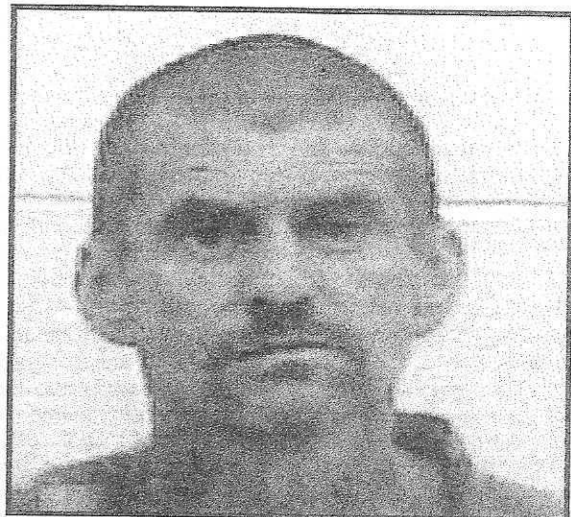

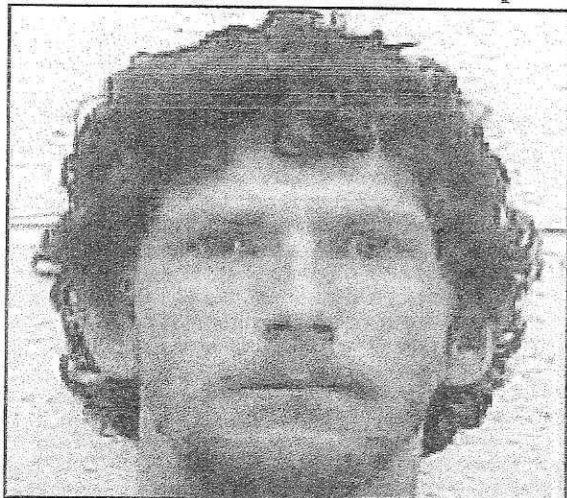

CDC Investigation Notice: Outbreak of Salmonella

A CDC investigation notice regarding a multistate outbreak of Salmonella Enteritidis infections has been posted: <https://www.cdc.gov/salmonella/enteritidis-06-21/index.html>

Key points:

17 people infected with the outbreak strain of Salmonella Enteritidis have been

reported from 6 states. Eight people were hospitalized, and no deaths have been reported.

Interviews with ill people and laboratory testing information show that raw frozen breaded stuffed chicken products are the likely source of this outbreak.

These products are

labeled raw but may not look raw. They may look cooked because they might be breaded or browned.

People reported buying different brands of raw frozen stuffed chicken products.

CDC is not recommending that people avoid eating raw fro-

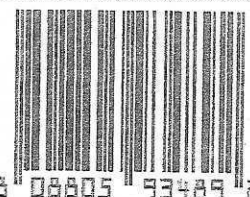

Carefully read the labels on raw frozen breaded stuffed chicken products and follow cooking instructions exactly as they are written.

Look for words like "Raw" or "Uncooked" to know if the product is raw. The product may not look raw because it may be breaded or browned.

Always use an oven to cook products to an internal temperature of 165°F. Use a food thermometer to check the center, the thickest part, and the surface of the product.

Never use a microwave or an air fryer to cook raw frozen breaded stuffed chicken products. Microwaving or air frying will not always cook it thoroughly.

Wash your hands and any surfaces and utensils used to prepare the product with warm, soapy water for 20 seconds before and after handling it.

About Salmonella:

Most people infected with Salmonella develop diarrhea, fever, and stomach cramps 6 hours to 6 days after being exposed to the bacteria.

The illness usually lasts 4 to 7 days, and most people recover without treatment.

In some people, the illness may be so severe that the patient is hospitalized.

Children younger than 5, adults 65 and older, and people with weakened immune systems are more likely to have severe illness.

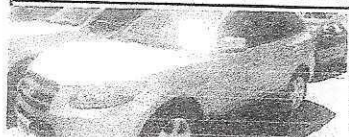

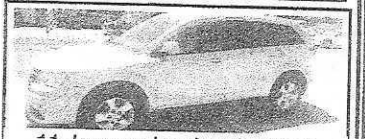

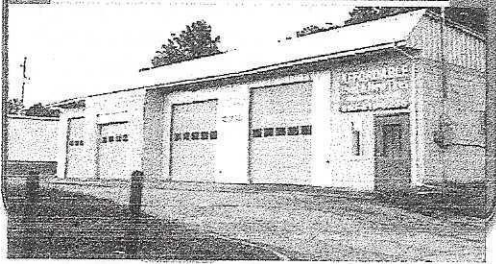

Former Fentress County Deputy Used Fuel Card for Personal Vehicle

Former Fentress County Sheriff's Department Deputy Johnny Dishman is now facing an indictment after an investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office working in conjunction with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation.

Investigators determined that Dishman purchased at least \$8,856.53 in fuel for his personal vehicle using his county authorized fuel credit card. The bulk of these purchases were made when Dishman was not working.

Dishman admitted to investigators that he started using his fuel credit card to buy fuel for his personal vehicle "a couple of years ago." He continued to do so until he was placed on administrative leave in March 2020. He formally resigned on June 15, 2020.

Comptroller investigators are also questioning an additional \$1,053.02 in fuel purchases made by Dishman.

In June 2021, the Fentress County Grand Jury indicted Johnny Carson Dishman on one count of theft over \$2,500, one count of fraudulent use of a credit card, and one count of official misconduct.

"The Fentress County Sheriff's Department must take steps to strengthen its policies and procedures surrounding fuel purchases," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "These policies may include requiring deputies to keep receipts or maintain a log of fuel purchases and performing monthly reconciliations to ensure deputies' reported purchases match the monthly fuel bill."

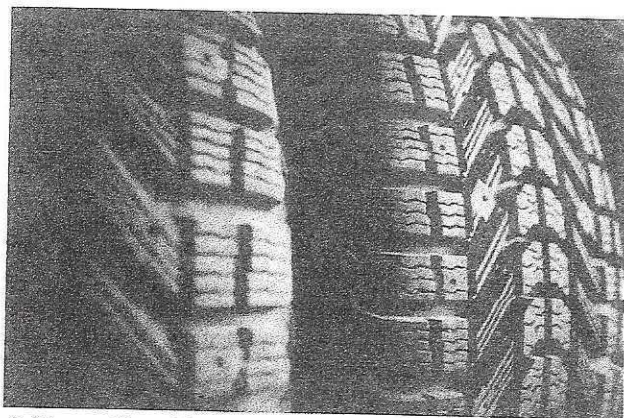
