### Georgia Man Who Supplied Bridgeport Gang Members with Firearms Pleads Guilty

Vanessa Roberts Avery, United States Attorney for the District of Connecticut, today announced that STEPHAN SANDERSON, also known as "Birdy" and "Beans, 24, of Covington, Georgia, pleaded guilty yesterday before U.S. District Judge Victor A. Bolden in Bridgeport to a firearms traffick-

ing offense. According to court documents and statements made in court, the FBI, ATF, DEA, U.S. Marshals Service and Bridgeport Police have been investigating multiple Bridgeport-based gangs whose members are involved in narcotics trafficking, murder and other acts of violence. From at

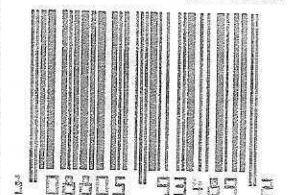

## Carjacking

Christopher McClanahan, 30, Kimbrell Road Lenoir City, was charged with Reckless Endangerment, Carjacking, Theft of Property x2, and Capias x2.

Deputy Talbott LCSO along with FTO Harrison responded to Kimbrell Lane in reference to a disturbance. When Deputy arrived on the scene he made contact with (victim/witness), who advised that Christopher McClanahan (offender) arrived at the residence at 1904 in an unknown vehicle. Mr. McClanahan resides at the above location witness advised that Mr. McClanahan came into the residence and tried to take her grandfather's firearm. Witness/victim stopped Mr. McClanahan from taking the firearm. Mr. McClanahan then grabbed victim/witness purse and dumped the contents out. Mr. McClanahan grabbed the keys to a 2006 Ford F-150 bearing TN tag BGQ6456 (stolen vehicle) that was located on the property. Victim

told Mr. McClanahan not to take the vehicle. Mr. McClanahan stated "f&f&f I'll do what I want". Mr. McClanahan then grabbed his prescribed medication and left the residence in the Ford F-150. Ms. Bunch advised that the vehicle was registered to (victim).

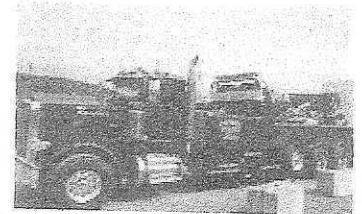
The victim advised that victim 2 was in the Blount County Jail and she was looking after the vehicle until he was released from jail. Mr. McClanahan fled Fort Loudon Hospital and is the primary suspect for a carjacking that occurred in the city limits of Lenoir City earlier in the day. Lenoir City issued an arrest warrant for Mr. McClanahan. On the backside of the residence, Deputy observed a silver Honda Accord bearing TN tag number 795BHDH. A check with dispatch confirmed that the vehicle was stolen out of Lenoir City. Inside the vehicle was a small dog. On the right front, passenger floorboard was a purse, and

lying on the front passenger seat were the vehicle keys. Contact was made with the owner of the Honda Accord (victim 3). Victim 3 advised that she would respond to the location to recover the vehicle. While waiting for the arrival of victim 3, Deputy made contact with victim 2. Deputy asked victim 2 if anyone has permission to drive his vehicle, and he advised no. Victim 3 arrived

on the scene and inspected the vehicle for damage. Victim 3 advised that the right side of the front bumper was damaged. Victim 3 took possession of her vehicle and left the scene. The Honda Accord was removed from NCIC, V774466925. The Ford F-150 was entered into NCIC as stolen V294471682. An arrest warrant was issued for Mr. McClanahan for the stolen F-150.

Officer Law LCPD, was on routine patrol in the area of 1100 when Officer observed a female to almost trip in the Kenjo's Parking lot. Upon further investigation Officer ran TN Tag BBW-7185 through the Criminal Justice Portal, the Criminal Justice Portal showed Samantha Andrade "Driver/Owner" to be revoked. Upon identified the driver as the individual, Officer conducted a traffic stop at Highway 321 "T-Mobile", while con-

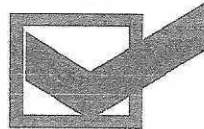

least 2017 until his arrest on November 12, 2020, Sanderson, who formerly resided in Bridgeport, procured at least 25 firearms in Georgia and Alabama and distributed them to individuals he had reason to know would commit felonies with those firearms, including members of the "Greene Homes Boyz" ("GHB/Hotz") and Original North End ("O.N.E.") street gangs in Bridgeport. Some of the firearms he trafficked were capable of firing multiple bullets with the single

pull of the trigger.

Sanderson pleaded guilty to one count of crossing state lines with the intent to engage in the unlicensed dealing of firearms, an offense that carries a maximum term of imprisonment of 10 years. A sentencing is not scheduled.

Sanderson has been detained since his arrest.

This investigation is being conducted by the FBI's Safe Streets and Violent Crimes Task Forces, ATF, DEA, U.S. Marshals Service, Bridgeport Police Department, Connecticut State Police and the

Bridgeport State's Attorney's Office, with the assistance of the U.S. Postal Inspection Service, Connecticut Forensic Science Laboratory and the Stratford and Naugatuck Police Departments. The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorneys Rahul Kale, Jocelyn C. Kaoutzianis, Stephanie T. Levick and Karen L. Peck.

This prosecution is a part of the Justice's Department's Project Safe Neighborhoods (PSN), Project Longevity

and Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) programs.

PSN is the centerpiece of the Department of Justice's violent crime reduction efforts. PSN is an evidence-based program proven to be effective at reducing violent crime. Through PSN, a broad spectrum of stakeholders work together to identify the most pressing violent crime problems

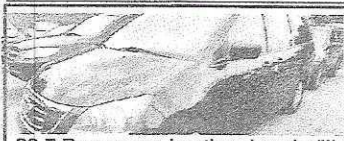

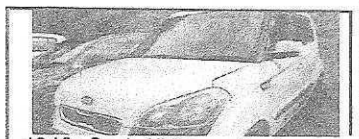

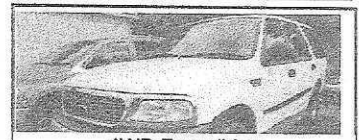

But few people know his outsized impact on Hollywood as one of MGM's most prominent directors. Brown was famous for working successfully with iconic stars such as Greta Garbo, Clark Gable, Joan Crawford, Elizabeth Taylor, and Mickey Rooney. Likewise, James Agee is recognized today as a Pulitzer Prize winning novelist, but in his time, he was better known as a pre-eminent film critic and screenwriter. Knoxville was home to Best Oscar winner, Patricia Neal, and Disney's *Sleeping Beauty*, Mary Costa. The list goes on.

The exhibition also explores the local movie theatre scene - from the urban movie palaces to the suburban cineplexes - and the story of segregated movie houses. These stories and more will be on display through July 3, 2023.
