

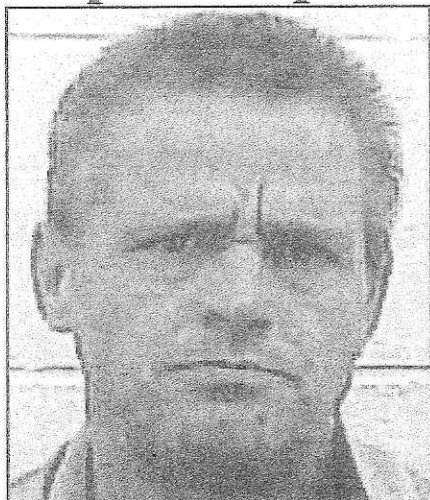

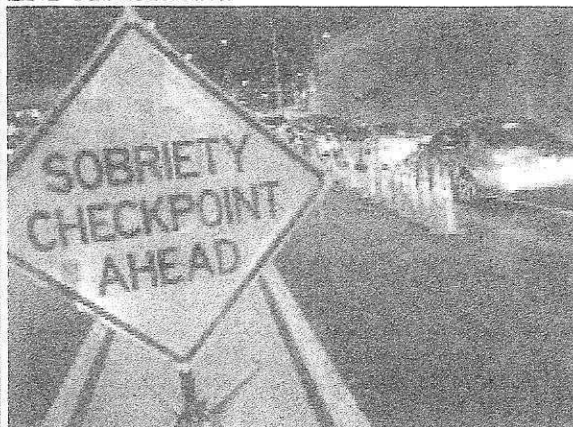

Kingsport Veterinarian Agrees To Pay \$70,000 In Civil Penalties To Settle Alleged Violations Of The Controlled Substance Act

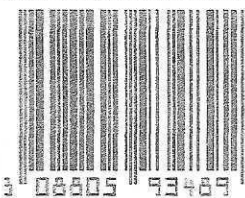
The Andes-Straley Veterinary Hospital in Kingsport, Tennessee, and its owner, Gary C. Andes, D.V.M., agreed to pay the United States \$70,000 in civil penalties to resolve allegations that Dr. Andes and the hospital violated the Controlled Substances Act ("CSA"). The CSA was enacted to prevent the diversion

or misuse of controlled substances by requiring persons and companies involved in the chain of distribution to maintain complete and accurate records relating to the controlled substances they receive, administer, and dispense.

According to the contentions of the United States contained in the settlement agreement, beginning in January 2019 investigators

from the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), along with the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) and Tennessee Department of Health (TNDOH), conducted an investigation into allegations that Dr. Andes and the hospital manager were failing

Stop

Jeremy Aikens, 44, Pine Top Street Loudon, was charged with Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth.

Brenda Marsh, 37, Hwy 411 Vonore, was charged with Simple Possession x2 Legend Drug, Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence, and Contraband in Penal Institution.

Deputy Clay Jenkins LCSO, conducted a traffic stop on a green Saturn Vue TN at the intersection of Old Highway 95 @ Foothills Rd after observing the tag to be expired. While stopping the vehicle, Deputy observed the female passenger to be reaching around and under the seat. Deputy then made contact with the passenger Brenda Marsh to be very nervous. Deputy then asked if she had anything illegal and she advised she had a, "rig."

Deputy then asked Ms. Marsh to exit the vehicle. Upon exiting, Deputy observed a orange circle pill to be on the floorboard in plain view. While outside of the vehicle, Deputy then ob-

served more pills to fall from Ms. Marsh's person. While standing in front of his vehicle, 3 more orange circle pills (Methocarbamol) and a small baggy with a brown powder substance (Fentanyl) fell from Ms. Marsh's person as she was trying to conceal or destroy it.

Deputy then made contact with rear passenger Jeremy Aikens who advised he had multiple needles but nothing illegal. Deputy then asked to search his person and he agreed. Deputy then found a small plastic baggy containing .1 grams of a white crystal like substance (Meth). Driver was given a verbal warning for expired registration. Ms. Marsh and Mr. Aikens were then taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail without incident.

Lt. Ezell responded to the jail to TruNarc test the substances which both tested positive for Fentanyl (Scan #880) and Methamphetamine (Scan #882). All of this did occur in Loudon County, TN.

Deputy Clay Jenkins 939,

was contacted by Lt. Ezell of Brenda Marsh inside of the Loudon County Jail with possession of contraband. Deputy then made contact with Deputy Maria Moore who advised Ms. Marsh had an empty baggy inside of her shower and had half of a yellow oblong pill with the imprint of 39 located inside of her bra.

