



Justin Russell, 34, Tennessee Ave Greenback, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, Man/Sell/ Del/Resale Sch. I & VI, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Randall Russell, 41, Kirkland Private Drive Greenback, was charged with DUI, Driving on Revoked/ Suspended License, Violation of Implied Consent, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Driving on Roadway laned for Traffic, Headlight on Motor Vehicle, Poss. of Drug Para.

Deputy Rogers LCSO, observed a Black Truck pass with a headlight out while on Hwy 95. While observing the vehicle Deputy noted that it turned abruptly on Craigs Chapel Rd and twice traveled completely to the opposite side

of the road. Deputy initiated a traffic stop at which time the driver turned on McTeer Rd without slowing, eventually stopping halfway to Tennessee Ave. Upon contact with the driver, Mr. Randal Russell, he appeared very lethargic and stated his license was suspended. The passenger, Justin Russell, also appeared very lethargic and was constantly falling asleep. During questioning, Randall stated he was prescribed Suboxone and that there was a scale with drug residue in the center console. Upon further investigation, there were numerous cut straws, baggies, vials and scale all with crystalized residue throughout the vehicle. Under the center of the bench seat was a container with multiple vials of Meth

0.5gm, and cut straws. Both subjects admitted to using meth but neither would admit to possessing the drug. In a backpack that Mr. Justin claimed, a large bag of Marijuana 30gm, and a smaller bag of ground marijuana 10gm, were located along with a small baggie with a brown powder 1gm within it. Mr. Justin stated the brown substance was cinnamon and that he was going to give it to a sick friend in hopes of a placebo effect. Loudon E911 confirmed Mr. Justin had 2 active warrants out of Blount County. Narcotics Deputy Stanley 908 tested both substances and confirmed they tested positive for Fentanyl(brown) Meth(crystallized). Mr. Randall did consent to SFST and ARIDE testing and did not perform satisfactorily. After taking Mr. Randall into custody Deputy read him TN Implied Consent during which he fell asleep. After attempting to read the form again Mr. Randall stated he understood and he did not want to give a blood sample. Mr. Randall was taken into custody for Possession of Meth, DUI, Suspended DL, Drug Paraphernalia, and cited with Light Law, Roadways Laned for Traffic, and Violation of Implied Consent. Mr. Justin was arrested for Resale of Schedule I, Possession of Meth, Resale of Schedule VI, Drug Paraphernalia, and 2 active warrants. Both subjects were transported to the Loudon County Jail. 



Largest CDC COVID-19
Vaccine Effectiveness
Study in Health Workers
Shows mRNA Vaccines
94% Effective

Geographically diverse population included across 33 sites in 25 U.S. states

A new CDC study adds to the growing body of real-world evidence (outside of a clinical trial setting) showing that COVID-19 mRNA vaccines authorized by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) protect health care personnel (HCP) against COVID-19. mRNA vaccines (Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna) reduced the risk of getting sick with COVID-19 by 94% among HCP who were fully vaccinated. This assessment, conducted in a different study network with a larger sample size from across a broader geographic area than in the clinical trials, independently confirms U.S. vaccine effectiveness findings among health care workers that were first reported March

29

Data for this assessment come from a network covering 500,000 HCP across 33 sites in 25 U.S. states, providing additional robust evidence that mRNA vaccines are effective against symptomatic illness in real-world conditions.

The assessment compared vaccination status of participants who tested positive for SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19 (cases) with vaccination status of those who tested negative (controls). Among the 1,843 participants, there were 623 cases and 1,220 controls. Vaccine effectiveness estimates were calculated by comparing the odds of COVID-19 vaccination in cases and controls. The large sample size in this study allowed for a precise vaccine effectiveness estimate with narrower confidence intervals than earlier CDC findings published March 29.

Understanding vaccine effectiveness among HCP is important because they are at

higher risk for exposure to SARS-CoV-2 through patient interactions. Vaccination of HCP protects them and their patients against COVID-19 and ensures continuation of critical health care services.

The assessment found that COVID-19 symptomatic illness was reduced by 94% among HCP who were fully vaccinated, defined in this


study as seven or more days after receipt of a second vaccine dose, and by 82% among those who were partially vaccinated, defined in this study as 14 days after receipt of dose one through six days after dose two. These findings support CDC's recommendation that everyone should get both doses of an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine to get the most protection.




