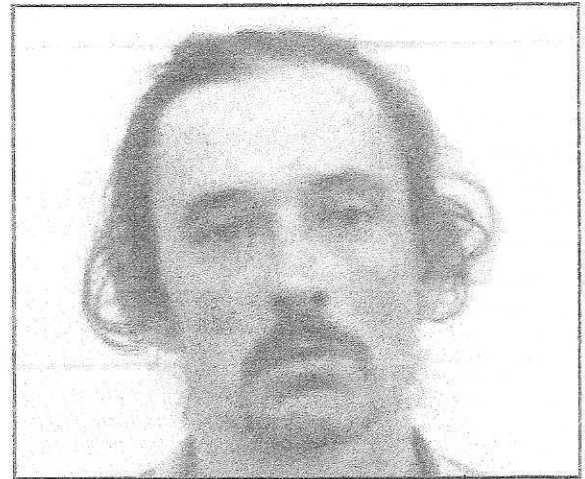

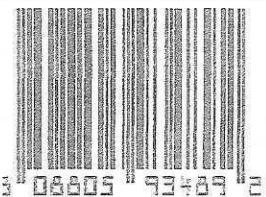

there was enough evidence to allow for a trial by jury. A no bill means there was not enough evidence for a case. A resubmittal is a case that has been presented again to the Grand Jury. A continued on bound over means the case will be presented at a later date. A scheduled to plea by information means the

defendant intends to plead to the charges they have been given.

There are also sealed indictments which are not contained on the report. Those indictments are not made public until the suspect has been taken into custody and charged with the indictment.



Heroin

Tyler Barnes, 38, Meadow Walk Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Resisting arrest, Simple Possession of Heroin and Possession of Meth.

Deputy J. Sartin LCSO, was responded to a call of a male walking on Highway 321 towards Lenoir City that was stepping out into traffic. Cpl. B. Dishner and Deputy arrived on scene and found the male, Mr. Tyler Barnes.

The report stated, While speaking with Mr. Barnes he was not making any sense with that he was saying. He talked about being part of the FBI, NCIS and talked about being part of something that was classified.

At one point Mr. Barnes stated he had "substances" one which was like heroin but was mixed and the oth-

er was "too classified to tell me". Deputy asked Mr. Barnes to show him the substances and he pulled 2 small baggies out of his wallet in one Deputy observed a crystal-like substance Deputy believed to be meth. Deputy then told Mr. Barnes to place his hands behind his back and when we attempted to place handcuffs on him, he began to tense up and pull away. We assisted Mr. Barnes to the ground and were able to safely place him into custody.

Mr. Barnes was charged with Resisting arrest, Simple Possession of Heroin and Possession of Meth. The field weight of the heroin was .4 grams and the meth was .4 grams.

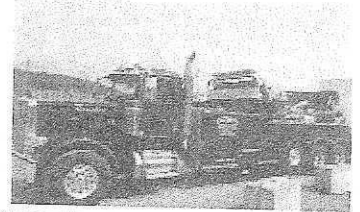

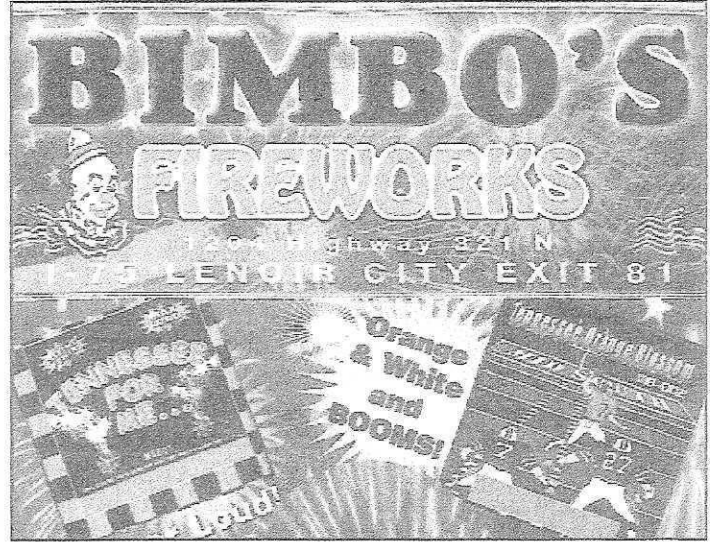
Michael Ward, 33, Virtue Road Lenoir City, was charged with Simple Possession x2, DUI, Violation of Implied Consent, and Poss. Of Drug Para.