Deputy then observed the pill and found it to be half of a Xanax.

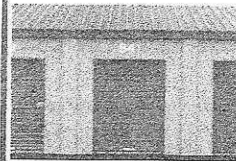

Checkpoint

Lenoir City Police Department is partnering with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office (THSO) to increase impaired-driving enforcement nationwide.

The Lenoir City Police Department will be conducting a sobriety checkpoint on U.S. Hwy. 11/S.R. 2-Broadway in Lenoir City from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Friday, July 23, 2021.

"Sobriety checkpoints are a valuable tool to combat impaired driving. It increases public awareness of impaired driving and allows officers to detect and apprehend impaired drivers that may otherwise not be detected," says Chief Don White.

Increased state and national messaging about the dangers of drunk driving, coupled with increased sobriety checkpoints and high visibility enforcement, aim to dras-

tically reduce the number of drunk-driving crashes, injuries, and fatalities this year.

The consequences of a single DUI conviction for a first-time offender in the state of Tennessee may include costly fines, court costs, legal fees, jail time, mandatory drug and alcohol treatment, and/or the installation of an ignition interlock device in his/her vehicle.

to maintain effective controls and procedures to guard against diversion of controlled substances as required by law. The investigation included on-site inspections of records, and an accountability audit of controlled substance inventories and record-keeping processes at the hospital. Based on the findings of the investigation, the United States alleged that the hospital failed to maintain complete and accurate records of the controlled substances it received, failed to conduct proper inventories of controlled substances on hand, and failed to report to the DEA known thefts of controlled substances. The investigation also revealed significant shortages of various controlled substances received by the hospital. Today's settlement resolves allegations that Dr. Andes and the hospital violated several provisions of the CSA from at least March 2017

through December 2018.

As part of the settlement, Dr. Andes and the hospital also entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with the DEA requiring that they take additional and ongoing measures to comply with the CSA, including implementing stringent inventory and record-keeping requirements, agreeing not to maintain supplies of certain controlled substances at the hospital, and agreeing to cooperate with future audits by the DEA to verify their compliance with the CSA.

This settlement resulted from a coordinated effort between the U.S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of Tennessee, the DEA, the TBI, and the TNDH.

Assistant United States Attorney Joseph C. Rodriguez represented the United States.

The claims settled by this agreement are allegations only, and there has been no determination of liability.

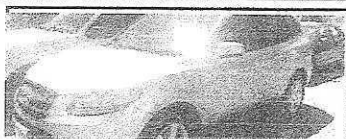

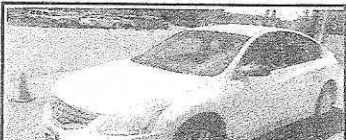

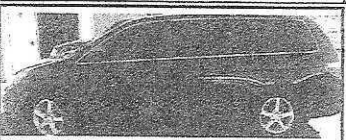

purse, belonging to Brittany, that contained several other items of drug paraphernalia. During investigation Officer ran both Brittany and Jason for driving status and warrants through dispatch. Dispatch advised that Brittany had a full extradition warrant out of GA and she was currently suspended for failure to answer/pay. Brittany and Jason were then placed into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

Former Decherd Mayor Received Improper Health Benefits Mr. Robin Smith Indicted for Theft and Official Misconduct

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Mr. Robin B. Smith, the former mayor of the City of Decherd in Franklin County.

Investigators determined

that Smith received \$27,176 in unauthorized health insurance benefits from the city from January 2016 through July 2019.

In October 2015, Smith told the city administrator and the city bookkeeper that he qualified as a full-time employee and was thus eligible for health benefits. He later admitted to investigators that he needed health insurance, and he knew he was not eligible.

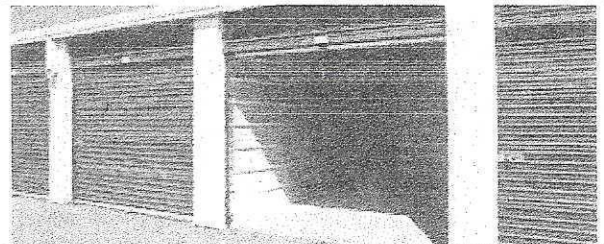
In July 2021, Robin B. Smith was indicted by the Franklin County Grand Jury on one count of theft over \$10,000 and three counts of official misconduct.

"In a situation like this, state law requires the Board of Aldermen to approve medical insurance benefits by a majority vote," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "The Board did not authorize providing medical benefits to elected officials until after these actions took place, and the city administrator failed to ensure that only eligible people received benefits."
