Unicoi County Middle School Teacher Indicted for Stealing Gas

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Travis Griffith, a former Unicoi County Middle School teacher and assistant baseball coach.

Investigators determined that Griffith used a school department fuel card to purchase at least \$10,160

worth of gasoline for his personal vehicle.

As part of his role as an assistant baseball coach, Griffith was issued a fuel card to purchase fuel from local gas stations for a school owned vehicle; however, that vehicle used diesel fuel, not gasoline.

Griffith was able to use the school department's fuel card for more than five years

before he resigned his position on October 9, 2020. During that time, he made at least 169 personal fuel purchases, including purchases in South Carolina and Florida.

In July 2021, the Unicoi County Grand Jury indicted Travis Lee Griffith on one

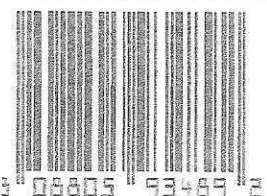

The Loudon County E911 advised a 2017, Gray Nissan Versa, had entered the city via US Hwy 11. The vehicle was reported stolen in Knox Co. LENOIR CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT INCREASES IMPAIRED-DRIVING ENFORCEMENT

Lenoir City Police Department is partnering with the Tennessee Highway Safety Office (THSO) to increase impaired-driving enforcement nationwide.

The Lenoir City Police Department will be conducting a sobriety checkpoint on U.S. Hwy. 11/S.R. 2-Broadway in Lenoir City from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Friday, July 23, 2021.

"Sobriety checkpoints are a valuable tool to combat impaired driving. It increases public awareness of impaired driving and allows officers to detect and apprehend impaired drivers that may otherwise not be detected," says Chief Don White.

Increased state and national messaging about the dangers of drunk driving, coupled with increased sobriety checkpoints and high visibility enforcement, aim to drastically reduce the number of drunk-driving crashes, injuries, and fatalities this year.

The consequences of a single DUI conviction for a first-time offender in the

state of Tennessee may include costly fines, court costs, legal fees, jail time, mandatory drug and alcohol treatment, and/or the installation of an ignition interlock device in his/her vehicle.

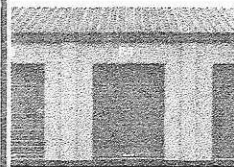

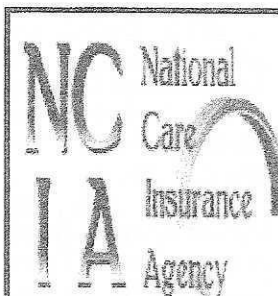

Deputy Green LCSO, responded to West Broadway Baptist Church in reference to an escort. Priscilla White called 911 requesting a police escort to her sister's residence to retrieve property. Dispatch advised Ms. White had called several times and provided limited information and continuously hung up on them and refused to answer the phone on callback. 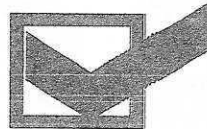

“The use of fuel cards is common for many local governments, but it’s vitally important that controls are put in place to prevent fraud,” said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. “In this case, school officials should have taken extra steps to review monthly fuel invoices, which included information about purchase locations and the type of fuel purchased, before submitting payment. I’m pleased to see that school leaders have corrected this deficiency.”

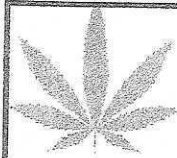
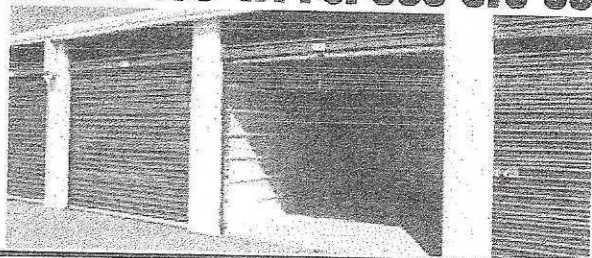
Lensey McKeehan, 44, Brooke Lane Sparta, was charged with Criminal Impersonation.

Former West Greene High School Bookkeeper Indicted for Theft

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Shenna Waddell, the former bookkeeper at West Greene High School in Greene County.

Investigators determined that Waddell stole at least \$7,571 between July 2016 and July 2019 by failing to deposit money that she collected into the high school bank account.

Waddell attempted to conceal her misappropriation by altering transactions in the school's computer accounting records. She edited receipts so they were dated months after the money was collected, delaying the discovery of her scheme.

The investigation began after school officials reported questionable transactions to the Comptroller's Office. The Greene County School System also terminated Waddell's employment on July 25, 2019.

In July 2021, the Greene County Grand Jury indicted Shenna Waddell on one count of theft over \$2,500.

"It's possible more money was taken from the school; however, many records such as receipts were never issued or maintained," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "I encourage school officials to ensure they are implementing strong controls over their financial operations. Money should be deposited within three days of collection, and financial responsibilities should be separated between multiple individuals."