Officer Carroll LCPD, was dispatched to Eaton Food Mart on Hwy 70 W for a Welfare Check on a male subject slumped over the wheel of his vehicle. Upon my arrival, Officer did observe the male subject behind the wheel of the vehicle with the keys in the ignition of the vehicle. Upon speaking with the male subject, he was identified as Michael Lee Ward. Mr. Ward had very pinpoint pupils, and was talking, and moving sporadically. Officer did ask Mr. Ward if he would consent to performing Standardized Field Sobriety Testing due to him being in complete control of the vehicle, and him

continually dozing in and out, to which Mr. Ward did give consent. On the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus test, Mr. Ward had a hard time keeping focus, and following my finger. Mr. Ward also had very uncontrollable jerking of the eyes when Nystagmus was at Maximum Deviation. On the Walk and Turn test, Mr. Ward did use his arms to keep balance, stepped off line multiple times, and missed heel to toe numerous times. During the One-leg stand test, Mr. Ward did lose count multiple times, and kept his primary leg bent to help with balance. Officer did ask Officer Bialek to assist in further testing due to Officer Bialek being trained, and certified in ARIDE. After Officer Bialek was done with the ARIDE testing, he did inform Officer that Mr. Ward performed very poorly, and was believed to be under the influence

of some type of narcotics. Mr. Ward was placed into custody for Driving Under the Influence. While doing an inventory search of the vehicle for tow, drug paraphernalia was found (2 cut straws with white residue, grinder). Also found in the vehicle was a prescription bottle of Gabapentin 300mg

prescribed to an female subject. Inside the pill bottle, officers located 8 Gabapentin 10-4, 10 Gabapentin 102, and 8 Pregabalin AN1315 200mg. Mr. Ward was read Implied Consent to which he refused. Mr. Ward was transported to the Loudon County Jail without any further incident.

Reckless

Virgil McKee, 48, County Road Riceville, was charged with DUI, and Driving on Roadways Laned for Traffic.

Loudon County Deputies were dispatched to a reckless driver on I75 NB. Loudon E911 advised they had multiple calls regarding a Ford 150 failing to maintain its lane and drastically changing speeds. Cpl. Wal-len LCSO and Sgt. Rogers made contact with the vehicle in the area of the 76mm. While observing the vehicle, Sgt. noted it was traveling directly in the middle of the two North Bound lanes. Sgt. initiated a traffic stop in the area of the 76mm at which time it took the driver an unusual amount of time to stop. Upon contact with the driver, Mr. Virgil McKee, he had bloodshot watery eyes and Sgt. could smell an

odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person as he was speaking with him from the passenger side of the vehicle. Mr. McKee stated he had been in Powell before stopping at a "local establishment" in Farragut where he consumed two Modelo beers. Mr. McKee further stated that he believed he was traveling South Bound towards his residence in Riceville. Mr. McKee did consent to ARIDE/SFST testing.

Based on the totality of the circumstances Sgt. took Mr. McKee into custody for DUI. Sgt. read the offender the Tennessee Implied Consent Advisement to which he did consent to a blood draw. Sgt. transported the offender to the Fort Loudoun ER, where the blood draw was conducted, and then to the Loudon County Jail. Said did occur in Loudon County, TN.

CDC Studies Support Mpox Vaccine as Safe and Effective

Studies show vaccinated people have substantially less risk for contracting mpox compared with those who are unvaccinated and identified no major safety concerns after nearly 1 million doses administered.

New data released today in CDC's MMWR provide additional evidence to support that vaccination with the JYNNEOS mpox vaccine is safe and reduces the risk for getting mpox. CDC recommends vaccination for people at risk for getting mpox.

The first report looked at vaccine safety data among children and adults and found no major vaccine safety concerns after nearly 1 million JYNNEOS doses were administered. Common adverse health events reported were consistent with studies before the vaccine was licensed, including injection site

redness, swelling, or pain, and dizziness.

The second report found rates of mpox illness in unvaccinated people were 10 times higher compared to those who had received both doses of the JYNNEOS vaccine, and there was no difference between intradermal and subcutaneous routes of administration. These findings provide additional evidence supporting the protective effect of vaccination.

"Mpox cases are decreasing, but so is public concern," said Jonathan Mermin, M.D., M.P.H., mpox response Incident Manager. "With a safe, effective vaccine in our hands, this is our chance to turn the page and finish strong."

CDC encourages everyone who is eligible for mpox vaccination to receive the complete two-dose series for best protection.
