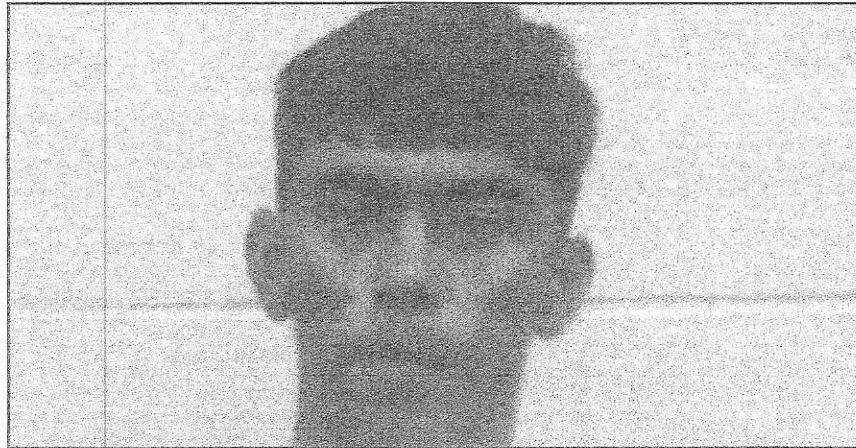

Yanier Tellez Sentenced To 70 Months For Conspiracy, Bank Fraud, And Aggravated Identity Theft

Yanier Tellez, 32, currently of Tampa, Florida, was sentenced to 70 months in federal prison by the Honorable Clifton L. Corker, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Tennessee at Greenville.

Tellez, a citizen of Cuba, previously pleaded guilty to conspiracy to commit bank fraud and aggravated identity theft in viola-

tion of 18 U.S.C. § 371, bank fraud in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1344, and aggravated identity theft in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1028A. Tellez was ordered to pay \$39,899.97 in restitution, and he will be on supervised release for three years following his release from prison.

According to court records, in November 2017, Tellez and a previously sentenced coconspirator, Lazaro

Quintana Martinez, 26, of Tampa, Florida, travelled to East Tennessee from Tampa, Florida to commit identity theft. The two used one or more skimming devices to collect account numbers and personal identifying information from unsuspecting customers. A skimming device was

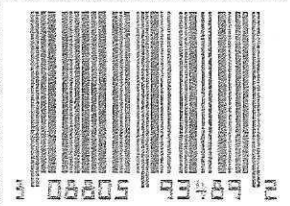

ALTERCATION BETWEEN TWO ROOMMATES TURNS DEADLY, STABBING UNDER INVESTIGATION

PHILADELPHIA, TENN.- An altercation between two men turned deadly early Thursday morning in Southern Loudon County.

Sheriff Jimmy Davis announced that at around 12:06 am Thursday morning, a 911 call came in to the Loudon County 911 Center from a male stating that he had stabbed another male. Deputies and EMS arrived

on scene in the 900 block of Old Lee Hwy and found a male, later identified as 52 year old Daniel Cisneros, deceased from what appeared to be several stab wounds.

20 year old Erick Santano, was detained on scene by deputies. He was transported to the Loudon County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigations Division and interviewed to determine his involvement in the stabbing.

"This is a tragic and senseless outcome to a very avoidable situation and our detectives are working diligently to examine all of the evidence available to us to determine why this happened.", said Sheriff Jimmy

Davis. "All of the evidence and findings will be presented to Attorney General Russell Johnson's Office for their review. This is a very active investigation and no charges have been filed at this time." said Davis.

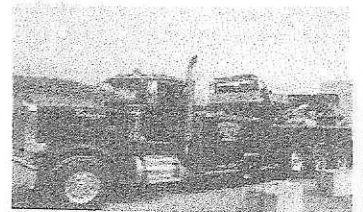
Per protocol in any homicide investigation, the body

of the victim was transported to the Knox County Regional Forensic Center for an autopsy. Investigators are awaiting the results from that procedure to be completed.

"Our thoughts and our prayers are with the families of those involved." said Sheriff Davis.

Tozha Grisson, 26, Get Good Hollow Road Loudon, was charged with Aggravated Assault.

Officer B. Lankford LPD, received a call of a domestic at vale St in the city of Loudon. Upon arrival this officer found two subjects known by this officer as Tozha Grisson and victim. Officer investigation and witness statements determined that Tozha Grisson and victim were involved in a heated verbal argument which lead to Tozha Grisson striking the victim on the left arm with a stick which left visible marks and then Tozha Grisson grabbed a brick and threw it at the back window of victims vehicle causing visible damage which was video taped and presented to officers to view. Tozha Grisson was determined to be the primary aggressor and was placed under arrest for aggra-

installed at a local business and would collect the credit and debit card numbers and other personal identifying information from customers who used the machine when making purchases. Once Tellez and Martinez obtained the account numbers and other information from the skimming device, they would re-encode that information onto magnetic-stripe cards such as prepaid gift cards and use the fraudulent cards to obtain cash, purchase money orders, and purchase gift cards at local ATM machines and local point of sale terminals throughout East Tennessee. Local store surveillance footage captured them committing their crimes, including footage from local Walgreens, CVS, and Kroger stores.

Upon return to Florida, Tellez was stopped for a traffic violation in Lee County, and he had thumb drives containing over 300 account numbers and corresponding customer information. According to court records, the average yield for each compromised account number was over \$1,400 in fraudulent transactions. When stopped, Tellez also had a counterfeit gift card in his wallet that contained the account information of a resident of Greeneville, Tennessee, who banked with Eastman Credit Union. That card

had the handwritten zip code for Greeneville on the back of the card.

Martinez previously pled guilty to the conspiracy and aggravated identity theft and was sentenced to 24 months in prison in the Eastern District of Tennessee. He was also sentenced to 51 months in prison in the Middle District of Florida for additional identity theft offenses.

Eastman Credit Union, a local financial institution that discovered fraudulent transactions, suffered actual losses from the scheme of \$39,899.97.

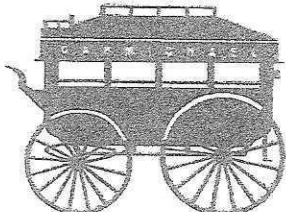
The criminal indictment was the result of an investigation by the United States Secret Service, the Johnson City Police Department, the Kingsport Police Department, and the Lee County, Florida Sheriff's Office. The investigation was led by United States Secret Service Senior Special Agent Thomas R. Whitehead.

Assistant United States Attorney Mac D. Heavener, III represented the United States.

Governor Vote for One (1)		<p>Summary: This amendment would add to article III, section 12 of the Tennessee Constitution a process for the temporary exercise of the powers and duties of the governor by the Speaker of the Senate or the Speaker of the House if there is no Speaker of the Senate in office when the governor is unable to discharge the powers and duties of the office of governor. While a Speaker is temporarily discharging the powers and duties of the governor, the Speaker would not be required to resign as Speaker or to resign as a member of the legislature; but the Speaker would not be able to preside as Speaker or vote as a member of the legislature. A Speaker who is temporarily discharging the powers and duties of the governor would not get the governor's salary but would get the Speaker's salary.
