





James Waylon Howell, 39, currently of Knoxville, Tennessee, entered a guilty plea to one count of wire fraud and one count of money laundering in the United States District Court for the Eastern to \$250,000, and a term District of Tennessee at of supervised release of Knoxville.

Sentencing has been the terms of the written set for January 13, plea agreement, Howell

has agreed to pay restitution to the victims of his fraud in the amount of \$69,354.88.

As part of the written plea agreement, Howell waived an indictment by a Federal Grand Jury and agreed to plead guilty to one count of wire fraud, in violation of 18 U.S.C.

Robert Bartsch, 65, Tommotley Drive Loudon, was charged with Stalking, and Vandalism.

The victim came to the Loudon County Sheriff's Office to speak with Investigator about an issue he was having at his boat slip located directly behind the Tanasi Club House at Club House Point in Loudon, TN. Victim spoke with Deputy about his boat slip neighbor who had struck his new Bennington Pontoon Boat with his aluminum fishing boat as well as the neighbor using an aerosol paint stripper in the open air on his boat. Victim spoke with the individual, identified as Robert Bartsch, as well as the Tellico Village POA about the dents and the use of the aerosol stripper used on the boat. Tellico Village POA, after some time, allegedly reached out to Mr. Bartsch in an attempt to get him to trailer the boat for a maintenance job of that type. After this interaction victim has been having numerous issues with items in, on, and around his boat to include; dock lines being put in the water, boat cover being undone, gas caps being opened and left hanging, fuel cell cap being loosened, issues with the steering column, and a beer bottle being put in his boat under the cover. These issues have occurred at various dates and times from July 4th, 2021 through August 28th, 2021. Due to the issue with the beer bottle in the boat, and the gas cap being left hanging from its secure location, victim was forced to have his boat removed from the water and taken to Blue Springs Boat Company to have the tank emptied and to check it for contaminants.

During investigation of this case, Deputy have obtained video footage on one occasion where Mr. Bartsch is seen at his own boat and then going over to victim boat. The date of the video was during one of the events where something was moved or removed from victim boat. Deputy have put in a request to obtain additional footage in regards to the issues that occurred on August 28th, 2021.

Ryan Barr, 22, Washington Pike Philadelphia, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/ Resale Sch. VI x2, Simple Possession x2, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Agent Fritts, Lt Ezell, Investigator Stanley, and Deputy Brewer went to Washington Pike to assist Nicole with DCS. Upon arrival, Ryan Barr met with Law Enforcement and DCS on the front porch. In plain view on the front porch railing was a pipe used for smoking Marijuana and a Marijuana roach. When DCS asked to go inside the residence Barr shut and locked the door. A search warrant was applied for Washington Pike, Philadelphia, TN by Law Enforcement and the search warrant

was granted. Upon searching the residence found in Barr's bedroom on the dresser were (2) two vape pens, (4) four jars of THC wax (53 grams), (2) two digital scales, (1) one bag of Marijuana (14.45 grams), and baggies. Found in Barr's bedroom on the chest of drawers were (2) two THC vape cartridges, and a baggy with (3) three pills with imprint M15 (Oxycodone 15 mg). Ryan Barr was transported to the Loudon County Jail.

According to the plea agreement, beginning on or about April 1, 2020, and continuing through the end of June 2020, Howell applied for four loans totaling \$154,700 through the Small Business Administration's Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) program. Howell submitted false and fraudulent applications under the names of two companies that did not qualify for the Covid-19 relief funds that Howell sought. Howell submitted two fraudulent applications to financial institutions seeking PPP funds and two fraudulent applications to the Small Business Administration seeking EIDL funds. As part of his fraud scheme, Howell submitted false supporting records and made false statements about

the number of individuals the companies employed, the revenue generated, and the wages paid. Howell also made false statements about the corporate entities and the intended use of the loan proceeds.

The plea agreement reflects that Howell submitted an online application to the Small Business Administration in the name of Advanced Strategy Holdings, LLC, seeking \$83,800 in EIDL funds. On the application and in the supporting documents, Howell falsely claimed that Advanced Strategy Holdings employed four individuals, generated \$700,000 in gross revenue, incurred \$0 in cost of goods sold, and paid wages of \$440,000 in the 12 months preceding the Covid-19 pandemic. These claims were all false. In further support of the application, Howell

submitted fabricated Internal Revenue Service documents. After receiving the loan proceeds from the Small Administration, Business Howell transferred the proceeds to his personal bank account, knowing that the loan proceeds were obtained fraudulently.


This case is the result of an investigation conducted by the FBI and the Internal Revenue Service's Criminal Investigation division.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney William A. Roach, Jr.

On May 17, 2021, the Attomey General established the COVID-19 Fraud Enforcement Task Force to marshal the resources of the Department of Justice in partnership with agencies across government to enhance efforts to combat and prevent pandemic-related fraud. The Task Force bolsters efforts to investigate and prosecute the most culpable domestic and international criminal actors

and assists agencies tasked with administering relief programs to prevent fraud by, among other methods, augmenting and incorporating existing coordination mechanisms, identifying resources and techniques to uncover fraudulent actors and their schemes, and sharing and harnessing information and insights gained from prior enforcement efforts. 



Obituaries

Billy Joe Bowman of Greenback, TN formerly of Johnson City, TN passed away Sunday 22 August at the age of 91. A 1948 graduate of Science Hill High School, Billy Joe pitched the Hilltoppers to the 1947 State Championship and was inducted into the Science Hill Hall of Fame in 2007. His on the field successes led to a full scholarship at the University of Tennessee where Bowman collected wins over Princeton and USC in the semi-finals of the 1951 College World series in route to a runner up finish. After graduation in 1952, Bowman signed with the St. Louis Cardinals organization returning to Johnson City to begin his professional career. Billy Joe's baseball career was interrupted by a two-year stint in Korea serving his country as a transportation officer in the United States Army. With his military obligation complete, Bowman returned to baseball where he collected a 56-36 record in minor league baseball reaching AAA with the Rochester Red Wings and Houston Buffs. With his playing days over, Billy Joe joined the Houston Astros in various capacities including pitching coach and assistant manager working in the Astros organization 28 years. In his time with the Astros, Bowman had the pleasure of working with Hall of Fame players such as Nolan Ryan, Craig Biggio, Jeff Bagwell, and Yogi Berra. His time in Houston was capped by being named the 1995 Houston Astros Distinguished Houstonian. Bowman returned to his roots in East Tennessee in 1996 and continued the trucking company he successfully grew for 40 years. He remained lifelong fan of the Tennessee Volunteers and Houston Astros. In his final years he loved nothing more than attending Science Hill and Johnson City Cardinal games and being around the game he loved so much. He was preceded in death by his infant son Charles Frances Bowman, parents John Frank and Dorothy Randolph Bowman, sister Helen Arwood, and brothers Fer-rell and Charlie all of Johnson City, TN. He is survived by his sons Joel Wayne Bowman (Terri) of Houston, TX and Lt Cmdr. John Paul Bowman (Jessica) of Lemoore, CA. Also, he is survived by his grandchildren Jessi-ca, Josh, Jay and Diana along with brother Kenneth, six great-grandchildren and sisters-in-law, Mag and Becky Bowman. The family would like to extend a special thank you to Lou and Maxine Potenza for their vigilant care as Billy Joe's Johnson City neighbors and Toni and Miranda with Amedysis Hospice for the care they provided in his final year. 
