

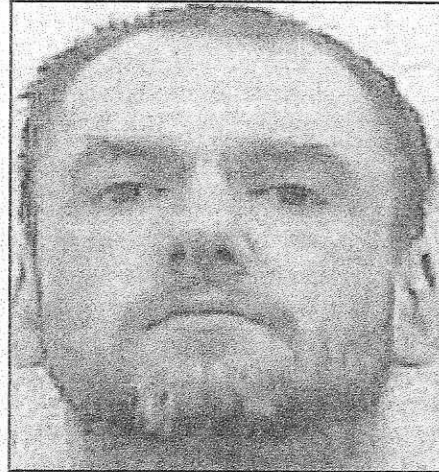

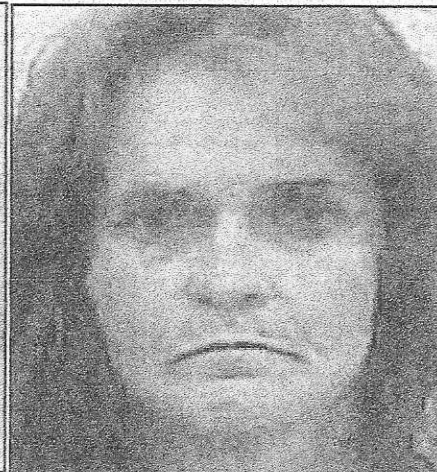

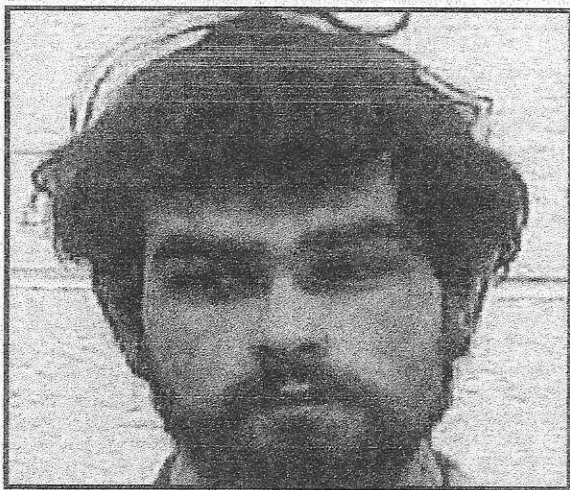

Knoxville Man Arraigned In Federal Court For Multiple Hobbs Act Robberies And Carjacking

DeShawn Whit-ed, 23, of Knoxville, was arraigned before the Honorable Judge Debra C. Poplin, United States Magistrate Judge, in the Eastern District of Tennessee, for six counts of Hobbs Act Robbery, one count of carjacking, seven counts of brandishing a firearm in furtherance of a crime of violence, and one count of felon in

possession of a firearm. Whit-ed was indicted by a federal grand jury on March 17, 2021. Trial has been set for June 29, 2021, before the Honorable Judge Kath-er-in Crytzer, United States District Judge, in the Eastern District of Tennessee.

The indictment alleges that, between December 2, 2020 and January 20, 2021, Whit-

ed robbed convenience stores and restaurants across Knoxville. The indictment also alleges that on January 20, 2021, Whit-ed committed a carjacking when he stole a motorist's car. The indictment alleges that Whit-ed committed these crimes by brandishing a gun and threatening his victims.

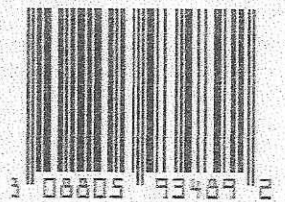

Ethan Rodgers, 20, Cedar Street Loudon, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. of Meth, and Poss. of Drug Para. X2.

