





Carter Bowden, 20, Britts Drive Lenoir | City, was charged with DUI, Financial Responsibility Law, Driver License, Due Care, Driving on Roadway Landed for Traffic, and Underage Consumption.

Deputy Harrison LCSO, was dispatched to the area of Hickory Creek Road for a wreck with injury. Loudon County Dispatch advised a male had called in stating he wrecked his vehicle and it was currently on fire. Once on scene, Deputy observed a silver SUV off the roadway to the right on fire resting head-on with a tree, and a male later identified as, 20-year-old Carter Bowden, standing on the shoulder next to the vehicle. Once Deputy made contact with Bowden, Deputy observed he was very unsteady on his feet, had bloodshot wa-

tery eyes, and had the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his breath. When asked how many drinks he had Bowden stated a couple. Deputy asked Bowden to put himself on a scale of zero to ten, zero being he was sober and ten being highly intoxicated, Bowden stated "six, seven, eight". While Bowden was standing supported by the bumper of my patrol vehicle, he was continuously unable to maintain balance and fell backward without causing injury. Bowden was asked to perform SFSTs to which he refused, and was then placed in custody for driving under the influence. Tennessee Highway Patrol and Loudon County Fire arrived on the scene to extinguish the vehicle fire and process the crash further. Deputy read Bowden Tennessee 7 Implied Consent to which he consented to provide a breath sample

and transported him to the Loudon County Jail where the breath test took place.

The breath test resulted in two sufficient samples and a final result of .204g 210L.
