




Susan Radocks, 54, Huron Street Michigan, was charged with Man/Sell/Poss. Of Controlled Substance.

Officer R. Miller LCPD, was conducting a patrol in the area of Highway 321 near Interstate 75 in Lenoir City, TN. During patrol duties Officer observed a silver in color Ford F-150 traveling north on Highway 321. While observing the pickup traveling on the public roadway Officer noticed that the Alabama registration displayed on the rear bumper showed that the registration expired in September of 2022. Officer then initiated a traffic stop on the pickup in the area of the Interstate 75 overpass in

Lenoir City, TN. Upon traffic stop the driver of the pickup truck exited from the driver's seat and approached me at the back of her truck. The driver was identified to be Susan Radocks, of Flint Michigan. While speaking with SUSAN she stated that she had just come from Alabama where she purchased the pickup truck that she was driving and was heading back to Michigan. SUSAN also stated that she had \$30,000 in US Currency in her possession along with a \$32,000 cashier check in her name. SUSAN stated that she uses the cash to buy and trade vehicles. While speaking with SUSAN, Officer J. Ketner, was granted consent to conduct a search of her purse. Located in SU-

SAN'S purse was 74 suboxone strips, SUSAN stated that the Suboxone strips belong to her daughter, and that she holds the suboxone strips for her daughter. Further into the investigation Officer made contact with the daughter who was the front seat passenger, she stated that her mother had drove down from Michigan and had picked her up from

Florida sometime last week and had taken her back up to Michigan to pick up suboxone strips. Daughter stated that the two of them were now back in route to Florida. Neither SUSAN nor the daughter could provide a prescription for the 74 suboxone strips that were located. SUSAN was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

them, and the Waste Management team was extremely cooperative and offered their equipment, time, and expertise throughout the search.

The Forensic Anthropologists from Georgia Southern University who were on site everyday verifying any potential human finds.

The experts from Team Adam and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children who provided invaluable technical insights.

The agents, officers, and deputies from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, Chatham County Sheriff's Office, and the Georgia Department of Natural Resources who all devoted their time to participate in the landfill search.

Quinton Simon's case and the legal proceedings against his mother are now in the hands of the Chatham County District Attorney's Office. Any further questions should be directed to District Attorney Shalena Cook Jones.

Maryland Man Pleads Guilty to Defrauding Medicaid of More than \$700,000 in Scheme Involving Personal Care Services

Defendant is 12th Individual to Plead Guilty Since August 2018

Joseph Lamjong, 51, of Lanham, Maryland, pleaded guilty today to defrauding the D.C. Medicaid program out of \$733,405.

The announcement was made by U.S. Attorney Matthew M. Graves, Wayne A. Jacobs, Special Agent in Charge of the FBI Washington Field Office's Criminal Division, Maureen R. Dixon, Special Agent in Charge of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Office of Inspector General for the region that includes Washington, D.C., and Daniel W. Lucas, Inspector General for the District

of Columbia.

Tamjong pleaded guilty in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia to health care fraud, which carries a statutory maximum penalty of 10 years in prison. Under federal sentencing guidelines, Tamjong faces a likely recommended sentence of between 27 and 33 months in prison. He has agreed to pay \$733,405 in restitution and \$396,155 in a forfeiture money judgment. The Honorable Christopher R. Cooper, who accepted Tamjong's guilty plea, scheduled sentencing for March 7, 2023.

In court documents, Tamjong admitted that between December 2014 and February 2022, he was employed as a Personal Care Aide and or a Participant-Directed Worker to provide personal care aide services to residents of the District of Columbia who needed assistance performing activities of daily living, such as getting in and out of bed, bathing, dressing, and eating. Tamjong admitted that he submitted false timesheets that claimed he provided these personal care services when in fact he did not.

As part of his scheme, he even caused Medicaid to be billed for approximately 3,400 hours of services that he purportedly provided when he actually was traveling internationally. On 156 separate occasions, he also caused Medicaid to be billed for 24 hours of services that he allegedly provided in one day.

The FBI, the Department of Health and Human Services' Office of Inspector General, the District of Columbia's Office of the Inspector General's Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, and the U.S. Attorney's Office are committed to investigating and prosecuting individuals who defraud the D.C. Medicaid program.

Tamjong is the twelfth former personal care aide since August 2018 to plead guilty to defrauding Medicaid in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia. Six of those aides were sentenced to 13 months in prison; a seventh and eighth were sentenced respectively to 15 months and 10 months.






