



"Our office is proud to announce the 2021 Cops Hiring Program Grant award to Lenoir City in the Eastern District of Tennessee. Applications for this award were received from 590 law enforcement agencies in nearly every state. The funding that Lenoir City will receive will support the hiring of career law enforcement officers to address community policing needs," said Acting United States Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III.

CHP is a competitive award program intended to reduce crime and advance public safety through community policing. CHP provides funds directly to law enforcement agencies to hire new or rehire additional career law enforcement officers, thereby increasing their community policing capacity and crime prevention efforts. Of the 183 agencies awarded grants to-

day, approximately half will use the funding to focus on building legitimacy and trust between law enforcement and communities; 41 agencies will seek to address high rates of gun violence; 21 will focus on other areas of violence; and 19 will focus CHP resources on combating hate and domestic extremism or supporting police-based responses to persons in crisis. 

Francisco Sanchez, 34, Flamingo Lane Harrison, TN., was charged with Theft of Property, Driving without a Valid License, and Financial Responsibility.

Officer Eldridge LCPD, observed a white Ford Econoline with no tail lights, driving southbound on Hwy 321 and initiated a traffic stop near the Citizens Bank. Officers then made contact with the driver (Sanchez) who failed to present a valid drivers license, proof of insurance, or registration for the vehicle he was driving.

Officers ran the tag (TX

10866Z8) through records which revealed the vehicle to have the incorrect registration attached to it.

Officers then gave dispatch the VIN (1FTJS34G2RHA83176) which revealed the Van to be stolen, and was confirmed by Hamilton Co. Sanchez admitted to officers that he knew the vehicle was stolen and was trying to get to Madisonville. Sanchez was taken into custody without incident and charged with Motor Vehicle Theft, Driving without a license, and Financial responsibility.






