



believed was associated with ISIS; however, unbeknownst to Carpenter, the individual was a covert FBI employee. Carpenter provided English-language translations of ISIS media content to that individual for use by ISIS.

The indictment and arrest were announced by John C. Demers, Assistant Attorney General for National Security at the U.S. Department of III, Acting United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Tennessee; and Joseph E. Carrico, Special Agent-in-Charge of the Knoxville office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The case was investigated by the Knoxville Joint Terrorism Task Force, which is comprised of federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies, including the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Tennessee Highway Patrol, Clinton Po-

lice Department, and Knoxville Police Department.

If convicted, Carpenter faces up to 20 years in pris-The maximum potential sentence in this case is prescribed by Congress and provided here for informational purposes only, as any sentencing of the defendant will be determined by the assigned judge. In all cases, defendants are presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty; indictments Justice, Francis M. Hamilton merely contain allegations supported by probable cause.

The government is represented by Assistant U.S. Attorney Casey T. Arrowood of the Eastern District of Tennessee and Trial Attorneys George C. Kraehe and Felice John Viti of the National Security Division's Counterterrorism Section.



DUI After Traffic Stop Travis Carter, 26, Vineyard Road Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, and Expiration of Certificates and Plates.






Betty van Aken, age 94 of Tellico Village Loudon, Tennessee passed away peacefully at her home on April 08, 2021.


