Deputy Harrison LCSO, along with Deputy Gray and Sgt. Fagiana arrived on scene at Turman Drive to locate Sammy Clabough on felony warrants out of Monroe County.

Deputy Gray located Clabough in the back bedroom of the residence laying on the bed. Deputy made contact with Clabough while Deputy Gray spoke with other individuals inside the residence. Once Loudon County Dispatched confirmed the warrant hit, Deputy began to place Clabough in custody at which point he retrieved

a small baggie of pills containing nine 5mg Oxycodone and a cigarette pack from his person. He then pulled a small baggie out of the cigarette pack, later found to contain approximately 1.0gm of meth, and attempted to hide both.

Deputy secured his hands and placed him in custody. Deputy was able to return back in to the residence and locate the small bag of pills behind the bed where he had tossed them before Deputy placed him in custody.

Deputy gray located the baggie of meth at the base of the bed were the offenders feet were. Narcotics was notified and TruNarc scans will be done on the methamphetamine.





Brandi Stewart, 40, Bank Street Tellico Plains, was charged with False Reports/ Statements.

Deputy Allen LCSO and Deputy Rogers LCSO, observed a sports bike and a white Mazda truck exit a driveway onto Hwy 411. After doing so, the sports bike then rode a 'wheelie' while on the highway. Deputy turned around on the bike, which had green LED lights on either side of the registration, and it accelcrated at a high rate of speed. The previously stated Mazda also accelerated and turned onto Trigonia Rd N. Deputy pursued the truck and observed it drives ing recklessly, appearing that the driver was impaired. After turning on to Trigonia road the truck then left the roadway Trigonia Rd and drove through a cattle field. The driv-er then drove through a barbed wire fence at Trigonia, gaining access to the roadway. The top rung of barbed wire did not break which created a barrier between the assailant and Deputy, that allowed him to escape. While pursuing the vehicle in the cattle field there was a period of time

the vehicle was immobile and facing Deputy direction. Deputies observed a thin white male driver with a Georgia hat and a cut off shirt on. The passenger was also observed to be a thin white male. Upon losing contact with the vehicle, Loudon E911 advised a female at Hwy 411 had called reporting her Mazda truck stolen. After confirming with driver's license and social media pictures, said Deputies positively identified the driver as Chad Dugan, the boyfriend of the vehicle's owner, Brandi Stewart. This information led Deputy to determine Ms. Stewart had created false information to protect Mr. Dugan and her vehicle. The Mazda was later located by Deputy Curtis wrecked off the roadway near Lee Shir-ley road and abandoned. The hat that was observed on Mr. Dugan was found on the dash board and was also observed in Mr. Dugan's social media posts. Deputy wrote warrants on Mr. Dugan for Evading Arrest and Driving on a Revoked License. Deputy also wrote a warrant for Filing a False Report on Ms. Stewart who was unable to be located afterwards. Said did occur in Loudon County TN.







After the trip was cancelled, several parents contacted the school and Cobb to voice concerns that their refund was less than what they had paid for the trip. After receiving questions from par-ents, Cobb made payments to the families directly.

Cobb resigned as Rossview's band director effective June 22, 2020.

In July 2021, the Mont-gomery County Grand Jury indicted Brock Justin Cobb on one count of theft over

\$2,500. "Tennessee school systems must ensure that teachers who collect money are following the rules," said Comptroller Jason Mum-power "These rules include preparing accurate collection records and ensuring money is turned over to the cashier each day for deposit. I'm pleased to see the Clarksville-Montgomery County School System is already taking steps to improve in this area.'

Jeramiah Crider, 44, Turn Lane Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession x2, Mfg/Del/Sale or Poss. Of Meth, Proof of INS, Driving on Suspended License, Driving on Roadway laned for Traffic, and Display of Registation Plate.

Deputy Marshall Lynn LCSO, observed a gray Volkswagen Golf operating with no illuminated registration lamp, in the area of Highway 72 and Roberson Spring Road Additionally, Deputy observed the vehicle cross the white fog line, before a records check of the registration, which returned to a green Buick. 




