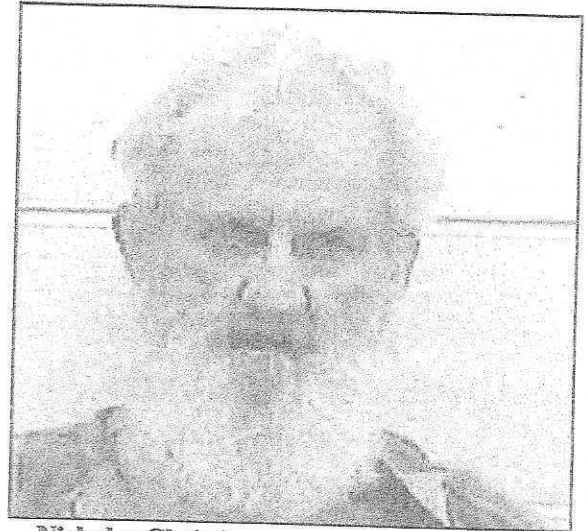

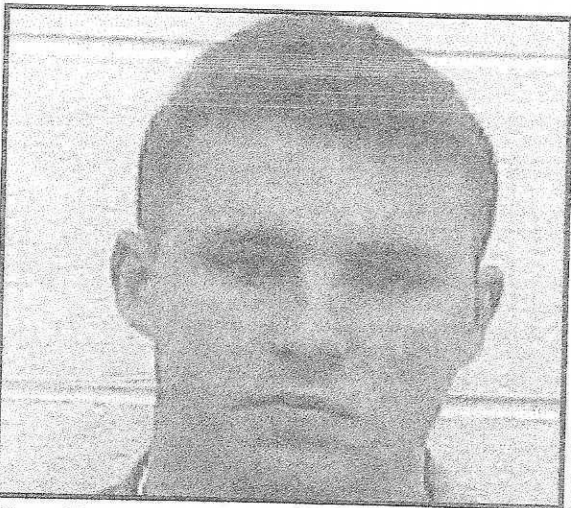

### Federal Jury Convicts Former East Tennessee Clinic Owner Of Unlawful Opioid Distribution

On September 1, 2021, following a three-day trial in the United States District Court at Chattanooga, a jury convicted Mark Daniel Allen, 64, formerly of Manchester, Tennessee, of unlawfully distributing prescription opioids to patients at a clinic he owned in Manchester, Tennessee. Follow-

ing the jury's verdict, Allen was taken into custody. Sentencing is scheduled for January 21, 2022, at 10:00 a.m., before the Honorable Travis R. McDonough. Allen faces up to 20 years in prison for each count of conviction.

According to court documents and evidence presented at tri-

al, Allen was a nurse practitioner who distributed oxycodone not for a legitimate medical purpose outside the course of professional practice and used his clinic for unlawful drug distribution. Specifically, the evidence showed

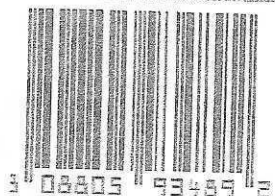
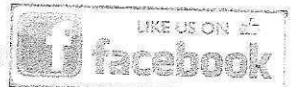

Loudon Co. Deputies were dispatched to a possible person laying in the road on Hwy 444 at Tanasi Golf Course. Once on scene and investigating that call, Deputy located a green Xterra in the parking lot partially in the landscaping and the passenger side door open. Upon further investigation

Deputy found a female passed out in the driver's seat and a male's belongings just outside the passenger door. The vehicle was in drive and the keys were in the ignition but not running.

In plain view were numerous alcoholic beverages, raw marijuana and drug paraphernalia. The driver did not wake up easily and after being asked what was going on she stated "drinks bro". The driver, Ms. Andrea Bishop, was detained to compile the totality of the circumstance.

Deputy later read Ms. Bishop her rights and she did then consent to SFST/ARIDE testing and did not perform satisfactory. 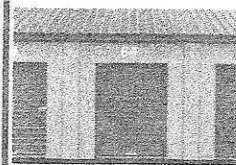

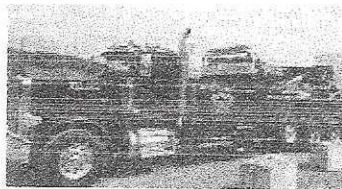

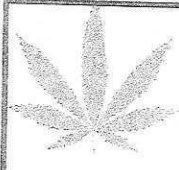
Ryan Barr, 22, Washington Pike Philadelphia, was charged with Man/Sell/Del/Resale Sch. VI, IV, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Maintaining a Dwelling Drugs Sold.

Agent Fritts DTF, along with other Agents of the 9th Judicial Drug Task Force and the Loudon County Sheriff's Office narcotics unit executed a narcotics search warrant at Washington Pike, Philadelphia, TN.

Upon entering the residence agents encountered Ryan Barr, a female and male, and two small children in the living room. A search of the residence yielded the following: In Barr and female room (room F) were (1) one large bag of Marijuana (42 grams), (11) eleven blue pills with the imprint "V2531" (Clonazepam 1mg), digital scales, (48) forty-eight jars of marijuana (168 grams), vacuum wrap, plastic bags,

pipes, packaging material, and US currency. Found in an Infiniti G35 parked in the driveway were: (1) one jar of Marijuana, (1) one bag of Marijuana, (1) one bag of white powder, (17) seventeen boxes of bloom, (3) three boxes of carts, and (26) twenty-six packs of THC edibles. Found in a Chevy Impala in the driveway was a Glock 22 with a laser and (2) two magazines. Ryan Barr was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail. 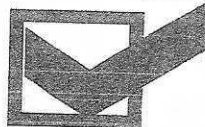

that through his clinic, Volunteer Family Medical, he wrote controlled substance prescriptions for more than 15,000 pills to three women with whom he had sexual relationships, and a male patient who later passed away. Allen was convicted of one count of maintaining a drug-involved premises and six counts of unlawful distribution of a controlled substance outside the scope of professional practice.

Assistant Attorney General Kenneth A. Polite Jr. of the Justice Department's Criminal Division; Acting U.S. Attorney Francis M. Hamilton III of the Eastern District of Tennessee; Special Agent in Charge Joseph Carrico of the FBI's Knoxville Field Office; Special Agent in Charge Derrick Jones of the Department of Health and Human

Services, Office of Inspector General (HHS-OIG); and Director David Rausch of the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) made the announcement.

The FBI, HHS-OIG, TBI, Manchester Police Department, and Coffee County Sheriff's Office investigated the case.

Assistant U.S. Attorney James Brooks of the Eastern District of Tennessee and Trial Attorney Emily Petro of the Criminal Division's Fraud Section represented the United States at trial.
