Kayla Shaw, 33, Wade Road West Loudon

Deputy L. Hawkins LCSO, was dispatched to Tsuhdatsi Way in reference to stolen money and checks. Deputy arrived on the scene and spoke with victim, she believes Kayla Shaw stole \$500 cash from her purse, two checkbooks from her mother's room and then used a check to withdraw \$60 from her mother's account. On Tuesday 8-3-2021 victim hired Kayla Shaw and a male to plant trees in her backyard. On that day Mrs. Shaw brought her two children with her to their residence.

Several times throughout the day, Mrs. Shaw took the children into their homes to use the bathroom. Which is next to victim mother room. Once the trees were planted, victim paid Mrs. Shaw \$50 cash and she left the residence. On 8-5-2021 victim noticed \$500 cash was missing from her purse, along with 2 checkbooks taken from the dresser in her mother's room. Once they noticed these items missing they contacted their bank, Desert Financial, to freeze their account. While doing so they noticed a check was written for \$60 to Kayla Shaw that they did not authorize. Victim advised the male did not

enter her home while he was there working and she believes he had nothing to do with the missing items. A copy of the check was sent to victim Email and has been attached to this report. This did occur in Loudon County. Tennessee.





Although the majority of the sites visited by auditors were not feeding children, auditors did observe a supper service on July 23, 2020 at Alumni Music's Giving Back feeding site. The meal contained a slice of bologna, one pineapple chunk, a package of crackers, ten cheeseballs, and approximately 2-3 ounces of punch and milk (see photo). The reimbursable rate for supper for the 2020 SFSP program was \$4.15 per supper.

Alumni Music submitted meal reimbursement claims to DHS for June and July 2020. DHS initially reimbursed them \$49,325 for the June claim, but subsequently disallowed \$41,784 and requested repayment based on their independent desk review. DHS denied all of the July 2020 meal reimbursement claim, totaling \$141,403.

Furthermore, auditors noted that Alumni Music personnel had connections to former SFSP sponsors that had previously been terminated from the SFSP program for serious deficiencies. Interestingly, aualso documented connections between Open Door and Alumni Music, including overlapping feeding sites in the same strip mall or apartment housing which is not allowed according to program guidance.

"Although these problems are concerning, we recognize that DHS has taken several steps to improve its administration. oversight, and monitoring of the Summer Food Service Program," Comptroller Mumpower. "DHS is taking proactive steps to uncover and remove bad actors from these programs, which are fully supported by taxpayer dollars. I encourage department leaders to continue sioner Clarence H. Carter. strengthening these efforts."
