





Loudon City councilman, Tim Brewster, has resigned his council seat.

Loudon City attorney, Kris Frye, read Brewster's letter of resignation to the full council at Monday night's meeting. The statement read in part, It has been an honor to serve the citizens of Loudon but due to personal illness, he felt he should resign effective immediately. Brewster was not at the meeting

Frye informed council that would need to vote to accept the resignation and declare the seat vacant which they did. Council will have twen-

ty days to fill the vacant position. They will take up the matter at their next workshop on September 13th and hold a special called meeting at the end of the workshop to appoint someone to fill the position. The appointment will be till November 2022.



able payments and provided life insurance for her father totaling at least \$132,907.13.

Furthermore, Grindstaff made questionable payments to her aunt totaling \$24,200. Investigators were unable to locate sufficient documentation and board authorization to support these payments.

Finally, Grindstaff made questionable purchases and withdrawals totaling \$13,897.33. Some of these disbursements included money for a boat repair (see attached photo), pool equipment, veterinary expenses, a karaoke machine, and tanning bed bulbs. Investigators could not determine if these disbursements were exclusively for the benefit of the district.

In July 2021, the Sullivan County Grand Jury indicted Tina L. Grindstaff on one count of theft over \$250,000, one count of theft over \$60,000, and two counts of

theft over \$2,500.

"There are a number of operations that must be strengthened within this utility district," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. include adopting specific personnel policies regarding compensation. maintaining an equipment inventory list, and acquiring a dependable accounting system to ensure accurate financial statements. I'm pleased to note that commissioners are taking steps to address these issues.



Michael Reynolds, 55, Riverview Road Loudon, was charged with Domestic Assault.

Deputy L. Hawkins LCSO. was dispatched to Riverview Road in reference to a domestic. The caller advised her mother and father were arguing and that her father was throwing objects. While headed to the residence, the caller advised her father had left in a White Honda Odyssey and was headed into Lenoir City. Det. Branam observed the vehicle traveling on Broadway Street and advised units, Dep. Gray conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. He made contact with Michael Reynolds, he was confirmed to be involved in the domestic Deputy was dispatched to. Dep. Gray spoke with him about the incident. He advised he was arguing with his wife and daughter over a cat and that he got angry. He stated his wife threw a drink at him so he threw one back at her. Deputy continued on the residence to speak his family. Deputy made contact with the victim and witness. Witness advised her father became extremely angry when she accidentally let cat out, and was angry that he is always blamed for letting

the cat out. They began to argue, she stated she felt scare and wanted to call 911 to get him to stop throwing things and yelling in her face. She then told him she was going to do so, he took the house phone and threw it outside breaking the back off of it. He then got in her face velling at her, she once again felt scared and was in fear of him harming her. Deputy noticed on scene a broken flower pot, cups on the ground and liquid from them on the table, along with the house phone on the ground in several pieces. Both victim and witness were crying and seemed shocked at what had occurred. Deputy spoke with victim, she had been soaked with the liquid from the cup and her shirt was wet. She advised me he threw his drink at her first. and then she threw hers back. No persons were struck by objects being thrown. Victim advised she was not in fear for herself but was in fear for her daughter, also stating Mr. Reynolds was extremely angry and yelling in witness face. Witness gave a written statement. Based on victim/ witness statements, Michael Reynolds was found to be the primary aggressor and was taken into custody by Dep. Gray at the traffic stop location.
