



Former Employee Stole from Carter **County Head Start Program**

An investigation by the Tennessee Comptroller's Office has resulted in the indictment of Joyce Parsons, the former administrative assistant for Carter County's Head Start program.

Investigators determined that Parsons used Head Start credit cards to make at least \$8,657 in unauthorized personal

purchases including clothing, groceries, cosmetics, household goods, and personal hygiene products.

Parsons admitted that she made the purchases and told investigators that she signed other employee's names to her receipts to conceal her activities.







"We appreciate that Head Start officials reported this activity to our Office," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "I am also pleased to see that they are taking steps improve management oversight, the purchasing process, and the review and approval of travel and expense claims."
