
Desmond McGraw, 42, Whittier Place Indianapolis, was charged with Alleging Possession of Counterfeit Money, Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. I, Simple Possession, and Tampering/Fabricating with Evidence.

Dep D Slemp LCSO, initiated a traffic stop on 175 SB, just past the 68 exit. The traffic stop was conducted on a black Nissan Altima, IN L161941, for inability to read the license tag. After the vehicle stopped, Deputy made contact with Mr. Desmond McGraw who was operating the vehicle. Mr. McGraw stated he could not find his identification and provided Deputy his name, DOB, and SSN, McGraw freely admitted his license was suspended. Upon checking his information with Loudon 911, the suspension of his license was confirmed. McGraw was removed from the vehicle to the front of his patrol car. When asked if there was anything illegal in the vehicle, McGraw freely admitted on body camera there was approximately 3 grams of marijuana in the front console area. McGraw consented to search of his vehicle. After arrival of Dep. Rodriguez, and Deputy Slemp, searched the vehicle and found the marijuana, both loose and packaged. Also, Deputy found what is believed to be seven counterfeit \$100 bills in a first aid kit located in the glove box. While walking on the passenger side of the vehicle, Deputy located a pill bottle on the ground with McGraw's name on it Inside was a brown plastic baggie

with a white powder. McGraw stated on body cam initially it was "tea" and later a "supplement". He then admitted on body cam he threw it out the front passenger window "because he was scared". Lt. Ezell - 937 was called to scene to identify the substance, which was identified as MDPV (cathinone) via TruNarc scan 1014. Due to the totality of circumstances, McGraw was arrested for possession of a Schedule I narcotic. McGraw was then transported to the Loudon County Jail.