Officer Trey Clemmer LPD, was doing my routine patrol when Officer noticed a dark blue vehicle parked at the Fort Loudon apartments on Grove Street that wasn't there prior to my previous building check. Upon further investigation Officer observed a male sleeping in the driver seat who is later identified as Ethan Rodgers. After making contact with Mr. Rodgers, he was asked to step out of the vehicle once Mr. Rogers stepped out of the vehicle he immediately started placing he hands in and out of different pockets. Mr. Rodg-

ers was asked to remove his hands from his pockets and place them above his head, at which time Officer did a pat down of Mr. Rodgers persons. During my pat down of Mr. Rodgers Officer felt what was believed to be a pipe in his front right jacket pocket. Officer removed the object and it was a clear glass pipe with white powder residue inside of it, commonly known to be used to smoke illegal narcotics. Officer then conducted a probable cause search of the vehicle and which Officer located 1 gram of methamphetamine and a scale with residue. 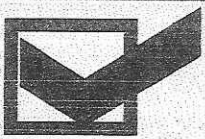

Arraigned

If convicted for the Hobbs Act Robberies, the defendant faces up to 20 years imprisonment, a fine of up to \$250,000, a term of supervised release of up to three years, any applicable forfeiture, and a \$100 special assessment for each count of robbery. If convicted of the carjacking, the defendant faces up to 15 years of imprisonment, a fine of up to \$250,000, three years of supervised release, and \$100 special assessment. If convicted of brandishing a firearm in furtherance of a crime of violence, the defendant faces a mandatory minimum term of imprisonment of seven years up to life, which must be served consecutively to any term of imprisonment imposed for each count of brandishing a firearm. If convicted of felon in possession of a firearm, the defendant faces up to 10 years of im-

prisonment, a fine of up to \$250,000, three years of supervised release, and \$100 special assessment.

The arrangement was announced by Acting United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Tennessee Francis M. Hamilton III.

The investigation was led by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Knoxville Division, the Knoxville Police Department, and the Knox County Sheriff's Office.

Assistant United States Attorney Alan S. Kirk will represent the United States.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), a comprehensive national strategy that creates local partnerships with law enforcement agencies to effectively enforce existing gun laws. It provides more options to prosecutors, allowing them to utilize local, state, and federal laws to ensure that criminals

who commit gun crime face tough sentences. PSN gives each federal district the flexibility it needs to focus on individual challenges that a specific community faces.

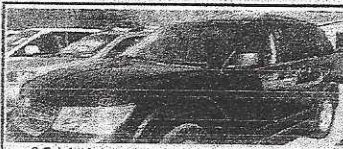

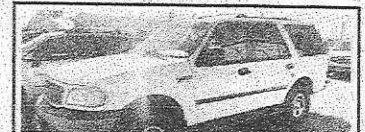

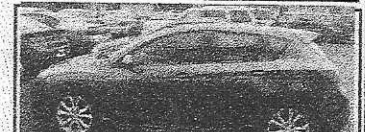

Sara Smith, 46, Old Midway Road Lenoir City, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. Ix2, & Sch. II, Ignition Interlock Device, Driving Unregistered Vehicle, Simple Possession, Violation of Interlock Device, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Deputy Rogers LCSO, observed a driver with her phone up to her ear while traveling on Shaw Ferry Rd. After running the vehicle's registration, TN CGS668, it did not come back on file. Deputy initiated a traffic stop at Avery Str. and upon contact with the driver/offender, Ms. Sara Smith, she was extremely nervous, kept looking towards her purse and moving objects around within it. She repeatedly asked if she could have someone come get her. Ms. Smith had a valid DL but advised she did not have insurance and her tag was from a previous vehicle. E911 advised she was required to have an Interlock Device on her vehicle which was not present. Upon inventorying the vehicle

and checking her purse for weapons Deputy did recover a brown vile with brown powder that weighed 6 gm(39-17-417A), a clear crystallized substance weighing 1.5 gm(39-17-417B), 2 Morphine pills(39-17-417A), 3 Alprazolam pills, and 4 Phentermine pills(39-17-418). Deputy also recovered a meth pipe, several baggies, used syringes, cut straws, burnt spoons, and a scale all of which had residue present(39-17-425).

Deputy took the offender into custody for 2 counts of Possession of Schedule I, Possession of Schedule II, Simple Possession of Schedule IV, and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. I also cited the offender with Driving an Unregistered Vehicle, Violation of Interlock Device, and Hands-Free Law. Deputy transported the offender to the jail at which time, on her own accord, she admitted possessing the illegal drugs and identified the brown substance like heroin and the crystalized substance as meth for Officer's safety. Said did occur in Loudon Co. TN.
