

Brennan Henry, 24, Georgetown Lane CHAT-TANOOGA, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. II x2, IV, VI, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Traffic Control Device.

James Corn, 24, Hickory Valley Road Chattanooga, was charged Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. VI x2, Sch. II x2, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Traffic Control Device.

Officer A. Lee LCPD, was conducting routine patrol when Officer observed a Toyota 4runner, bearing TN tag: 9Z5-5Z5, fail to yield to the traffic control device, a red light. The vehicle proceeded straight through the intersection until nearly striking a curb. During the traffic stop Officer made contact with the driver, James Corn, and passenger, Brennan Tucker. Both

subjects advised they were going to Knoxville from Chattanooga. During the encounter Officer could smell a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. During a search of the vehicle, Officer located approximately 80 Xanax pills (pieces), 21.19 grams marijuana, 5.41 grams of white rock/ powder substance. .40 grams of crystal substance. In furtherance of the lawful search.

Officer located digital scales and several small baggies believed to be used by the Offenders for the sell and/or delivery of these dangerous drugs. Several of the illegal substances located were separated into smaller quantities for resale. James Corn admitted the marijuana in the vehicle was his but states the rest of the substances located were the

passengers.

Brennan states all of the items found in the vehicle were the drivers. However, the illegal drugs and items of paraphernalia were found on both the drivers and passenger areas of the vehicle. Both subjects admitted to smok-

ing marijuana prior to our encounter. Due to all the above, both subjects were taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without further incident.

All the above did occur in Lenoir City, Loudon County, TN.

sonal purchases included Las Vegas trips, NBA tickets, a hot tub for his home, and a variety of personal items and services. Johnson also received \$84,091.80 in unauthorized compensation including stipends, bonuses, duplicate and additional payroll payments, and salary payments that exceeded his contracted amount. His employment was terminated on December 3, 2019.

Former Finance Director Robert Williams received improper payroll payments totaling at least \$35,295.95. Williams collected duplicate salary payments, excessive stipends, and a questionable buy-back vacation payment. His employment was terminated on February 12, 2021.

Former Nutritional Services Director Michael Jones stole at least \$25,114.19 from the school. This included \$21,586.05 in unau-

thorized food purchases for himself. Jones bought food including shrimp, crab legs. ribeye steaks, salmon, catfish, and lobsters - food that is typically not served to students. He also used school funds to pay \$3,528.14 for auto repairs on his and another school employee's vehicles. His employment was terminated on September 28. 2020.

Comptroller investigators have also questioned another \$400,521.45 in disbursements that were authorized by Johnson and Williams. These disbursements are further detailed in the investigative report.

In November 2021, the Shelby County Grand Jury indicted Corey Johnson on one count of theft over \$250,000 and one count of theft over \$10,000; Robert Williams on one count of theft over \$250,000; and Michael Jones on one count of theft over \$10,000 and one

count of theft over \$2,500.



Kevin Hutton, 33, Everett High Road Maryville, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Officers with LCPD, were dispatched to a domestic complaint at Kingston Street. Dispatch advised a female showed up at the caller's residence and had him call 911. She'd just been in a domestic down the road with her boyfriend. Upon arrival, Officer made contact with the complainant victim. She and her "Fiance" Kevin Hutton were helping friends move at Kingston Street. They'd got into an argument about past relationships while they were broken up. Victim wanted to be honest with him and told Kevin that she'd slept with her cousin while they were apart. Kevin became irate and slapped victim in the face. Later, while they were sitting on the couch. They started arguing again. Kevin slapped her in the face again. There was a witness who saw the second assault. She was in the living room when
