Jerrika Wheeler, 29, Matlock Bend Road Loudon, was charged with Public Intoxication.

Officer Harrison LPD, was dispatched to the area of Ferry Street and Park Street by the 911 Center, in reference to a female knocking on neighbors doors threatening to kill their dogs. Upon making contact, the female was eventually identified as Jerrika Wheeler. Wheeler was extremely irrational, had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from her breath and person. She had difficulty maintaining balance, had slurred speech and blood shot eyes. Prior to contact she had just left an off-duty Loudon County Deputy's home and through the course of their conversation she implied she would

shoot a police officer with an AK. She had been going door to door threatening to shoot people's dogs and was looking for a German Shepard that was a problem on the street. Wheeler was placed into custody and transported to the Loudon County jail for processing. On the way to the jail Wheeler was verbally combative and continued to scream and yell. At the jail, Wheeler continued to scream obscenities', failed to cooperate with Deputies and became increasingly combative. This did occur in the City of Loudon on this date.

rized purchases made by Worrell. Worrell repaid this amount to the city; however, \$1,807.65 remains outstanding.

Comptroller investigators have also questioned an additional \$3,951.61 in public works credit card purchases. These purchases were not adequately documented, and investigators could not conclusively determine who made the purchases, or if they were exclusively for the benefit of the department.

In September 2021, the Weakley County Grand Jury indicted John Randolph Worrell on one count of theft over \$2,500, one count of fraudulent use of a credit card, and one count of official misconduct.

"We frequently see fraudulent activity associated with credit cards," said Comptroller Jason Mumpower. "The City of Martin should have taken more steps to review credit card purchases including establishing a formal approval process, confirming that all items were received, and having someone outside the public works department review

and reconcile credit card statements."

New Dashboard Will Assist Counties with Redistricting

The Tennessee Comptroller's Office has produced a new online dashboard that gives county government officials and citizens a better understanding of how county commission districts must change in response to the 2020 U.S. Census.

The dashboard uses GIS technology to display population information for each of the state's 849 county commission districts. The dashboard includes total population, ideal population, and deviation information for every district in all 95 counties.

Tennessee Comptroller's Office continues to provide information and assistance to county governments as they work to complete the 2021 redistricting process. Redistricting helps ensure legislative bodies are meeting the one person, one vote principle of representative board, government after the completion of a new census.

Counties will work with either the Comptroller's Office, the County Technical Assistance tricting

Service (CTAS), or utilize expertise within their own county government to complete the redistricting process.

Redistricting plans for all 95 counties must be adopted by

January 1, 2022.




Accepting the donation for Our PLACE was Cynthia Rogers spouse of deceased Jim Rogers, a member of Post 256. Our PLACE will be a
