crystal like residue inside of it and (1) Baggie containing a crystal like substance that tested positive for methamphetamines through TRU

NARC (0.54 Grams). During the probable cause search of the vehicle, MONGER stated that he had a handgun in the tool-box of the pickup, which he stated was located inside of his backpack. Located was a Smith and Wesson SD40 VE. During the investigation dispatch advised that

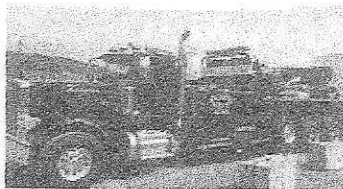

Deputy Rodriguez, observed a black Nissan Sentra traveling Eastbound on Highway 70 with a license plate light out. Deputy conducted a traffic stop with the vehicle using his emergency equipment on Highway 70 at Shipley Lane. Deputy made

contact with Jennifer Hyde, driver/arrestee, who had started acting nervous-like. Deputy asked Ms. Hyde to step out of the vehicle as he conducted his investigation. Deputy asked Ms. Hyde if he can search her vehicle to which she gave him permission.

During my investigation, Deputy observed Ms. Hyde to possibly be under the influence of some type of narcotic due to her not being able to keep her eye open and

slurring her speech. As Deputy stepped away from Ms. Hyde to speak to his partner, Deputy observed her blading her body away from us and had her hand in her pants attempting to grab something. When Deputy approached her and grabbed her arm, she started to panic and stated she has narcotics on her. She was concealing half a gram

of meth (T.C.A. 39-17-434), 2x pills of Amphetamine and Dextroamphetamine (T.C.A. 39-17-407), 3x pills of Lorazepam, and 2 1/2 pills of Alprazolam (T.C.A. 55-10-105). Ms. Hyde was placed in custody and the narcotics were tested using the TruNarc device at the Justice Center. This occurred in Loudon County, TN.

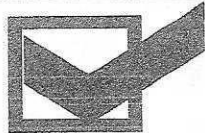

sible for ordering and participating in the murder of several rival gang members and others associated with MS-13. In August 2018, a Honduran tribunal convicted Archaga Carias of conspiracy and other charges and sentenced him to a lengthy prison sentence. He violently escaped from Honduran custody in February 2020 when approximately 20 armed gunmen in police and military uniforms stormed a courthouse where Archaga Carias was scheduled for a hearing. Multiple Honduran police officers were killed during the escape. Archaga Carias is believed to still be in Honduras.

The case against Archaga Carias is being investigated by Joint Task Force Vulcan (JTFV), which was created in 2019 to eliminate MS-13. It brings together the law enforcement agencies

of the United States Departments of Justice and Homeland Security to provide a whole-of-government approach to combating MS-13.

"This is a joint effort," said Durgin, who supports JTFV for the FBI. "When we work together with our partners, we can see the crossover and better address the threat." He notes that in the absence of the task force, each individual agency may hold some piece of investigative information but may not have enough to successfully bring charges and prosecute. "Working together allows law enforcement to gain a more complete picture and go after the organization in a more holistic way," he said.

Durgin said that MS-13 poses an ongoing threat in Central America, the United States, and elsewhere. "MS-13 is an international criminal organization whose business model is extreme


violence. Capturing this individual would send a clear message to MS-13 that their violent activity and narcotics trafficking will not be tolerated."

Archaga Carias is 39 years old and has brown eyes and black hair, which he sometimes wears shaved close to his head. He is 5 feet 5 inches tall and 160 pounds. Investigators believe he only

speaks Spanish.

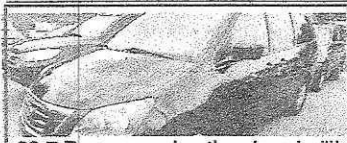

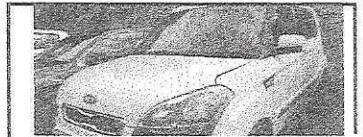

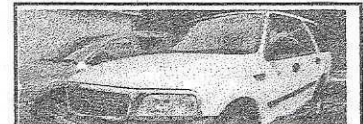

Ashley Hill, 35, Vonore Road Loudon, was charged with General Session Capias, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II, Man/Sell/Poss. Of Controlled Substance x2, Public Intoxication, Simple Possession, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Contraband in a Penal Institution.

Officer Trey Clemmer LPD, received a call to the Marathon on Hwy 11 for a vehicle that has been setting in the parking lot for several hours. Officer arrived on scene and spoke with the store manager and he stated to Officer that for the past 5 hours the black Cadillac has been running but he couldn't tell if anyone was inside. Officer approached the vehicle and noticed inside of the car there was a female passed out behind the wheel. After a couple of attempts the driver finally woke up and opened the door. Officer asked the female if she was okay and she was mumbling stating she was just tired. Officer noticed the driver's eyes were dilated and she kept repeating herself that she was just tired from travelling. Officer asked the female for her license and she gave him an I.D only card. Dispatch checked the status of her license and they reported back that it was

suspended and she also had a warrant from Loudon County for an FTA. Officer asked Ms. Hill to step out of the vehicle and to place her hands behind her back that she was under arrest for driving on suspended and for also having and FTA. Upon his and Officer Houser's vehicle inventory of the car they found a glass container with several pills inside of a Crown Royal bag in the passenger seat. We had further found inside of the car a glass pipe with blueish wet residue, two cut straws, and a set of yellow scales inside of her purse. Officer asked Ms. Hill if she had anything else on her person and if she takes it in the jail she will be charged and she stated no. Upon search at the jail Ms. Hill had contraband hidden inside of her hair scrunchie and was tested by DTF which happened to be cocaine. Ms. Hill was charged with man/sel/del of schV of having 30 400mg of Gabapentin, man/sel/del of schV of 50 600mg of Gabapentin, simple possession of 3mg of Clonazepam, possession with intent to resale sch I cocaine (individual bags 1.0g, 0.4g, 14.5g), Drug Paraphernalia, Public Intoxication, and also introduction of contraband. The above actions did occur in the city of Loudon.
