





Joanna Burger, 48, Hwy 95 North Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic, and Possession of Sch. II.

Deputy Green LCSO, observed a female parked outside of JB's Country Store in Lenoir City, TN. While observing this female she appeared to possibly intoxicated. The female, later to be identified as Joanna Burger, appeared to be drowsy, slow and lethargic. Deputy followed behind this vehicle to observe the driving. 




