

Lance Alston, 37, Locus Hill Drive Lexington, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. VI, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Deputy Harrison was dispatched to the area of I-75 North Bound at the 76-mile marker in reference to a reckless driver in a black Jaguar cutting other vehicles off and failing to maintain its lane. While en route, Dispatch advised a complainant was out with the vehicle stopped in the middle of the 76 North Bound exit ramp.
