





Deputy Harrison LCSO, was dispatched to Old Spears Rd. interference to an escort for a daughter who was wanting to retrieve property her house but her mother would not let her. Once on scene,

Former Greene County Sheriff's Department Employee Pleads Guilty to Theft

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the guilty plea of Stewart Cowles, a former IT system administrator for the Greene County Sheriff's Department.

Investigators determined that Cowles misappropriated \$49,826.20 from the county by engaging in a number of improper practices. These issues are presented below:

Cowles used a sheriff's de-





DUI

David Akins, 62, Vonore Road Loudon, was charged with DUI, Simple Possession, and Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic.

Deputy Rogers LCSO, observed a blue truck swerve violently into the oncoming lane while traveling South on Hwy 11. Deputy initiated a traffic stop at Ford Rd and made contact with the driver/ offender, Mr. David Akins. The offender had blood shot eyes and constricted pupils that did not react with light. Upon further investigation Mr. Akins possessed a marijuana bowl in his pocket and stated he had marijuana in the vehicle along with his prescription Subutex medication. Upon a probable cause search of the vehicle Deputy did recover 25gms of marijuana. Mr. Akins did consent to SFST/ARIDE testing and showed signs of being heavily impaired. Deputy took the offender into custody for DUI and Simple Possession then read him TN Implied Consent. Mr. Akins did consent to a blood draw at which time he was transported to the Fort Loudoun ER where the blood draw was conducted. Mr. Akins was then transported to the Loudon County Jail. The offender was also charged with

Simple Possession and cited with Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic. Said did occur in Loudon County, TN.

Cowles continued to use a county paid cell phone number after his employment ended on September 1, 2018. The cost of the usage was approximately \$55.57.

In May 2021, David Cowles pled guilty to one count of theft over \$10,000.

"It is important for government entities to not only review invoices, but also document that all goods have been received," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "This necessary step helps diminish the risk that a government will pay for something that never arrived in its offices."




