

Glen Hutchens, 54, Kawga Way Loudon, was charged with Driving Under the Influence.


Officer S. Harrison LPD, observed a gray Honda traveling west on Highway 72, who was having difficulties maintaining it's lane of travel. Officer observed the vehicle cross the center line and the fog line numerous times, and was also swerving within the travel lanes. Upon stopping the vehicle on Carter Street @ Steekee Street, officer immediately detected a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from within the passenger compartment. The driver. identified as Glen Hutchens, seemed disoriented and also had troubles telling him where he lived and where he was headed to. Hutchens ad-

vised that he had been drinking "Rum" earlier and that he stopped drinking around 3 or 4 this same morning. Hutchens had a very strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about his person and breath, had slurred speech, bloodshot eyes and was very unsteady on his feet. Hutchens attempted to perform a series of consented sobriety checks. administered by this Officer.

Hutchens performed so poorly that this Officer actually stopped the sobriety checks for fear of possible injury to Hutchens. Hutchens was placed under arrest for DUI and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident. Once at the jail, Hutchens consented to a breath test to determine the alcoholic content of his blood, 0.277 was the result of this breath test.

for 5 days followed by strict mask use for an additional 5 days. Alternatively, if a 5-day quarantine is not feasible, it is imperative that an exposed person wear a well-fitting mask at all times when around others for 10 days after exposure. Individuals who have received their booster shot do not need to quarantine following an exposure, but should wear a mask for 10 days after the exposure. For all those exposed, best practice would also include a test for SARS-CoV-2 at day 5 after exposure. If symptoms occur, individuals should immediately quarantine until a negative test confirms symptoms are not attributable to COVID-19.

Isolation relates to behavior after a confirmed infection. Isolation for 5 days followed by wearing a well-fitting mask will minimize the risk of spreading the virus to others. Quarantine Law to F index-




### We Know You
