

they send him sexually explicit images of themselves. Watson threatened to send sexually explicit images of the minors to social media websites if the victims refused to comply with his demands for more sexually explicit images.

The investigation was conducted by the Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Security Investigations, and the Knoxville Police Department's Internet Crimes Against Children unit.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Jennifer Kolman represented the United States in court.

This case was brought as part of Project Safe Childhood (PSC), a nationwide initiative launched in May 2006, by the Department of Justice to combat the growing epidemic of child sexual exploitation and abuse. Led by the United States Attorney's Offices and the Criminal Di-

vision's Child Exploitation and Obscenity Section, PSC marshals federal, state, and local resources to locate, apprehend, and prosecute individuals who sexually exploit children, and to identify and rescue victims. 



to his place of business to say the same things to his face.

Blevins contacted a witness (Daniel Rodgers) and stated that Mr. Brewster had threatened his life (there is no evidence to support this claim) and that he was going to confront Ken Brewster. The witness decided to also go to Brewsters business in an attempt to stop Blevins.

Blevins says that once he arrived at Brewster's, he ws attempting to open the front door when Ken Brewster punched him in the face. Ken Brewster states that Blevins came into his business yelling and swearing and that he did indeed punch Blevins in the face while he was attempting to get him out of his business after telling him to leave numerous times.

A witness (Frank Smallen, A Brewster Employee) stated that Blevins came into the business swearing and yelling toward Brewster. Brewster stated that at some point during the struggle Blevins produced a straight razor knife from his pocket. There was no claim that that knife was used or that Blevins made threats with it, only that he pulled it out of his pocket and held it in his right hand for a period before placing it back into his

pocket. After the initial confrontation, Brewster followed Blevins and the witness to the property next door (Family Dollar Store).

When officers arrived Ken Brewster, Blevins and the witness were still at the Family Dollar Store yelling at each other. When asked about the knife Blevins repeateadly denied having it. A razor knife matching the description that Brewster had given was found by Officer Kenny Ridings, lying in the grass near where Brewster had told Sgt. Scott Newman that it may be found.

While Sgt. Scott Newman was initially gathering information in an attempt to figure out what was going on, Blevins made the statement that his purpose for going to Brewsters business was to attempt to provoke Brewster into striking him. Blevins made this statement of Officer Sam Harrison. Mr. Brewster is working on getting video footage from his business that may definitively weather Blevins was inside Brewsters business when this indcident

All parties were separated, this report was started and both parties involved were advised to seek private prosecution if they so desired.

In the affidavit of complaint filed in General Sessions Court

by the victim it states:

Kenneth Brewster sent me a message on Facebook and invited me to his establishment. I walked in and asked the lady if Brewster was there with his hands in his pockets. He ran around the corner and punched me in the face. I

turned my head back and he grabbed my chest and pushed me through the door where he continued to hit me until police arrived.

NO Charges have been filed in this case. We will let you know if any more information becomes available.



Cookeville Fire Department Officers Received Improper Compensation

Former and Current Fire Captains Indicted on Theft Charges

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictments of former Cookeville Fire Captain Marvin Montgomery and current Cookeville Fire Captain Shawn Roberson.

Both Montgomery and Roberson not only worked at the Cookeville Fire Department, but they also worked as part-time instructors at the Tennessee Fire and Codes Enforcement Academy in Bell Buckle, Tennessee.

Investigators determined that Montgomery and Roberson effectively double dipped on their paychecks. They were each paid by both the city and the Academy for working the same hours at both locations.

Montgomery obtained \$32,212.75 in compensation from the Cookeville Fire Department that he was not entitled to. The investigation revealed that between January 1, 2017 and February 28, 2019, Montgomery claimed pay for 1,345 hours that he did not work.

After the investigation began, Captain Montgomery retired from the fire department. At the time of his separation, the city collected \$16,094.40

from Montgomery's accrued leave balance. There remains an unpaid balance of \$16,118.35 due to the city:

Roberson improperly obtained \$2,622.53 from the Cookeville Fire Department for 109.5 hours he did not work. This occurred between January 1, 2017 and February 28, 2019 when Roberson was serving as a lieutenant.

In May 2021, the Putnam County Grand Jury indicted Marvin Montgomery on one count of theft over \$10,000, and Joseph Shawn Roberson on one count of theft over \$2,500.

"Management oversight is an important component in preventing improper compensation," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "Supervisors and managers must carefully review timesheets and leave requests to ensure employees are only being paid for the time they are actually working."


