


# Abuse

Kimberly Mincey, 46, Grubb Road Lenoir City, was charged with Child Abuse/ Neglect Endangerment.

Deputy Green LCSO, responded to Grubb Road in reference to a domestic situation. The complainant, Kimberly Mincey, advised her 11-yearold son was out of control and threatening to harm her. Deputy arrived on scene and spoke with Ms. Mincey which advised her son was making verbal threats to her and requested that Deputy take him away for a while. It was very obvious Ms. Mincey was heavily intoxicated from alcohol consumption. Deputy attempted to locate the victim inside the residence but was unsuccessful. Victim was later located outside, hiding in a lawnmower trailer. Deputy spoke with victim and observed that he suffered from mental disabilities. Victim was unable to

focus on our conversation and was emotionally attached to minor events that had occurred years prior. Deputy spoke with Ms. Mincey and advised her that arresting victim would not be beneficial to him and advised her to seek mental help for her child. Deputy requested ID from Ms. Mincey to conduct a DCS Referral. After Deputy ran Ms. Mincey's ID it returned showing an active warrant out of Knox County for child support. Deputy took Ms. Mincey into custody and asked several times for a family member or friend that could provide care for victim while she was incarcerated but Ms. Mincey was adamant there was nobody to provide care for the child and requested the State to take custody. Deputy contacted DCS and requested an immediate response for victim. While awaiting a response





Carwell-Richmond stole the remainder of the money (\$1,281.04) after falsifying invoices that she submitted to the Tennessee Department of Education (TDOE) for reimbursement. These invoices were related to furniture the academy was leasing. Carwell-Richmond inflated the amounts on the phony invoices to make it appear the school had paid more for the furniture than it actually did.

Additionally, well-Richmond forged a business owner's signature on a letter in order to create documentation for a large sign that was purchased by the school. The letter was

submitted to TDOE as her proof of payment for the school's sign.

Carwell-Richmond also admitted to Comptroller investigators that she did not follow grant requirements associated with a \$261,000.75 federal grant awarded to the academy to assist with planning, implementation, and start-up costs. The academy still owes TDOE \$126,755.33, which served as the passthrough entity for this grant.

On May 6, 2021, the Shelby County Grand indicted Tamika Carwell-Richmond two counts of Theft over \$2,500, two counts of Forgery over \$2,500, and one count of forgery under \$2,500.





from DCS Deputy spoke with victim which stated his mother had thrown a metal towel rack at him. Victim advised he was in his bedroom behind his closet door taking cover from the towel rack and as he knelt to dodge the rack, it struck him in the top of the head causing pain. Victim claims his mother rushed to grab the rack and hid it from him.

Victim made a statement in regards to not being able to put on a helmet prior to the rack being thrown at him but was unable to provide details in regards to this statement. Deputy felt what appeared to be a small knot on the top of his head and victim stated it hurt to be touched.

Victim also stated Ms. Mincey had thrown a charger at him the night prior which

struck him in between the eyes. Deputy did observe a light red mark between his eyes. Deputy asked victim if his mother harmed him often in which he stated she often threw his personal items at him but could not be specific as to what the items were. Victim suffered from numerous insect bites on his legs, arms, stomach, back, and forehead. Victim claims they were flea bites and had advised his mother of the bites but she did not seem concerned. DCS did not respond to the scene but instead contacted victim brother, who agreed to provide care for him during Ms. Mincey's incarceration. Ms. Mincey was taken into custody and transported to Loudon County Jail without incident where she was charged with Child Abuse. All the above did occur in Loudon County, TN.
